

- 1. The Battalion, less Transport personnel and Band will move to NEUVE EGLISEame a on 4th June. The camp will be at T 14 c.
- 2. "D" Company will move at 9 a.m. and prepare the Camp. Remainder of the Battalion will move as follows:-

"A" Company 2.5. p.m.

"B" 2.15. p.m.

"C" 2.25. p.m.

Intervals of 100 yards will maxex be maintained between platoons. Route via S 21 b 7.0 and road through S 22 and S 23.

- 3. Transport personnel and the Band will move to Brigade Transport Lines A. 11 d 4.5. at 2.45 p.m.
- 4. 4 cookers 2 water carts, Officers Mess cart and one limber will remain with the Battalion at NEUVE EGLISE. Remainder of 1st Line Transport will move to Brigade Transport Lines.
- 5. Baggage Arrangements.
 All Officers'valises, signalling gear, tents, trench shelters and canteen stores will be dumped at Q.M.s store by 9.a.m.
- 6. Routine.

51st. BATTALION ORDER NO. 28 (a).

- 1. The Second Army has been ordered to capture the MESSINES-WYTCHAETE ridge. The attack will be made on Z day at Zero hour.
- The task allotted to the 13th. Aust. Inf. Bde. is to capture and consolidate the GREEN LINE from 0.28.B.4.2. to 0.34 b.3.5. The 49th Battalion will be on the right and the 52nd Battalion on the left, the frontage being evenly divided. The 50th and 51st Battalions will be in Brigade Reserve. The attack on the GREEN LINE will be made at NEW ZERO plus 20 minutes.
- 3. At ZERO plus 5hours 30 minutes the Battalion will move from its present position and will proceed by Z 1 route which has already been reconnoitred by Company Commanders to NUGENT suport where it will remain until further orders are received. The Company boundaries in the trench have been marked, and the order from the right will be A.B.C.D. Battalion H. Q., and R.A.P will be at FORT OSBORNE. (U.1.c.1.5.).
- Two Lewis Guns and teams per Company will be withdrawn from Companies and will come into Battalion Reserve. They will report at Zero plus 5 hours (prior to the move from HILLSIDE CAMP), and will be attached temporarily to Battalion H.Q.
- 5. In order that there may be no confusion or delay in moving forward to any part of the Brigade front when required, the following steps will be taken to keep in touch with the movements of the attacking Battalions of the Brigade.
 - (a) 6 Guides will go forward with the Headquarters of the 52nd Battalion and will note particularly the position of the 52nd Battalion H.Q., and the general disposition of the Companies and will then return to Battalion H.Q. FORT OSBORNE.
 - (b) 2 Guides will act in a similar manner with the 49th Battalion.
 - (c) The Intelligence Officer and one Officer per Company will go forward to the MESSINES ridge after the arrival of the Battalion in NUGENT support and will make a general reconnaissance of the Brigade area, noting particularly the best approaches to the left sector and will rejoin the Battalion before NEW ZERO. Reports to be forwarded to Battalion H.Q. as soon as possible.
- 6. Communication between Company and Battalion H.Q. will be by Runner In the event of the Battalion becoming involved in the attack and finding itself in the outpost line- Green Flares will be lit to mark the foremost positions when called for by contact aeroplanes.
- Arrangements for the synchronization of watches will be notified Moule later.

Instructions issued in connection with Battalion Order No 23

1. Equipment.

Fighting Order with haversack on back will be worn. Mess tin, two day's compete rations and unexpired portion of third day's ration, two sandbags, box respirator, P.H. helmet, one pair of socks, and waterproof sheet will be carried in the approved regimentalpattern. Wire cutting men will have their cutters attached to them by a piece of string. Each man will carry one extra bandolier of S.A.A. Two detonated Mills Grenades per man will be carried - one in each pocket- except in the case of Runners. Green Flares. 20 per Company . S.O.S. Flares, 6 " " The Signal is one Red flare (1.1/2" Very) picks and Shovels, as issued to Companies. All ranks will we ar a pink arm-band on the right arm above the elbow.

2. Water.

Every precaution must be taken to conserve the water in the water-bottle. Every man will have his water-bottle filled when he starts. Each Company will have 50 extra water-bottles which will be distributed and will also have 18 petrol tims of water which will be carried to WULVERGHEM on a limber and will then be carried forward under Company arrangements. This water will not be touched until NEW ZERO when instructions will be issued.

3. Transport.

Lewis Guns and magazines will be taken to WULVERGHEM by limber and will then by carried forward by hand. These limbers will precede the Companies so that the Lewis Gun teams can join them and go in with their platoons.

Report on operations 6th - 18th June.

1 Prelimmary instructions for the attack on the MESSINES Ridge were received on 30/5/17 and the final orders at 11.00 a.m. on 6th June. Between these dates reconnaissances of our own forward area and the approaches there to, and as far as was possible of the ground over which the attack was to take place were made by all Officers and N.C.O's.

The 51st Battalion was in Brigade Reserve and as a Battalion only played a minor part in the operations.

