BERTANGLES =====	<u>1st July.</u>		<p>I visited the 4th Div. Sig. Coy. to see what their requirements would be for the forth coming enterprise. It was found very necessary to put a 32 buried Cable from O.P. to Right Brigade Headquarters, but to do this, there was no labour available from the 4th Div. I also discussed with the O.C. Signal Company, the use of Loop Sets and Power Buzzers and the Corps Wireless Officer was instructed to supply the Division with an extra Loop Set. I also visited the Corps Heavy Artillery Signal Section, and found out there extra requirements for the enterprise, I discussed with Captain LUSH, the employment of C.W. working from O.P. to Batteries during the morning of the Battle.</p> <p>At the Corps Conference, the question of the 4th Div. Cable Bury was brought up and the B.G.G.S. agreed to ask the Corps Commander to detail labour for this work from the 3rd Division who were coming out to rest.</p>	
	<u>2nd July.</u>		<p>3rd Aust. Pioneer Battalion was placed at the disposal of the 4th Division for cable burying. I arranged with 5th Tank Brigade for supplying them with pigeons and agreed to let him have 24. The B.G.G.S. requested a direct line from Corps O.P. in J.24.d.3.6., to Corps Headquarters, and work was commenced on this immediately. I pointed out to the B.G.G.S. that the speaking on this line, would be very difficult owing to its long length.</p> <p>Return of Wireless and Earth Induction Sets in Aust. Corps Area issued (Copy Att.)</p>	App. 1
	<u>3rd July.</u>		<p>I visited No. 1 Cable Section who were putting in a bury across the River HALLUE at BUSSY. This work was being specially pushed on with to facilitate the communications of the 4th Division.</p> <p>I visited the Corps Wireless Officer at ALLONVILLE, and he reported to me that everything was O.K. for the following day.</p> <p>The B.G.G.S. was given a line direct to G.S.O. 1. 4th Division, to save time going through Exchanges.</p> <p>4th Division reported that all communications in their area were now complete.</p>

