

MAGHAMA.	March.	March resumed 0500 to MOASCAR (8 miles).	
MOASCAR.	30th.	March resumed 0615 to SERAPEUM where Battalion occupied new Camp.	
		NOTES ON MARCH Weather - Hot. Water - Scarce. Surface of Ground - Very deep sand.  Above was largely responsible for the considerable number of men who fell out, as on 30th when the weather was cooler abundant supply of water available and the going better only 6 men fell out as against over 100 on the 2 previous days.  Other causes were bad fitting equipment and boots, lack of March discipline, and efficient supervision by Platoon Commanders and N.C.O's and lack of training in marching with full pack and ammunition. A very necessary point to be noted was that it is absolutely necessary for every man to discipline himself with regard to economising water and rations. The greatest number of men fell out on the 29th. This was chiefly owing to the fact that the majority of men had drunk all their water and eaten their rations during and after the long march on 28th and therefore were obliged to march on 29th with empty water bottles and empty stomachs.


