

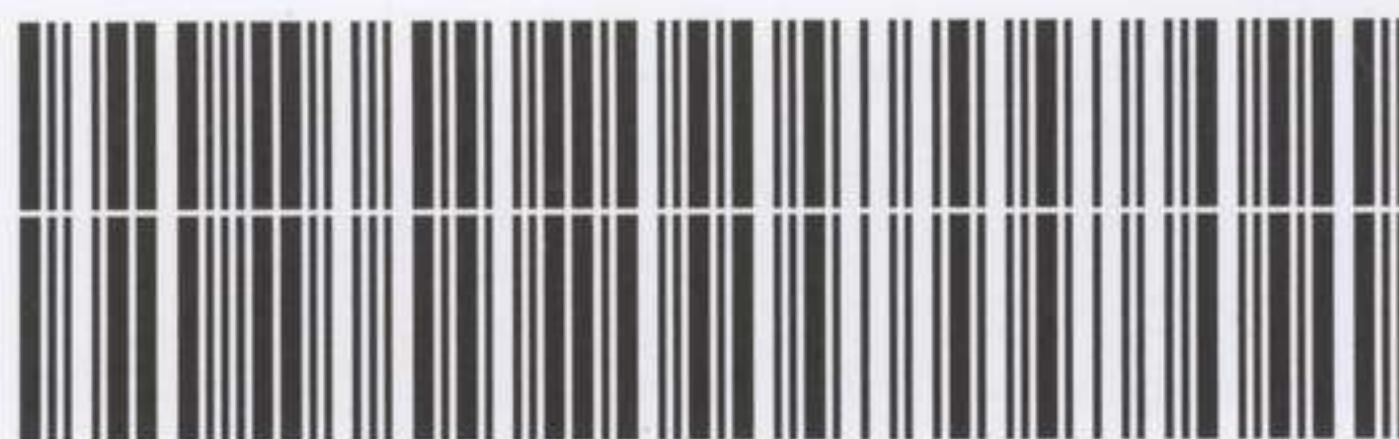

THODAY, M.C., transferred from Corps Heavy Artillery Signal Section to 14th Division.</p> <p>Captain W.G. LUSH, M.C., 2nd Div. Sig. Coy. took over command of Corps Heavy Artillery Signal Section.</p> <p>Lieut-Colonel T.R. Williams, D.S.O., assumed duties of A.D. Signals, Aust. Corps vice Capt.(A/Lieut-Colonel) C.H. WALSH, M.C.</p> <p>During the preceding week the 4th Div. Sig. Coy. buried 2500 yards on Y.S.- L.N. route.</p> <p>Lieut-Colonel T.R. Williams, inspected 4th Div. Sig. Coy. (Contd).		<p>In the afternoon, I inspected No. 1 Cable Section Australian Corps at CARDONNETTE, and found every thing very satisfactory.</p> <p>Later in the day, I went to Corps Reinforcement Depot at PERNOIS to ascertain if there were any reinforcements available and suitable for Corps Heavy Artillery Signal Section, but found that on the previous day all Signal reinforcements had been sent to 5th Aust. Div. Sig. Coy. I then proceeded to the D.A.G., A.I.F. VIGNACOURT to make arrangements for the supply of suitable personnel.</p> <p>At evening conference at Corps Headquarters, I drew attention to the G.O.C., R.A. of the fact that as Gunners make great use of buried cable systems, they should be utilized for the digging of the buries, especially in reference to the crews of reserve or silent guns, and G.O.C., R.A. was quite agreeable to the request.</p> <p>2nd Aust. Div. Sig. Coy. report, that owing to Labour Company not working on Sundays, no cable was buried on F.S.-F.T. route.</p> <p>700 yards were dug by Infantry working party and cable buried on X.Y.-S.S. route. Trench was opened for 800 yards between M.W.- and X.Y. route, but owing to gas bombardment the work had to be left opened at a depth of 5 feet.</p> <p>150 yards were buried on F.S.-F.T. route.</p>	
	10th June.		<p>Monthly Return of Officers from 10/5/18 to 10/6/18 rendered to D.D. Signals, 4th Army (copy attached)</p> <p>I inspected the 3rd Aust. Div. Sig. Coy. Office at GLISY, and found them well installed in a deep dug-out system. I discussed with Major Hamilton O.C. 3rd Aust. Div. Sig. Coy., in the presence of G.S.O.1 of Division the Corps Bury Scheme in their area. I guaranteed them 2 miles of 32 pair cable for insuing week, and the G.S. promised a working party of 400 men nightly.</p> <p>I discussed with B.G.G.S. Corps the training of Australian personnel to man all Pigeon Lofts supplied to this Corps. This, I consider essential as an after war proposition in view of the fact that the Carrier Pigeon Service on this front as proved a most reliable method of communication. H.A. that the Australian personnel of the Corps Heavy Artillery Signal Section were not able to cope with the work and I was asked by the B.G.G.S. to investigate the matter.</p> <p>4th Div. Sig. BERTANGLES.	17th.		<p>The mobile pigeon lofts Nos. 114 and 117 situated in CAMON COPSE Sheet 62D.H.25.d.7.8. were moved today to G.18.d.3.4. because the position in CAMON COPSE was very difficult to find by the pigeons, several having got lost xxx during their training.