

IAGHAMA	29th	March resumed 0600 to MOASCAR (8 miles). March resumed 0615 to SERAPEUM where Battalion occupied new Camp	
IOASCAR	30th	NOTES ON MARCH - Weather - Hot. Water - Scarce. Surface of Ground - Very deep sand. Above was largely responsible for the considerable number of men who fell out, is as on 30th when the weather was cooler abundant supply of water available and the going better only 6 men fell out as against over 100 on the 2 previous days. Other causes were bad fitting equipment and boots, lack of March discipline, and efficient supervision by Platoon Commanders and N.C.Os and lack of training in marching with full pack and ammunition. A very necessary point to be noted was that it is absolutely necessary for every may to discipline himself with regard to economising water and rations, necessary for every may to discipline himself with regard to economising water and rations. The greatest number of men fell out on the 29th. This was chiefly owing to the fact that the majority of men had drunk all their water and eaten their rations during and after the long march on 28th and therefore were obliged to march on 29th with emty water bottles and empty stomachs.

	3/9	Training continued (App lc). Marched to new camp RAILHEAD (5 miles). March satisfactorily performed attention having been given to points noticed on march TEL-EL-KEBIR SERAPEUM.	
	10/16	Traiging continued (App 1d). Great attention being paid to training of Signallers, Grenadiers &c. and to Musketry of which a course was commenced. During the week a class for instruction of N.C.Os. was held under Major A.K.DENHAM and Captain F.M. COUCHMAN. This class prooved a great success, much useful knowledge was obtained and great credit is due to above mentioned Officers.	
	17 x22	Orders received to occupy Front Line Trenches on 18th cancelled and altered to 21st. Brigade inspected by Corps Commander (Lieutenant General SIR ALEXANDER GODLEY). Training and Musketry continued.
