- (1) Returns G.2, G.3, G.4 will be discontinued commencing 29th January 1919.
- (2) A Daily Return D.5, as per attached proforma, will be rendered in lieu of G.3 and G.4 commencing 27th January.
- (3) Existing instructions as to the hours of preparation and forwarding of G.3 and G.4 will apply to D.5.
- (4) The following instructions in regard to D.5 will be carefully read, and strictly followed.
- (5) Column 2, "Camp Staff" is to show all those who are on Camp staff, or attached thereto for regular duties, i.e. those who are not being dealt with under Columns 3, 4, 5, 6 or 7. While Drafts still remain to go to France, it will not include, for example Officers and N.C.O's of permanent Cadre who left Australia since 1915, and who are not being taken on Camp staff. They will be shown in Column 7 as similarly will Cadets. In like manner, Officers and N.C.O's of Permanent Cadre, not being taken on to Camp staff, who left Australia before 1916, will appear in Column 3, 4, 5, or 6 as the case may be.
- (6) Column 3 includes all those who are going to Australia by ordinary troopship. Where personnel has gone on leave, or absent, or sick or are away from Depot and it is not known which of the columns 3 to 7 they should be under, they will be shown in Column 3 or 7 as the case may be. If, however, their proper column is known, they will be kept in that column. For example, a recovered casual is absent - he goes in Column 3, line "A"; a reinforcement who has not yet been to France is in Hospital - he appears in Column 7, line "D"; someone who has applied for discharge in U.K., goes on leave - he appears in column 6, line "E".
- (7) Column 4 is for those for Australia who have applied to go on a Family ship. They go into column 4 till application refused, in which case they are transferred to Column 3; while, if application is approved, they remain in Column 4 until they actually march out on their re-embarkation private home leave, when they are struck off strength (see paragraph 5 of special Demobilization Order No. 65 of 11.1.19 re "family" men).
- (8) Column 5 is for those who, for any reason, have applied for delayed return, and do not come under Column 2. They are dealt with as provided in paragraph 7 in respect of Column 4; if they march out on long leave for any purpose they are struck off strength, and taken on strength again on return. In any such cases of marching out a nominal roll must be kept showing date of marching in again.
- (9) Column 6 is treated similarly to Columns 4 and 5.
- (10) Column 7 explains itself when paragraph 5 hereof is re-read.
- (11) Line "B" - "In Depot, boarded", is for all those who are of Australia under either columns 3 or 4, and who have been medically boarded and names put on boat-roll in course of preparation, including those approved for Family ships. Line "C" is for all those actually in the Depot, who are not shown in Line "B". It is obvious that, for example, no-one can be shown in Column 2, 5, 6 or 7 Line "B" because he is not for Australia for the time, in other words, that all actually in the Depot coming under Columns 2, 5, 6 and 7 must be entered on Line "C".
- (12) As to Line "D", Hospital cases will be kept on strength, as heretofore, for 28 days.

- (13) Line "D" is to be made up of A.I.L., Overstaying Leave, illegal absences, and In Detention either in Depot or elsewhere.
- (14) As it is essential that the returns should come in promptly on the 27th January, and be accurate, a Trial Return for 26th January will be made out on that date, and forwarded to those Headquarters by noon on that date.
- (15) Please observe the two notes which must be filled in as part of the return. Note 2 applies only on days when a draft is marching out for Australia.

TREATMENT OF SYPHILIS.

- (1) Any A.I.F. Officer or soldier who has had syphilis and has had only one course of treatment (7 injections of Salvarsan and 7 injections of Mercury) will be advised to have a second course before embarkation for Australia. This advice will be brought under the notice of all ranks now in or subsequently marching into the Command.
- (2) The continuation course of treatment will be given not less than eight weeks after the termination of the first course.
- (3) All Officers or soldiers now or subsequently undergoing treatment for syphilis who are discharged to Units after having been given only one course of treatment and who agree to take the second course will be retained in their Units until the eight weeks referred to in para 2 have elapsed.
- (4) All who undergo a second course of treatment in accordance with the above will be transferred to the Convalescent Training Depot, Parkhouse, where they will be given a course of treatment consisting of:-
- 6 Intravenous injections of Fovarsenobillon.45 gramme (or its equivalent) at intervals of 7 days.
 - 7 Intravascular injections of Mercuri L Cream at intervals of 7 days alternately with the intravenous injections.
- This course of treatment will be given irrespective of the result of Wassermann tests.
- (5) Accurate information of anti-syphilitic treatment showing dates and dosages will be given on A.F.B.178 for all soldiers treated.
- (6) No Officer or soldier who has agreed to the second course will be embarked for Australia until the treatment above described has been carried out.
- (7) The following certificate will be added to the embarkation Certificates required by Special Demob. Order No. 43 of 24th December 1918 subpara 3.
- "I certify that the anti-syphilitic treatment described in R.O. 2130 of 23.1.19 has been given to all soldiers agreeing to it except the undermentioned soldiers who have refused it".
- (8) All ranks who have had syphilis will be strongly advised to make use of this treatment and will be informed that by so doing they will incur no forfeiture of pay.
- (9) This Order does not apply to reinforcements from Australia if they are required to proceed to France. Such men will not be retained in England for the purpose of receiving the second course of anti-syphilitic treatment; nor will it apply to soldiers whose names have already been submitted for boat-rolls.

1. Fifty additional vacancies for Scholarships in the International Correspondence Schools have been allotted to the personnel in A.I.F. Depots in U.K.
2. Enclosed find copy of Circular Memo G.E.I, pro forma G.E./P.I. and attached papers giving full information.
3. Special attention is called to the following conditions:-
 - (a) Where men can be attached to a Class of Instruction in the subject desired, their names should not be forwarded.
 - (b) Other things being equal, long service at the front is to be given preference.

Scholarships are available only for men remaining in England or proceeding to France. Pending further instructions, applications will however also be received in special cases from men likely to embark shortly for Australia, such applications to be accompanied by a further application for permission to postpone return to Australia on educational grounds.
4. Due publicity should be given to the above conditions, in Education Officers' Offices, Depot Orders etc.
5. All applications must be received in this Office not later than 1st February 1919, for selection and forwarding to LONDON.

CIRCULAR MEMORANDUM G.E./1.A.I.F. EDUCATION SERVICE - CORRESPONDENCE COURSES

1. Arrangements have been made with the International Correspondence Schools whereby a limited number of Correspondence Scholarships are available for members of the A.I.F. whose needs cannot be otherwise met with the unit.
2. The course embraced in these scholarships have been specially prepared for intensive work and are aimed to take 4 to 6 months. A list of subjects is attached (Appendix A) but it is not quite exhaustive as other technical subjects may be available if special application is made.
3. Applications be made in form GE/P1 attached "Applications for Correspondence Course Scholarships" and must come through Education Officer of a unit, or, if there be no Education Officer available with unit through the O.C.
4. The obligations on the scholarships are:-
 - (a) To send 13/- to Director of Education A.I.F. (Correspondence Department) Australian Admin H.Q. Westminster, London S.W.1., as soon as notified of award of Scholarship.
NOTE This is a guarantee of good faith, and may be demanded back on satisfactory completion of course.
 - (b) To pay postage on all papers and documents sent by the Student to the International Correspondence Schools during the course.
5. In the event of a scholarship holder subsequently wishing to transfer to an International Correspondence School Standard Course an arrangement has been made whereby the I.C.S. will allow a discount of 25% on the ordinary terms to students who pay cash.