</p> <p>I attended a conference at C.E. office with C.R.E. of Divisions to discuss the division of labour for buried and field work in each Div. Sector, also the question of horse masters with Divisional Engineers including Signal Companies and it was agreed that each Company should send an Officer, preferably the Captain to an equitation School at ALDERSHOT and this suggestion is being put before higher authority. The question of promotion of Officers was also discussed and nothing of a definite nature was agreed to, although the system of promotion by seniority was unanimously agreed to as being unsatisfactory. In the case of Signal Companies all promotions should be made on the recommendation of A.D. Signals. In cases where two Officers were recommended for the same vacancy preference should be given to the Officer with longest service in France.</p> <p>The following appointment has been made by H.H.Q. BERTANGLES.	20th	(contd).	<p>The dugout at BTE was completed today and test strips installed, and cables are being led in and connected tomorrow, 21st inst.</p> <p>Testing resulted as follows:- 32 pairs buried - 32 pairs O.K.</p> <p>Pilot boxes are installed and route markers max placed in position.</p> <p>Work was commenced on BTE-SF route on morning of 16th inst. and completed as regards actual digging on the morning of the 19th inst., the total distance being 1,320 yards. Test boxes are installed and jointing is completed. Tests resulted as follows:- 32 pairs buried - 32 pairs O.K.</p> <p>By arrangement with C.R.E., 3rd Aust. Div., a dugout is being constructed at N.23d80.30 for a test point(SF)and, pending its completion, all pairs are joined through.</p> <p>Work was commenced on SF-BG route on the morning of 19th inst. and continued today, a distance approximately 1,000 yards being completed. Jointing and testing is proceeding simultaneously with the placing of pilot boxes. It is estimated that the section will be ready for working in from two or three days. In connection with this section, it is intended to bury 64 pairs from a point where the VS-BY section will be crossed and ultimately to split VS-BY bury and lead it into BG route.</p> <p>Work was continued on the MBX-SR route on the night of 14/15th inst. and was completed on night of 16/17th . as far as actual digging is concerned. Jointing and testing was completed on 17th inst. and resulted - 15 pairs buried - 15 pairs O.K. Pilot boxes have been installed and terminal strips placed in each test points, with cables connected thereto.</p> <p>SR-CH route was commenced on night of 17th/18th inst. and continued on succeeding nights, a total of approximately 600 yards being completed tonight 19th/20th. inclusive. An approximate distance of 800 yards remains, and it is considered this should be completed in 5 days.</p> <p>BTE-GM route (average depth - 3 ft.) was continued on the 15th. and completed, as regards actual digging, on the 17th inst. Jointing has been completed and a terminal strip installed at BTE. The cable is being led on to a strip at BTE; another strip is being installed at GM (N.18.d.45.05) and cables connected tomorrow. The route will then be ready for working. Testing resulted as follows:- 7 pairs buried-7 pairs O.K..</p>

