			<p><u>TRAINING.</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Training during the month has been carried out as usual. The majority of the men have been in the early weeks of training. 2. By permission of Headquarters A.I.F. Depots in U.K., a rifle meeting was held on the 13th, during the afternoon. This included a deliberate firing competition at 200 yards and 400 yards, a rapid firing competition at 300 yards. There was also a pool shoot at each range, and a tile competition, for which 8 teams entered. This is the first Rifle Meeting held in the Brigade, and proved a success, there being about 250 entries. 3. The inter-Training Battalion Cup was fired for on the 29th, and was won for the 5th Training Battalion for the 4th time in succession. 4. On the 26th the Hon. Sir Joseph Cook K.C.M.G. P.C., visited the area. The Brigade paraded as strong as possible on No. 3 Command Depot Parade Ground, Hurdcott, at 3 p.m. in order to be addressed. Sir Joseph Cook explained to the men what steps were being taken in Australia at the present time to deal with men of the A.I.F. on their return, and explained that arrangements were being made to enable all men to obtain employment on receiving their discharge. 5. On the 28th a party of Press Representatives from Australia, accompanied by the D.A.Q.M.G., visited the Brigade. They were shown the method of training as carried out by the 9th T.B. 6. The weather during the month has been good, and training has been very little interfered with. 7. Reinforcement drafts from Australia continue to provide excellent material, the men have been physically fit and strong and have shown great keenness in carrying out their training. <p style="text-align: right;"> <i>G. The average sick parades and evacuations to hospital have been as follows:-

Sick Parades.

5th Training Battalion - 24 per day.

9th Training Battalion - 33 per day.

Sent to Hospital (General Cases).

5th Training Battalion - 33, average 1 per day) Total 127.
9th Training Battalion - 94, average 3 per day)

Of the total 127 sent to hospital, 40 were admitted to Fovant Military Hospital, and 87 to Group Clearing Hospital, Hurdcott.

DIPHTHERIA: 3 suspect cases of Diphtheria occurred in 2nd Training Brigade during the month, one case from 5th T.B. which was transferred to Civil Isolation Hospital, Salisbury, and 2 cases, one of which occurred at 2nd Training Brigade Headquarters and the other at 9th T.Bn., were isolated in the segregation area 9th T.Bn. pending the result of bacteriological examination of swabs. This examination proved negative in both cases as also in the former case from 5th T.Bn.

INFECTIOUS DISEASES: The number of infectious cases admitted to Group Clearing Hospital from 2nd Training Brigade, Fovant, for the month ~~xxx~~ is as follows:-

Of the number (20) of infectious cases that occurred during the month 13 cases occurred among troops ex H.M.T. "ORONTES", the remaining 7 occurring among previous arrivals.

Of the 100 who reported for early treatment 29 showed definite signs of the disease; of these cases 19 were cured and discharged to lines and 10 were evacuated to 1st A.D.H., Bulford, in addition to 11 other cases of V.D., making a total of 21 admissions to hospital from this Brigade for the month. This gives an average of less than one case in every 2043 on the average daily ration strength of the 5th and 9th Training Battalions combined.

The following instructions regarding the use and conservation of water are promulgated for the information and action of all concerned. Officers Commanding are requested to take the necessary steps to ensure that these instructions are strictly adhered to.

1. All ablution sheds, bath-houses, latrines, Urinals, stand pipes and horse troughs in barracks and camps will be inspected several times daily under Unit arrangements, and following points will be carefully attended to:-

- (a) That the number of wash basins - one for each tap - are present in the ablution sheds; that they are kept clean and that the troops do not wash under running ~~water~~ taps.
- (b) That the water taps are not left running by troops.
- (c) That the water in horse troughs is not allowed to overflow.
- (d) That no stop-cocks, pipes, taps, ball valves to cisterns or tanks, baths, trough-sinks, water closets, &c., are out of order, or leaking, or wasting water.
- (e) That certain hours are set apart for the use of ablution and bath-houses, and that these hours are strictly adhered to.
- (f) That hose pipes are not being used for any purpose in connection with water except in case of fire.
- (g) Any waste, cause of waste, or other irregularity in connection with the water service observed or discovered, and anything wrong with fittings, leaking taps, &c., should be reported immediately so that the necessary steps be taken to remedy the matter.