Coy. in the afternoon, and found that all communications during the battle, had given entire satisfaction and at no time were Brigades and Battalions out of communications. Good results were obtained from Loop Sets, and the Corps Wireless Officer reported, that splendid results were obtained from C.W. Sets and expressed the opinion, that when more experience had been obtained from these Sets, they would be most valuable to the Artillery as a means of communication.</p> <p>I also visited the 5th Div. Sig. Coy. and found everything O.K. with communications forward.</p> <p>The B.G.G.S. expressed his satisfaction at the rapidity in which reports came in, also commented on the splendid working of the Corps O.P. line.</p>																															
	5th July.		<p>I visited the 2nd Aust. Div. Sig. Coy. and made arrangements for the supply of a Phone to the C.R.E. right sub-Sector Army Line. I also visited O.C. left sub-sector Army line, to find out his method of communication in event of an alarm and it was decided, that he should send two orderlies permanently permanently to Corps H.A. (Contd).		<p><u>Buried Cable.</u> 2nd Div. - report party of 400 other ranks reported at 1 p.m. on 29/6/18 and 600 yards of cable were buried on BG-BA route finishing at O.26.d.7.9. Ground was very hard. An additional party of 75 other ranks reported at 10.15 p.m. and SR-CH route was completed to CH, 15 pair testing O.K. back to SR.</p> <p>Party of 400 other ranks reported on 30/6/18 and commenced work at 10.30 p.m. and 520 yards of cable buried on CH-DS route.</p> <p>Party of 400 other ranks reported on 2/7/18 and commenced work at 10.30 p.m., and 580 yards of cable buried, thus completing the CH-DS route.</p> <p>On 4/7/18 a party of 600 other ranks utilized on the new lateral from BG. 800 yards of cable were buried, and cables led into AY (O.19.b.85.15.).</p> <p>5th Aust. Div. report- On night of 29th inst. work was continued on buried cable route between test boxes MT and XY. Party of 160 workers reported, but on account of heavy shelling were unable for some time to continue the work, 180 yards only were completed.</p> <p>On night of 30th only 140 men reported and 195 yards buried. The following night 135 men reported but some of these were used for carrying cable up on to the work. Digging was very hard and a distance of 150 yards completed. 160 men reported on the 2nd inst. and 220 yards completed. On night of 4th inst. 140 men reported and 200 yards completed. On account of the hard chalky nature of the ground and being difficult to miss the crops, route is fairly conspicuous, but from Cross Roads at J.10.c., the road and well used track is being followed to Battalion Headquarters at XY. Digging is also becoming better. Route still consists of 32 pair cable composed of 14 quads and 4 twin.</p> <p>On Monday 1st inst. work was commenced on buried route between "G" Test Box at B.27.d.65.85. to Dugouts intended for Divisional Headquarters at B.21.c.9.9. This covered a distance of three quarters of a mile. Cable report (contd) Workers were provided by 8th Infantry Brigade and on 1st inst. 327 men reported and a distance of 500 yards completed to a depth of 6 feet. The same party of 327 men reported on 2nd inst. and a further 500 yards completed. Digging was mostly in Clay and good. 325 men reported on 3rd inst. and a remaining distance of 340 yards completed. 60 men from this party were detailed to go over and completed portion of the banking up. The last 100 yards was along main road and was very hard digging. Strip has been fitted in "G" Box but completion of dugout is awaiting for fitting of strip at that end.</p> <p>In continuation of the lateral bury route from FT to BT, 80 men reported on 29th inst. and 145 yards completed. On the following 5 days the party averaged only 80 men and cable has been buried for a distance of 800 yards. Work is through hard chalky country, route is composed of 14 quad and 4 twin armoured cables.</p> <p>Work on test box BT has not yet commenced and its actual position is not yet recognised but another 3 days should see this section completed.</p> <p>Test Box PNS has been completed and strips fitted but FT is not yet completed.</p> <p>Test strip has been fitted at FTA.</p>	
	6th July.		<p>I made arrangements with Army to take over VIGNACOURT exchange on 7th inst. as "B" Echelon, Aust. Corps were moving to BERTANGLES.</p> <p>New Field Cipher Code words issued for period 14/15th to 30/31st July (Copy attached)</p> <p>Buried Cable. 5th Div. Report - Work was resumed today on buried cable route from FT laterally to BT, only a small party reported and 100 yards completed. Night 5/6th party of 160 men reported and completed 210 yards on cable route from MT test box to XY test box.</p> <p>2nd Div. Ground was very hard and difficult.</p> <p>5th Div report - On night 6/7 party of 114 men reported and completed 180 yards of the route MT test Box to XY Test. No party reported for work on FT - BT route.</p>	
	8th July.		<p>O.C. No. 5 Balloon Wing visited me, to discuss communications forward, also No. 5 Field Survey Section. In the case of Sound Rangers owing to our recent advance, new basis were necessary and this meant a new route. It was decided a four pair Hop Pole Route from their Headquarters at BUSSY, to a point just east of BONNAY and from here radiating lines will be laid to the various Sections. This work will be commenced as soon as material becomes available. The upkeep of this Hop Pole Route should be done by the Corps Heavy Artillery Signal Section, but all branches, by the Field Survey Section.</p> <p>I visited Corps Signal School at RUE, to see if all arrangements were complete and it was found only very few items only were required, otherwise everything else was O.K.</p> <p><u>Buried Cable.</u> 2nd Div. report - A party of 430 other ranks reported at 9.30 p.m. and work was continued on the VBX route. 470 yards of cable were buried, finishing at O.34.b.8.8. Ground was very hard and difficult. Weather Starry Stormy.</p> <p>5th Div. report - Dugout BT was commenced on 8th inst. FT dugout is almost complete and strips for PNS and FTA ends have been fitted.</p> <p>On 7/8 party of 160 men reported and 220 yards completed on route from MT test box to XY test.</p>	
	9th July.		<p>I discussed with O.C. 5th Aust. Div. Sig. Coy., the forward route from MW in J.11.a.5.9. forward due east for a distance of 1500 yards. He advocated 16 pairs, but I ordered him that no route should contain less than 32 pairs.</p> <p>Major WALEY and Major RICHARDSON visited this Office, and we discussed of the merits and the de-merits of the Messenger Dog Service, myself, contending that it was not^a reliable method of communication in contrats with the pigeons. It was found in the case of the dogs, that some were reliable and others unreliable, this naturally broke the faith of the Bn. Commanders in this method of communication.</p>