BERTANGLES	20th	(ctd)	<p><u>General.</u> The nature of the ground is mostly chalk and flint throughout all sections and digging was necessarily heavy. The weather during the period was fine with one exception and no delay occurred. The work on all sections was carried out during the day time with the exception of the VBXX-SR - CH route, this latter being done during the night-time. A total of 4,500 men were employed during the period. Known casualties on all sections - 5 accidental pick injuries. Route diagram attached.</p>	
	21st	June.	<p>2nd Amendment to Signal Instructions No. 9 Series No. 9 issued. (copies attached)</p> <p>Lieut. Stevens and I inspected Buried System of "B" Division Area, showing him the proposed scheme and dug-out test points which were to be constructed.</p> <p>I also suggested to O.C. 4th Div. Sig. Coy. that where buried routes crossed rivers or streams such as the Ancre, that the cable should be led through a conduit of reinforced concrete pipes 6 inches in diam. I requisitioned from C.E. Stores Officer, for 300 of these pipes to be made available to Divisional Signal Companies. These pipes would act as a safe guard against shell splinters.</p> <p><u>Buried Cable</u> 4th Div. report 500 yards being buried.</p>	App. 17 App. 18
	22nd	June.	<p>Issue of list of Code Words to be taken into use for Wireless, Power Buzzer and Amplifier sets from midnight June 30th, to midnight July 13/14th. (copy attached)</p> <p>I went to D.D. Signals, 4th Army to a conference of A.D. Signals. Many matters were discussed viz:- Sending of time by Wireless from Army Station, this was not agreed to on account of all Corps Directing Stations receiving true time from Eiffel Tower daily.</p> <p>The Liaison between 111 Corps and this Corps on an Army Line was also discussed and was mutually agreed, that the main or forward lateral for this scheme should join up in an M.G. dug-out on the Hallue River in front of Montigny.</p> <p>D.D. 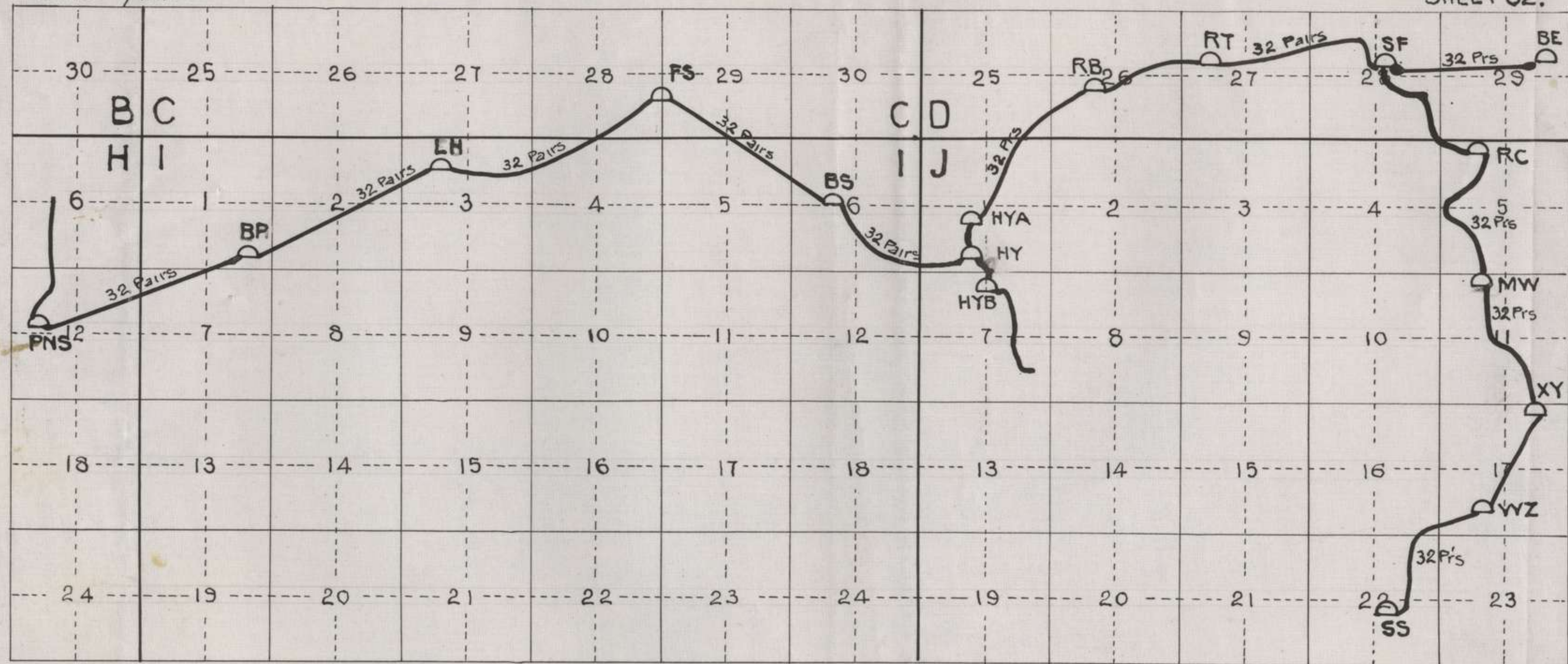