3. The Battalion moved off from HILLSIDE CAMP at NEUVE EGLISE at 8.40 a.m. on 7th June and moved by Z 1 moute and CALGARY AVENUE to MUGENT SUPPORT,

and was in position there at 11.05 a.m.

At 9.5 p.m. two Companies were ordered to reinferce the 52md Battalion and "B" and "C" Companies were sent. At 10.16 p.m. "D" Company was sent to Reinforce the 49th Battalian, and at 11.35 p.m. "A" Company was also ordered to reinforce the 49th Battelion. At 2.30 a.m. on 8th June, Lieutenant-Colonel C. C. RIDLEY D.S.O. was ordered to take over command of the 52nd Battalion in the place of Lt-Col. POPE who was wounded, and he was proceeded at once to the 52nd Battalion Headquarters. on the night of 8th June in consequent of a readjustment in the line the Companies were redisposed as follows :- "A" and "C" Companies to 40th Battalion, "B" and "D" Companies to 52nd Battalion.

On the night of 9th/10th June the 40th and 52nd Battalions were relieved and the detached Companies rejoined the Battalion and were stationed

in their old positions in NUGERT SUPPORT.

On the night of 11 th/18th June the Battalion relieved the 16th Battalion in reserve trenches at U 2 d. The relief was complete at 12.30 a.m. on lath June.

At 12 noon on 13th June, the Battalion moved back to DE SEULE.

Although the Battalion, as a complete Unit, did not take any part in the fighting yet at one time practically the whole of the Brigade Front was held by the four Companies of the Blat Battalion, and the two Battalion-s that were officially in the line were commanded - the Sand Battn by Lieut-Col. C.C. RIDLEY and the 49th Battn by Major A.H. Rowe - so in order to trace the history of the Battalion the following notes on the operations between 8th and 11th June are added :-

Lieut-Col. RIDLEY assumed compand of the 52nd Battn at 4.10 a.m. on the 8th June. On the way up from Brigade Headquarters it was ascertained from the O.C. 49th Battm that his Battm was not occupying its proper fron tage but had followed the 52nd Battn to the Left, and more-over that he was only in touch with one Company. On arrival at the 5and Battn Headquarters, Lieut.-Col RIDLEY accompanied by Capt. STUBBINGS who had acted as C.O. until his arrival, proceeded to the front line, and it was found that the line ren as fellows :- from 0 88 c 8.8 along trench to dugout at 28 a 9.2 thence through wire via 28 a 7.7 to 22 6 85. 05 and along trench to 0 22 0 2.0. The treops holding this line comprised of Companies of the 49th, 51st and 52nd Battalions, and Lincolns who were more or less organised as Companies but were otherwise mixed. The position is shown on attached sketch.

one platoon of 51st Battm that was at 0 28 a 4.1. was ordered to establish a strong point at 0 28 c 4.8 to guard the right flank which was done. This post commanded the valley between the actual Brigade Right and the Left of the 12th Brigade the gap being also covered by 4 Vickers guns.

At 4.30 p.m. orders were received to withdraw all troops who were outside the Brigade Area and use them to fill in the gap on the right. At 6.00 p.m. orders were issued (copy ennexed) and by means of this minor operation it was intended to join up with the Right Brigade and consolidate a position along the Brigade front proper and also to reorganise the scattered units of the 3 Battalions.

While the move to the position was of deployment was in progress the enemy commenced a very heavy bombardment of the whole area inflicting fairly heavy casualties and causing the troops in the open to scatter, the interfering with the operation which was only carried out as far as "A" and "G" Compenies were concerned. "D" Come any with only so men reached the position of deployment, but as no one came on their left they dug in just in rear. "B" Company were delayed by the shell fire and when they arrived on the jumping off mark they could not gain touch with either flank and returned to their original position before damn. The position on morning of 5th is marked on attached sketch in red. On the naght of 9th/10th all three Battalions were relieved by 7th Brigade (1st Wilts and loth Cheshires) and renreamised.

medical arrangements.

R.A.P. was originally at FORT OSBORNE (U 1 c 3.5) but when all the Compenies were detached a R.A.P. was established at V 97 c 2.8 mear 52nd Battalion Headquarters and the majority of the wounded of the Battalien passed through this Dressing Station.


- 1. The Battalion will move by Motor Bus to STEENTJE are a on 21st. June. Coys and Details will occupy the same billets as before.
- 2. Coys and Details will embus in the Square opposite Battalion H.Q. at 9.0.a.m. An Officer from each Coy, bringing a parade state, will report to the Adjutant at 8.30.a.m., when the buses will be allotted.
- 3. Dress. Full Marching Order with Blanket, W.P. Sheet and Steel Helmet.
- 4. First Line Transport including Cookers will move at 5.45.a.m., under the orders of the Transport Officer. Cookers will be moved to Transport Lines tonight.
- 5. Bargage Arrangements. All Officers baggage, Lewis Guns, Q.M's Stores &c will be ready to load at the Q.M's Store by 7.15. a.m. Q.M's Staff will load and go with lorries as Baggage Guard.
- 6. Breakfast will be cooked in Dixies, which will be carried by Coys. with them in their buses. The parties carrying the Dixies must keep with their Coys., and on no account will they be sent on to load their gear in advance.