Weekly report for week ending 27/6/18.

Dog in the 3rd Div. Sector did good all round work and gave every satisfaction.

Dogs 107, 108 and 109 were allotted to Left Brigade and dogs 140 and 141 to the Right Brigade. Slow times were made by dogs in Left Brigade Sector on the 26th and this is believed to be due to them having been fed at some intermediate cookhouse.

On the same occasion dogs 107 and 108 returned together after 50 minutes delay on a 30 minute run.

Dogs 108 and 140 proved fast and reliable and the remainder although slower could be depended on.

On the 22nd inst. dog 140 went out with a raiding party and successfully delivered a message in 30 minutes covering a distance of 4,800 yards in that time. Other times made by this dog from Battalions were - 4,000 yards in 20 minutes, and 4,400 yards in 25 minutes on two occasions.

In the 4th Div. Sector, Pte. SWANKIE was wounded on the 21st inst. thus putting out of action his three dogs Nos. 128, 129 and 130. On the 22nd inst. dog 143 failed to return and has since been missing. Dog 144 proved reliable but slow.

Dogs allotted to 5th Div. Sector proved fairly reliable but did not as a whole, give the same satisfaction as the dogs of the previous week. Dogs 137 and 138 were fast and reliable and did some good times over a 4½ kilo run. Dog 111 was badly gassed in all feet and as since been under treatment in the Kennel. This is the third occasion this dog has been gassed and as it will be some time before it is fit again I would like it replaced.

The present system of permanently attaching Regimental Signallers to Divisional Signal Companies does not seem a satisfactory method of organisation. It is proposed the personnel of the Divisional Signal Companies to include these men on their strength. By so doing, these men are eligible for promotion in the Wireless Section of the Div. Sig. Companies, whereas at present, once a man is attached to a Brigade Section, all promotion in the Brigade Sig. Section is denied, unless he is transferred back to the Battalion, thereby unnecessarily changing the personnel.

The proposed increase of Wireless Personnel is as follows:-

Div. Sig. Coy.

H.Q. Section - 9 O.Rs. including 1.2/Cpl. 1. L/Cpl.

Nos. 2, 3 and 4 Sections - each 9 O.Rs. including 1.2/Cpl. 1. L/Cpl.

Reinforcements.

All reinforcements for Wireless Sections are drawn from Battalions. This causes a great deal of discontent and depletes the ranks of the Regimental Signallers of the best men on account of the standard required to work the Wireless Sets.

As ~~approx~~ proposal, could not men be selected in U.K. by the competent Signal Officers as we have in the Depot there. The men should be chosen from those who arrive fresh from Australia and whose civil occupation is a credential, that they would make suitable Wireless Operators.

The training in the Depot in England, should consist of ordinary operating over a period of 4 weeks, then the men should be drafted to France and attached to the Corps Wireless Section for training, for a further period of 6 weeks. After this, they should be fit to take their places in the ranks of a Wireless Sections.

Number of Reinforcements required.

Taking an average extending over a year, the requirements are 25 men every six weeks, this includes all wireless in the Corps (Spark Sets and P.B.) with the exception of C.W. Sets (Artillery.)

The 5th Div. Report. The two group of dogs on duty this week proved very satisfactory. The owners (Pars. ALLCOCK & MONAGHAN) deserve notice for their attention to duty and their keenness in their work.