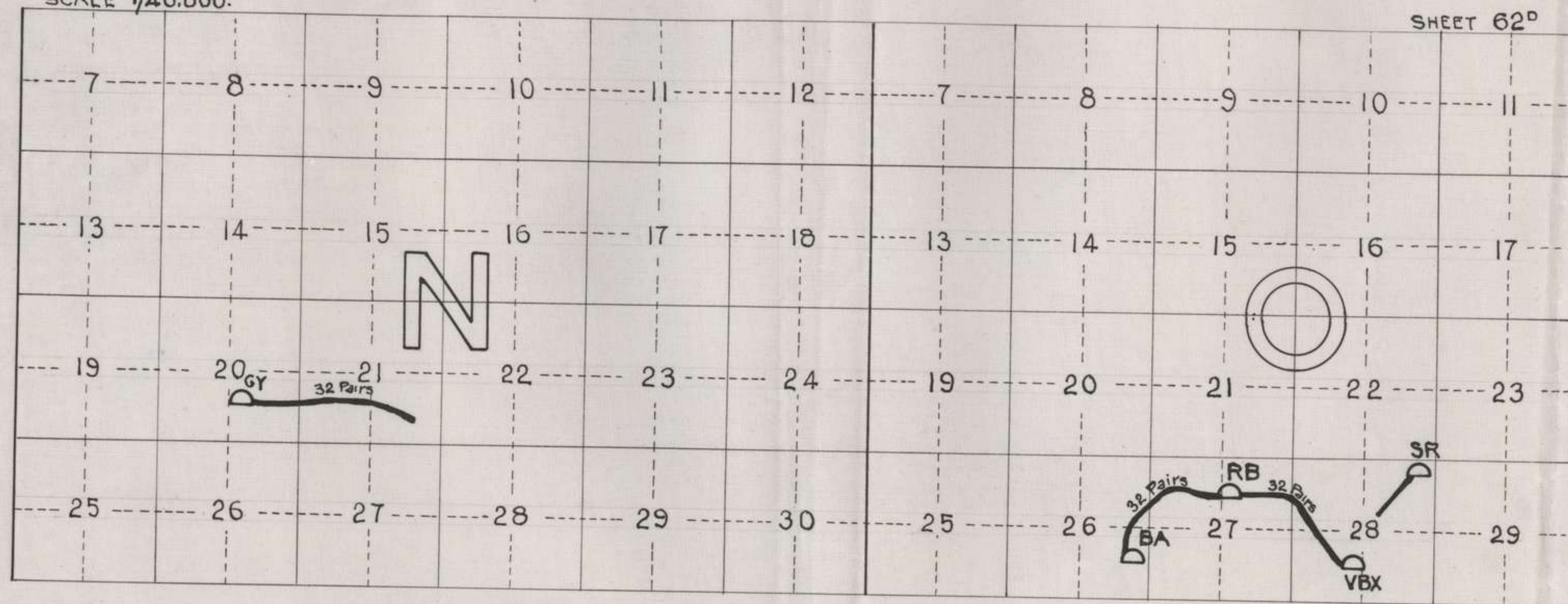

This week, owing to casualties amongst keepers and dogs and reinforcements arriving just too late, Divisions were not supplied with full groups.