In the case of faulty fittings, leaking taps, &c., application will be made to the District Royal Engineer of the District concerned direct to have the defect repaired - a copy of such application will be forwarded to these ~~Officer in Barrack Services~~ Headquarters - who^{ch} will also be notified when the repair has been effected.

2. The following notices will be conspicuously posted in:-

(a) ABLUTION SHEDS.

- 1. Wash basins must be used on all occasions; they will be rinsed out immediately after use, and left to drain.
- 2. Washing under running taps is strictly forbidden.
- 3. The unauthorised removal of basins from Ablution places is strictly prohibited.
- 4. The washing of messing utensils in ablution basins is strictly forbidden.
- 5. Taps will be turned off immediately after use. On no account will they be allowed to run, causing basins to overflow.

Disciplinary action will be taken against any individual not complying with above orders.

(b) BATH HOUSES.

- 1. The washing of clothing in bath houses is strictly forbidden.
- 2. Showers will be turned off immediately after use by each individual.
- 3. The bath house orderly will ensure that these orders are carried out, reporting any irregularity together with the name of the offender, to the Camp Sgt. Major.
- 4. In the case of faulty showers, the bath house orderly will immediately inform the Quartermaster, at the same time taking necessary steps to stop the wastage of water until the shower has been repaired.

(c) COOK-HOUSES.

1. The use of hose pipes for any purpose in connection with water is strictly forbidden except in the case of fire.
2. The washing of floors and the filling of boilers will be carried out by means of buckets, except where taps have been fitted over boilers for this purpose.
3. Water taps will be turned off immediately after use. On no account will running taps be used for washing utensils, &c.
4. When water is being drawn off by bucket, the taps will be turned off before the bucket is quite filled in order to prevent overflowing.

The Sergeant Cook will be responsible that these orders are strictly carried out. In the case of leaking taps, he will immediately inform the Quartermaster, and at the same time take the necessary steps to stop the wastage of water until the taps have been repaired.

2. UNIFORM. With reference to King's Regulations para. 1694, G.Os.C-in-3. it has been granted permission to Officers to wear plain clothes when on leave away from their stations, and at their stations when not on duty, for purposes of athletic exercises for which a special dress is necessary.

Otherwise uniform will be worn by all ranks at all times during the continuance of the War.

Officers at home on leave from abroad may wear plain clothes except when visiting the War Office, the Headquarters of the Field-Marshal, Commanding-in-Chief, Home Forces, or of any subordinate Command at home. (A.O. 163 of 1917.)

Any style of uniform deviating from the Regulation is prohibited. Officers Commanding Units are responsible that the dress of Officers under their Command is in conformity with regulations.

"It has been brought to notice that frequent cases of indiscipline and bad conduct amongst Officers and Other Ranks of the A.I.F. have occurred at the Australian Base Depots in France, and at the neighbouring base towns.

The G.O.C. ... I. ... is sure that only a proportion of the Officers and men are directly implicated in this indiscipline, and that there is an undoubted

but at the same time he feels that there is an undoubted tendency on the part of Officers and men to pay less regard to their good conduct while at the Base preparatory to proceeding to the Front than they do whilst with their Units.

All ranks should realise that such an attitude is not compatible with their duty as soldiers and that strict regard to propriety and discipline must be observed by them on all occasions, and that any slackness on their part while at the Base probably brings more discredit on the A.I.F. than it does in any other circumstances.

Please bring this matter periodically to the notice of all ranks and inform them that not only will indiscipline and bad conduct bring discredit upon the troops whose fighting efficiency has been the subject of praise on every side, but that it also will be necessary to take severe disciplinary measures against the individuals involved."
