



AUSTRALIAN CORPS G. NERAL STAFF CIRCULAR NO.1.

Subject :- TRAINING -- COMMUNICATION FERSONNEL.

First ANZAC General Staff Circular No. 54 of 8th March, 1917, is cancelled and the following substituted:-

1.- Attention is drawn to G.H.Q. letter 0.B.1626 of 30th November, 1917, a copy of which is attached.

The training of Communication personnel will in future be carried out in accordance with the terms of this letter.

the arrangements now in force at the A.I.F. Depots in England for the training of artillery and infantry signallers will produce the required numbers of trained reinforcements. To ensure the best results however, it is essential that the officers and n.c.os. sent home from units in the field for the tour of duty as instructors at these depots should be very carefully selected, and only those who are likely to make good instructors should be sent.

signalling officers can be provided from home, and arrangements will be made by divisions for the elementary signal training of artillery and infantry officers by divisional classes to enable the latter to pass the entrance tests for the instructors classes at army and corps signal schools. There should always be a second officer in each unit under training to replace the signal officer when required.

To obtain the best possible standard of signalling in a unit, it is essential that the regimental signalling officer, after being trained at an instructors' course, should fill the position for as long a period as possible, and not be transferred to another appointment if it can be avoided.

3.- As regards para. 4 of the letter :-

The 6 signallers per battalion, specially trained in Power Buzzer - amplifier work, normally to form a brigade pool at the disposal of the brigadier will be in addition to the two squads of three signallers each permanently attached to each brigade signal section under A.I.F. Order 574 of 3-7-17, but they will include the 4 signallers per battalion, earmarked as a reserve for these squads under para. 1(c) G.S. Circular No. 56 of 14th March, 1917.

4.- The sub-allotment of vacancies at army and corps signal schools allotted to divisions and heavy artillery should be made in accordance with the figures given in para. 5 of the G.H.Q. letter.

o.- It is proposed to hold 7 classes of 6 weeks duration a year at the Corps Signal School. This will provide a break of 3 weeks at Xmas, 2 weeks at midsummer and a week after each of the other 5 classes.

8.- With regard to para. 10 of the G.H.Q. letter, in order to ensure continuity and uniformity of training, it is proposed to establish a Corps Wireless Class, where courses of instruction in the following subjects will be held.

(i) Power Buzzer - Amplifier for selected battalion signallers.

(ii) Forward Wireless Sets for brigade section signal personnel and selected battalion signallers.

(iii) Wireless Refresher Courses for wireless operators of corps and divisional wireless sections.

(iv) C.W. Wireless for artillery signallers.

(v) C.W. Wireless for officers and n.c.os (Instructors) H.A. Brigade Signal Sub-section.

The services of officers and n.c.os of divisional signal companies who have been trained at G.H.Q. or Army Wireless School will be utilized to assist the corps wireless officer in this training.

Further details regarding the Corps Vireless School will be published later.

9.- The training of battalion signallers will be carried out as laid down in para. 11 of the G.H.Q. letter.

- 1)1 .- The great importance of communication within Infantry . Brigades and Battalions has again been emphasised in the recent operations, but the results obtained point to the fact that in some oases inadequate attention has been paid by Brigade and Battalion Commanders to the organisation and training of the signalling personnel at their disposal.
 - 2... It is hoped that in friure the Home Authorities will be able to meet the regularements in trained signal personnel for infantry. Signal training in France will therefore be depoted entirely to the training of instructors and to the maintenance and improvement of the standard of signalling throughout units.
 - 3... The principle on which signal training will be conducted in France is to train at army and corps schools, artillery regimental officers, battalion signalling officers and n.c.o's. of batteries and battalions as instructors and assistant instructors. These officers and n.c.o s. will then carry on the training of the signallers in their units, and at brigade and division classes.
 - The number of signallers to be maintained by a battalion and 400 to be employed exclusively on signalling duties will be 1 officer and 53 other ranks distributed as follows:-

- 5 .- To keep up the standard of signalling it is considered that 2 officers and 12 n.c.o's. per battalion, 4 officers per field artillers brigade or H.A. group and 4 n.c.o's. per battery should do a 6 weeks course at an army or corps signal school each year.
- 6,- Students before being sent to one of these courses should be able to pass the following tests:-

(1) To read a classification message:-

(a) on a buzzer at 8 words a minute: (b) on the flag at 6 words a minute: (c) on the lamp at 6 words a minute.

(11) To read a half message on the disc at 4 words a minute.

(111) To show a sound knowledge of map reading.

To be able to ride a bicycle. The percentage of accuracy required in the reading tests above

will be 95 on the aggregate, and not less than 93 per cent in each case,

7.- To enable the numbers indicated in para. 3 to be trained, each Army Signal School should hold 7 classes a year (6 weeks duration) for artillery and infantry, each consisting of 20 officers and 135 other ranks, and each Corps School a similar number of classes each consisting of 15 officers and 65 other ranks.

Provision should also be made for 10 officers and 45 other ranks of the signal service being under instruction at each Army School and 10 other ranks at each Corps School at any one time.

To deal with these numbers it will be necessary to attach 4 assistant instructors to each Army School, and 2 to each Corps School.