2nd Division	were	allotted	-	1	Keeper	and	3	Dogs.

Casualties unfortunately, were soon sustained by the above. Keeper Rea lost dog 106 on 7th inst. and next day, his remaining dog cut its foot and was rendered lame, so Rea and dog were returned to Section Kennel on the 8th inst. Dog 142 failed to return from a run on 8th inst. and ~~has~~ has not since been seen. Its collar and message tin containing message was found next day in BLANGY and returned to Section Kennel by Signal Officer 12th A.I. Brigade on ~~15th inst.~~.

On 13th inst Dog 139 was reported missing - believed to have been sniped. This is most unfortunate, for this dog was one of the most speedy and reliable carriers in the Section Kennel.

Despite the above casualties good work was done by the remaining dogs.

2nd Division report Dogs 140 and 141 proved very reliable carriers, though their average times were only fair.

Several cases have occurred during the week of dogs being retained by Battalions for a period of over 12 hours. I have asked O.i/c Messenger Dog Service 2nd Division to see that this does not occur again. Trouble was also experienced with stray dogs in HEILLY interfering with messenger dogs whilst carrying messages. Keepers have instructions to destroy any dog so causing delay to the Service.

3rd Division report that group allotted them worked satisfactorily and all dogs with one exception (dog 129) proved reliable.

On 7/6/18 dog 112 occupied 2 hours 47 minutes and on 8/6/18 3 hours 13 minutes on a run which on 9/6/18 was completed in 15 minutes. In the former instances the dog returned wet and had evidently been in the river. This looks as if the dog could not find a bridge by which to cross the river, and spent some time endeavouring to find a crossing before finally deciding to swim the river.

4th Division report work of dogs 137, 138, 139 fairly satisfactory. Dog 139 doing 2 runs in excellent time before becoming a casualty.

D.F. INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE DEFENSIVE No. 53.

Buried Cables.

1. CORPS BURIED LINES OFFICER

An Officer will be detailed by the A.D. Signals for duty as Corps Buried Lines Officer.

His duties are as follows:-

- (a). Supervision of allotment of all, buried lines.
- (b). Collation of reports from O.C. Area detachment.
- (c). Establishment of O.P. Exchanges in consultation with Heavy and F.A. Signal Officers.
- (d). Liaison between Divisions, Flank Corps and Corps Troops in allotment of lines.

2. ALLOTMENT OF LINES.

Divisional Signal Companies will allot all lines on buried routes in their area, except seven pairs on all routes which will be held in reserve by A.D. Signals and will not be allotted without reference to him.

3. AREA DETACHMENTS.

These will work under orders from Os.C. Divisional Signal Companies in whose area they are placed and will supply all information required by the Corps Buried Lines Officer.

Their work will consist of:-

- (a). Testing of all routes.
- (b). Patrol and maintenance.
- (c). Man test points (so far as their number will allow).
- (d). Report all serious faults which necessitate Divisional assistance.

4. TEST POINTS.

These will be manned by area detachments assisted by personnel of Divisional Signal Companies in whose area these points exist.

5. GENERAL.

Until such times as the bury scheme is complete, Divisions will ~~make~~ make as much use as possible of lines which they used prior to the scheme, in places where enemy shelling does not greatly affect their circuits. For instance, if normally two pairs are used to a formation, one line on an open route and one on a bury should be used. By so doing congestion on completed routes will be avoided.

