Jan. 31st		<p><u>Health of Troops.</u> The health of the troops has been only fair during the month; the average number of men in hospital per day was about 8% of the ration strength, while 9% of the ration strength was up on the daily sick parade. This high percentage of sickness is directly attributable to the climatic conditions, which affected mostly the fresh reinforcements from Australia. These climatic conditions caused diseases of the respiratory system to a high degree, but the incidence of rheumatism and allied conditions was remarkably low. Meniereal disease was very rare indeed; while the incidence of infectious disease was moderate, no serious outbreak having occurred. A detailed list of admissions to hospital is appended.</p> <p><u>Dental.</u> There has been a lot of dental treatment carried out for troops in training during the month. In order to fulfil the ideal of having all men dentally fit by the time they are fully trained, the work has been very constant, and its quantity has not diminished as compared with previous months.</p> <p>Of the troops who marched in during the month, about 60% were dentally fit and required no further treatment. The remainder, about 40%, required treatment varying in extent, but on the whole the drafts which marched in during January showed a great improvement, from a dental point of view, on previous reinforcements.</p> <p><u>Weather:</u> Having regard to the season, the weather has been good. Only three falls of snow were recorded, viz, on the 1st, 13th and 15th, about four inches being recorded on each occasion, and in no case did the snow lie for more than 24 hours. The mild conditions noted the previous month continued during January. The accommodation provided for training during wet weather was not required, except for brief periods, and altogether the weather has not been such as to hamper the training of the troops.</p> <p><u>Training.</u> A copy of the Weekly Syllabus of Training issued during the month will afford full and detailed information regarding the varied forms of instruction imparted to the troops during the month.</p> <p>A notable feature was the marked improvement shown in Musketry, the average score of the details firing the General Musketry Course during the four weeks ended 19th January being respectively 87.7; 92.8; 97.0; 104.6.</p>	Appendix A.3.





Sutton Veny. 1918 Jan. 31st.			<p><u>Reinforcements from Australia.</u> During the month the 25th Reinforcements of the 8th Battalion (143 Other Ranks) and the 14th Reinforcements of the 8th Machine Gun Company (11 O/Ranks) marched in from Australia. The Medical Officer reports upon these troops as under:-</p> <p>"The standard of reinforcements from Australia is only average. There is a large number of men who should never have been sent overseas. Of the latter class the chief disability is age; men who are only just over 19 and who, under the strain of training, develop dilated hearts; and men aged 45, who develop bronchitis and other diseases climatic in origin."</p> <p><u>Officers:</u> A Nominal Roll of Officers on strength at the close of the month is appended.</p>	Appendix A.5.

FIRING RIFLE GRENADES. 5. The following procedure is to be adopted in future when firing Rifle Grenades :-

1. All Rifles used for firing Rifle Grenades are to be carefully inspected before firing takes place for any signs of wear especially in the barrel.

The most dangerous form of wear is a slight bulge in the bore occurring near the place where the grenade rod makes ends.

It can be recognised in the course of inspection as a dark ring. Reflectors' mirror should be used when inspecting rifles and this dark ring especially looked for in every instance.

2. Any rifles showing signs of wear should be withdrawn from use and replaced as soon as possible.

3. Screw threads of sockets of dummy rifle grenades into which the rods are screwed are to be periodically examined to see that they are good condition. These screw threads become worn after much use and accidents are then likely to occur owing to the rods slipping down the barrel on the cartridge.

4. Dummy Rifle Grenades of which the threads cease to hold the rod tightly are to be condemned automatically and returned to the Army Ordnance Dept. to be brought to produce.
