

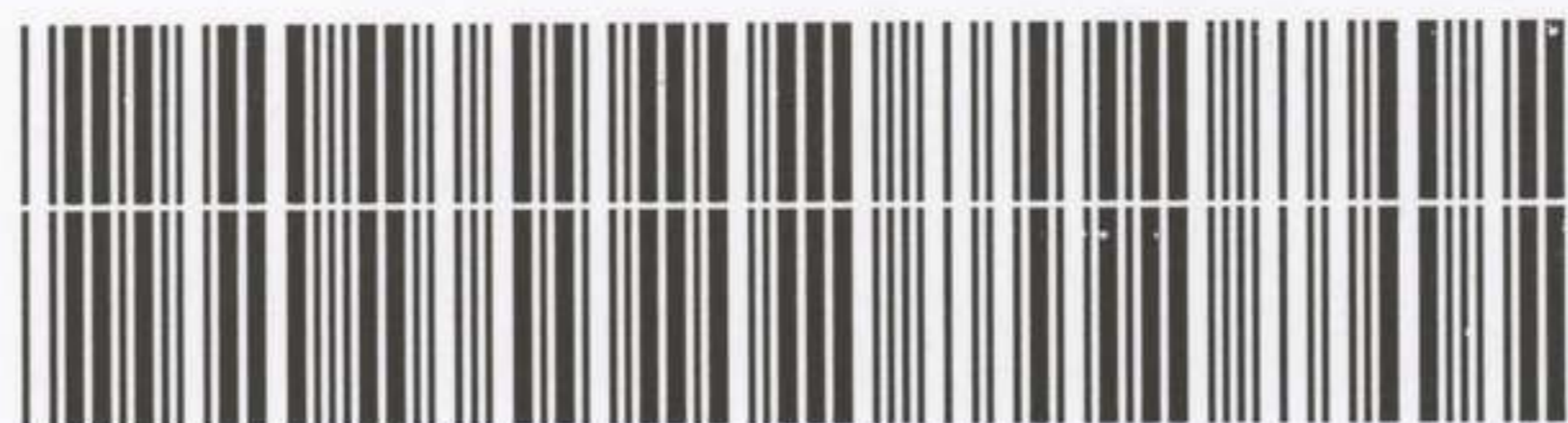

HEALTH OF TROOPS. The following directions for safeguarding the health of troops  
 12. during the Winter will be carried out by all concerned:-  
GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS.

1. All soldiers will be specially warned against allowing themselves to become chilled when cooling after severe exercise. e.g. When the day's training is finished men should put on dry clothing, change wet socks and wear greatcoats.
2. During route marches, the greatcoat should be carried "en banderole" and put on during the halts and after the march is finished.
3. After taking brisk exercise at parades, e.g. Bayonet Fighting, Physical Training, etc., greatcoats should be put on AT ONCE.
4. During parades involving standing about, e.g. Musketry, greatcoats should be worn.
5. The matter is one of common sense, i.e. soldiers undergoing severe exercise should not be overclothed but should put on any additional clothing when the exercise is finished.
6. Hats must be kept well ventilated.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS.

1. Soldiers attending Sick Parades will wait under cover.
2. Group Hospitals have been established at Codford, Parkhouse, Sutton Veny and Hurdcott, so that sick soldiers, even though they may appear to be suffering from a comparatively slight disability, but who are not well enough to be treated as out patients at the sick parades, shall be admitted to Hospital at once. No such soldiers will be retained in the Unit lines either for observation or for treatment.
3. Each Unit Medical Inspection Room will be equipped with two beds. These beds are to be used solely for soldiers who are awaiting transfer to Hospital and S.M.O.'s will be responsible that there is no delay in such transfers.
4. R.M.O.'s will see that lying down cases are warmly wrapped in blankets during transfer to Hospital and that facilities are available for giving warm drinks, e.g. Bovril, etc. to sick men when they are to be transferred any long distance to Hospitals.
5. All men excused duty for the day, will be seen in the afternoon by the R.M.O. and all cases that have a temperature of over 100 degrees for 12 hours will be sent to Hospital.
6. In the case of soldiers who are too ill to attend Sick Parade the Combatant Officer concerned is responsible for reporting the case to the R.M.O., so that the soldier may be seen by him as soon as possible. All soldiers unfit to attend Sick Parades must be seen by the Medical Officer in their Huts.
7. C.O.'s will arrange to provide their men with a supper meal. Suppers will be procurable at a fixed hour, which under ordinary circumstances, should not be earlier than 7.30 p.m. or 8 p.m. (Ref. Circular Memo. No. 167 of 10/10/17.)