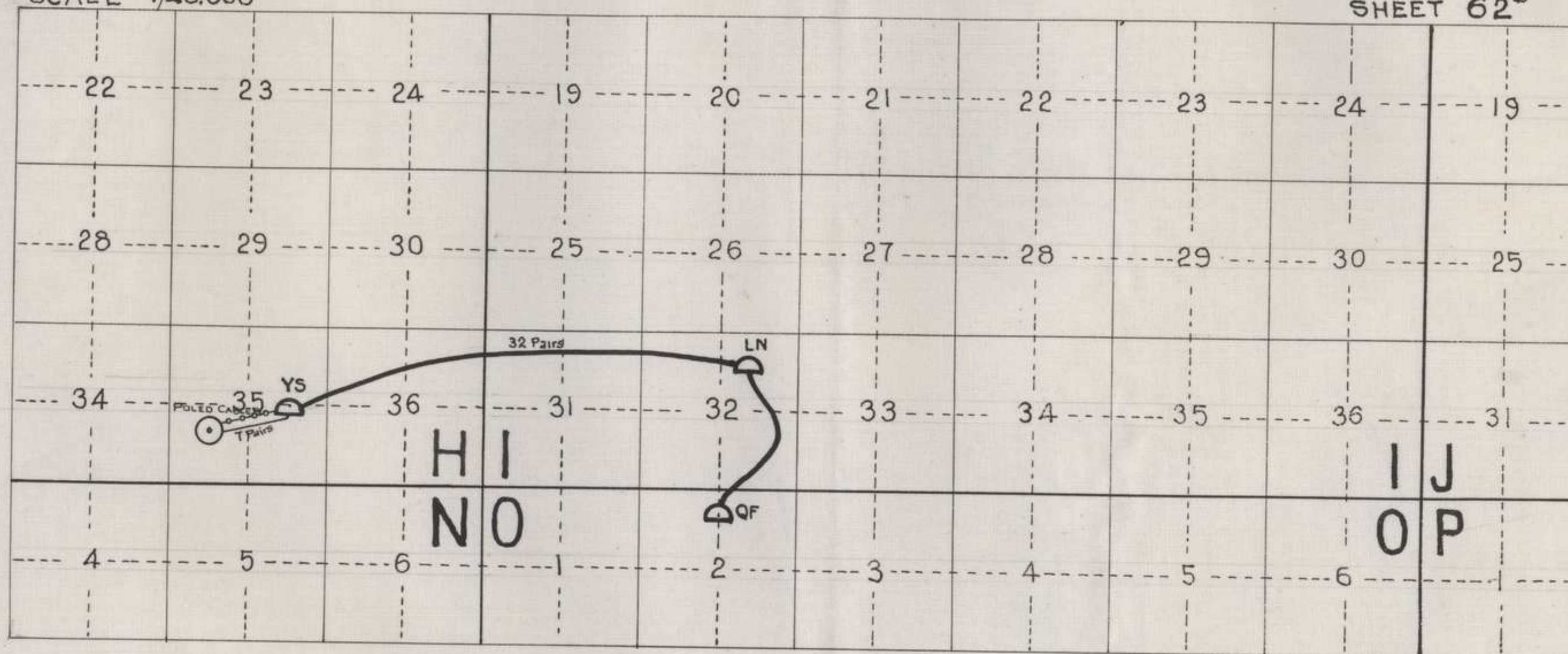

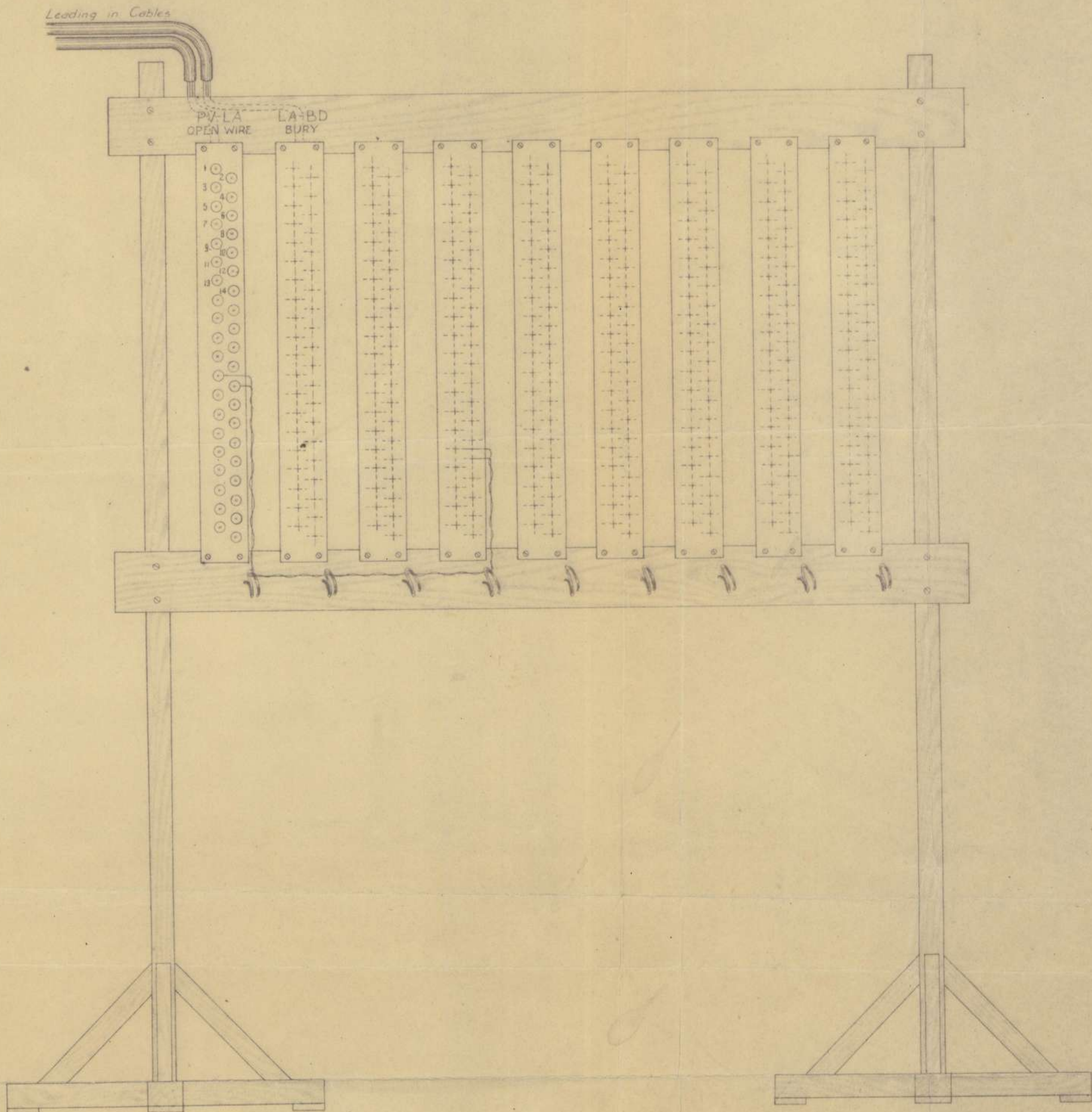

Weekly Report for W/E. 14/6/18 - 21/6/18.

The reports this week are fairly satisfactory but there are still some dogs which are proving unreliable and spoiling the efficiency of the service.

3rd Div. report that 3 dogs were attached to left Infantry Brigade, 3 to right Infantry Brigade and 3 to right Group Artillery, the latter had not previously used messenger dogs and considerable interest was taken in their work.

As a test, with the view of ascertaining whether the times of the slow and unreliable dogs could be improved, all dogs were muzzled on the last two days but with no better results.

The dogs generally showed an inclination to loiter and in several instances they wandered aimlessly until recovered. All precautions were taken to prevent the dogs making friends with strangers and being fed in any other way than that laid down. The cause of their unreliability appears to be lack of training.

Dogs Nos. 124, 126 and 146 were most reliable and appeared keen and fast.

Dog No. 147 was slow and only fairly reliable.

Dogs Nos. 122, 123, 134, 135 and 148 were unsatisfactory.

The 5th Div. ran their dogs from left and right Battalion Headquarters to Brigade Headquarters, of each Brigade in time and the work on the whole was satisfactory.

Dog No. 137 after making 3 fast runs, occupied 70 minutes to cover 4½ kilos on its fourth run.

4th Div. report good work was done by dogs 101, 102 and 103. This is evidence of good work on Cpl. COULLS part in training dogs 101 and 103 which are practically new to him. "Buller" - dog 101 has never performed satisfactorily before, but on this occasion he has proved very fast, making the best times of the group.

Dog No. 131 has proved most unreliable and very slow.

The new dogs Nos. 119, 120, 121 did not at all well. Dog No. 119 on its first run would not leave Coy. H.Q. and had to be fetched and in later runs all three of the above dogs stopped on top of hill near Battalion Headquarters.