8.- The following should be under instruction from each division at Corps and Army Signal Schools at any one time:-

5 officers, artillery and infantry. 27 other ranks. " " " "

Any adjustments between schools rendered necessary in consequence of the varying numbers of divisions in a Corps should be made by Armies.

In the event of an Army having vacancies in the Army and Corps Signal Schools beyond these numbers, G.H.Q. should be informed and will arrange to fill the vacancies from other Armies.

Training in Power Buzzor Amplifier and Forward Wireless Sets will be carried out either at Corps Schools by one of the Corps Wireless Officers or within the divisions by the Divisional Signal Company Officers, who have been trained in Wireless, assisted by assistant instructors who have been through the course at G.H.Q. Wireless School or Army School and are temporarily withdrawn from their units for this purpose.
- 11.- The training of battalion signallers will be continuous and should ordinarily, except during operations, be carried out in divisional classes.

This training programme should be so arranged by divisions that during the winter the whole of the battalion signallers as detailed in para. 4 will go through a 4 weeks refresher course, except as provided above for n.c.os.

12.- A syllabus for Army and Corps Signal Schools will be issued shortly.



SIGNAL INSTRUCTIONS No. 8.

Series No.7.

Consequent upon the withdrawal of the IX Corps and in accordance with A.D. Signals (IX Corps) Memorandum No.ICO 8714/1 dated 24/1/18, the following re-adjustments and additions to the Australian Corps Signal communications will take effect from 10-0am. on 30th. January.

2. TRAMSFERS OF PERSONNEL.

No. 10 Area Detachment (Lt.D.R. JONES, R.E.) will be transferred to 'K' Corps Signal Coy. The personnel of No.12 Area Detachment and 'AU' Cable Section at present working in the forward area of 'C' Division, known as 'No. 12 Area Southern' will be withdrawn under arrangements to be made by Signals IX Corps.

The O.C. No.10 Area Detachment will take over the responsibility and allotment of lines of the buried system established in the sector now held by 'C' Division.

In order to make this possible 'F' Cable Section will on the 29th. inst. begin gradually to reinforce No.10 Area Detachment under orders to be issued by the O.C. 'K' Corps Signal Company.

The Signal billets at EV 37 at present occupied by personnel of IX Corps, will, upon their being vacated, be taken over under arrangements to be made between the O.C. No. 10 Area Detachment and the Officer i/c Area Signal Detachments IX Corps: these billets will then become the headquarters of No. 10 Area Jetachment, in place of their present headquarters at EW.l.

The 4th. Divisional Signal Company will ration No. 10 Area Detachment from 30th. inst. inclusive - rations being drawn by the Detachment from 4th. Division Headquarters. 1 N.C.O. and 11 men from the Australian Corps

Cyclist Battalion will be attached to No. 10 Area Detachment for the maintenance of buried routes, under separate orders issued by 'A' Branch of the Corps

LOCALITY EXCHANGES

The following locality exchanges will be taken over by the Australian Corps: -

- (a) SCHERPENBERG.(b) SIEGE FARM.
- SIEGE FARM.

Detail of personnel, and stores etc., with the above are shown in Appendix 'A'.

- 4. Wireless, Pigeons, and Visual arrangements remain as at present and are not affected by the re-adjustment.
- 5. Position calls will continue to be allotted as arranged under A.D. Signals (IX Corps) memorandum Appendix 'B' ICO/8635 dated 4/1/18,

6. WORK IN HAND.

- A concrete dug-out is being built at DG, (a) (0.4.b.8.1.) under the supervision of the 136th. A.T. Company, R.E. and a daily working party of 1 Officer and 15 other ranks will be required from the 4th. Australian Division from the 30th. January inclusive. This will be detailed by 'A' Branch.
- The 100 pair buried route from 'SY' to 'MS' is (b) being overhauled. The continuation of this work will be carried out by No. 10 Area Detachment.

WORK PROPOSED.

- The Test dug out at 'OPA' (N.11.a.7.9) is (a) unserviceable. It is proposed to discard this dug out bridging through all lines.
- At 'P' dug out (N.11.b.9.2.) there is an important junction of routes. It is proposed to bury all routes within 200 yards radius into this dug out.

OVERHEAD ROUTES. 8.

The following open wire I poled cable routes will be taken over by the Australian Corps.

LCL, HS, LSP, LHN, MLL, LJN, PLC, SGL, BK, (with buried route of 30 pairs JN-JY-KW; and a 9 pair bury JN-Termoy Farm) KPR, KRT, KV, KSG, SGP, P, PBC, P-OPA.

O.C. No. 13 Area Detachment will maintain and allot lines on the two buried routes mentioned above.

The following routes will be taken over and lines allotted by the O.C. Signals Army Centre LOCRE.

CH, CL, CLL, LB, LHP, MCH.

Particulars of circuits working on these routes will be handed over by arrangements to be made between the _Officers i/c Lines concerned.

All accommodation as regards billets and test 9, huts now occupied by personnel of 'E' Corps Signal Company will be taken over on relief by 'K' Corps Signal Company.

> Permanent fixtures, test boards, exchange etc, will be handed over 'in situ on receipts passed between O's C. Signal Companies concerned.