SUBJECT- WIRELESS STATION CALLS

1. In order to effect a daily change of calls of Wireless Stations, the following system will be brought into use at midnight 27/28th July.
2. Lists of Formations :- Corps Headquarters, Divisions of this Corps. 111 Corps Headquarters and 58th Division are issued in a schedule attached. Against each formation are shown sets of 3 three letter calls. These calls are known as "Basic Calls". The number of groups of Basic Calls allotted to each Division corresponds with the number of Wireless Stations in use or contemplated in each Divisional Area. As far as possible a set of Basic Calls should be allotted by the Division to each formation such as Infantry Brigades to whom a Wireless Set is normally allotted.
3. In conjunction with the "Basic Calls" the attached "Key Tables" will be used. The "Key Tables" consist of two series, each series consisting of three tables. Each table provides calls for 3 days; so each series will provide calls for 9 days.
4. The manner in which the tables are used is as follows:- Suppose the Wireless Station attached to the Headquarters of the 3rd Aust. Division concerned, the three Basic Call signs allotted to this station, as shown by the Basic Call List are (1) U.W.V., (2) Q.R.Z., (3) O.P.Y. Assuming that the 28th July 1918 is the date for which it is required to find the call of the station in question, it will be observed that this date is included at the head of the first table of the Key Tables, Series D. Against this date are set the words "Basic No.2". The section of the key table immediately underneath is consulted, together with the basic call sign No. 2 shown on the list, i.e., Q.R.Z. It will be seen that each table of the "Key Table" consists of 3 columns, and in each column is a normal alphabet in small letters set against an arbitrary alphabet in capital letters. The first letter of the basic call sign No.2. i.e., Q. is looked for in the normal alphabet (small letters) in column 1 and the equivalent in capital letters shown against it, i.e., L. is written down as the first letter of the sign on the date in question. The second letter, i.e., R. is found in the normal alphabet of column 2, and its equivalent, i.e., H. is set down as the second letter of the call sign.

Para. 4 (Contd.)

The third letter of the basic call sign, i.e., Z. is taken in the normal alphabet of column 3, and its equivalent, i.e., L. is written down as the third letter of the call sign. Similarly, on another day, the date is looked for in the key tables. The basic call sign and the table is in use on that day are noted, and the call sign of the day is obtained as described as above, e.g., on the 2nd August when the basic call sign is No. 3 the call of the Wireless Station of the Headquarters of the 3rd Aust. Division is found at once to be P.G.I.

5. Lists of "Basic Call" signs will change about once a month by means of fresh issue of the list.

6. Divisions are supplied with Key Tables for 9 days ahead, i.e., 1 series, but should only issue sufficient for 3 days ahead to forward stations, i.e., those allotted to Brigades.

7. In the event of a Key Table being compromised, no special action will be taken, reliance being placed on the automatic change due in 9 days time. The capture of a whole list of "Basic Calls" is so improbable, that it will only be catered for by keeping at G.H.Q., a complete list for immediate issue, if the list becomes compromised early in the month.

8. Present issues of "Key Tables" and "Basic Calls" cater for spark sets, i.e., Trench and Wilson Sets only. If the system proves successful, it will be introduced for C.W. Sets at a later date. Till then, the allotting of calls both for C.W. sets, Power Buzzer-Amplifiers and Loop sets will be carried out at present. The fact that a Power Buzzer-Amplifier or C.W. set may have the same call as a Trench or Wilson set should not lead to confusion.

9. The object of the system, is not only to prevent the enemy from obtaining information from our Wireless System, but also to avoid the necessity of issuing from Army large blocks of calls. At the same time it allows a call to be identified at any time with its formation, and enables a call to be allotted to a station at any time without the necessity of circulation.

10. All Key Tables, lists of Basic Calls, and extracts therefrom should be destroyed if there is any danger of capture.

11. Officers Commanding Divisional Signal Companies will advise this office by noon on 26th inst. the allotment of groups of basic call signs to Brigades, and lower formations under their control.
