





As a result of recent operations the German line along the line STEENFORDE - HAZEBROUCK - SERCUS - AIRE has been pierced and our troops are now occupying this line with outposts on the line HAZEBROUCK - LA BELLE HOTESSE - BOESEGHEM.

The enemy is reported by aerial reconnaisance as having fallen back but his patrols were observed late last night (2/3 August) in the vicinity of STEENBECQUE and MORBECQUE. It is believed that the enemy contemplates a considerable retirement.

An immediate and vigorous pursuit has been ordered. No large German reserves are at hand.







The enemy rear parties were encountered several times during the day and retired offering but little resistance until about 3.0 p.m. when our advanced troops were rather roughly handled on approaching the outskirst of HAZEBROUCK - MORBECQUE and STEENBECQUE and are to be withdrawn for reorganization.

The I5th Australian Infantry Brigade are ordered to furnish the outposts for the force on the General Line of the ROMAN ROAD.

The I5th Field Coy. A.E. are attached.

Outpost Headquarters are fixed at SERCUS and outposts are ordered to be in position by 6.0 p.m.






