

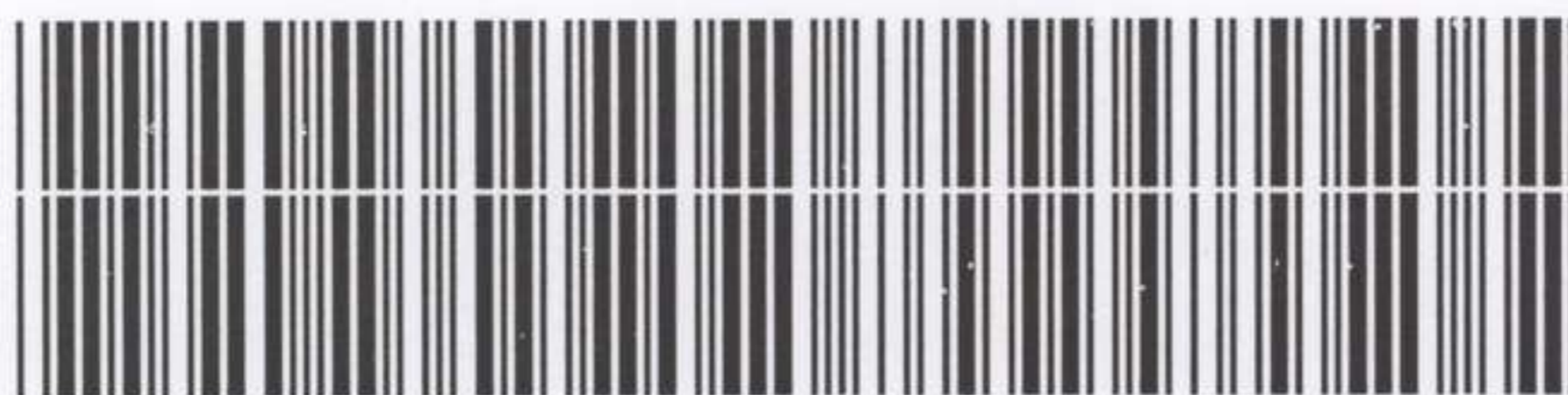

1. The General Officer Commanding-in-Chief Forces in Great Britain will inspect the 3rd Training Brigade at 15.20 hours on November 7th. The order of inspecting Battalions as follows.

2. The following returns (6 copies of which will be rendered to these Headquarters as follows:
  - (a) An accurate R.F. which must agree with the numbers on parade employed etc. to reach these Headquarters by 09.00 hours the 7th instant.
  - (b) A syllabus of Training for the day, showing in detail the work being carried out. The Week of Training squads represent (in connection with this all men of the last Reinforcement must be on parade, and the Guard for the day provided by other categories. This syllabus to reach these Headquarters by 17.00 hours 6th inst.
  - (c) A programme of work to meet the conditions which would arise should wet and stormy weather occur that would necessitate orders being issued to carry out Training under cover. The locality of shelter in which Training is taking place and the nature thereof to be shown.
    - (a) Commandants of Signal Schools will arrange for Training between 15.00 and 16.30 hours to be out of doors, no lectures or indoor work to take place at the above mentioned hours.
3. All men undergoing training must be on their respective Battalion Training Grounds.
4. Attention is directed to Headquarters A.I.F. Depots Order No. 4441 dated 21-4-1918.
5. The following points are to be noted -
  - (a) No change over during inspection.
  - (b) All men must be working. Lecturing by Instructors is to be cut out (though faults of course are to be checked without wasting time.
6. Brigade Officers holding classes must have on parade -
  - (a) Parade State.
  - (b) Syllabus of Training showing week or weeks training of class.

I respectfully submit the following report on Sanitary condition of above Camps:-

1. Hutments and Ventilation. Hutments were found in a clean and satisfactory condition and ventilation of same well maintained. No overcrowding to report.
2. Protection of Food. Every endeavour is made to protect Foodstuffs from contamination by flies and dust.
3. Bookhouses. Throughout the Command Bookhouses and adjoining rooms were found clean and satisfactory.
4. Grease Traps. No 2 Group to Hospital - Satisfactory.  
3<sup>rd</sup> Div Bge Nos 5, 6, 7 & 8 Camps. The Grease Traps of all the Bookhouses and bansteens, are more or less dirty, and not receiving proper attention. Over a dozen of same have been tested, sludge and grease deposits found in each one.  
In the case of men's Bookhouse No 7 Camp, the deposits are more than 6 inches in depth at the bottom of the traps which reveals neglect of this important work.  
This test was taken at 11.30 am on 20<sup>th</sup> inst.
5. Latrines } This week a marked improvement was noticed  
Urinals } the whole now being in a satisfactory  
Ablutions } condition.
6. Surface drains. Throughout the Command Surface drains and Gullies were found in a satisfactory condition.
7. Conservancy & Garbage. The Conservancy System and Garbage removal from the lines is being well carried out throughout the Command. The washing of Latrine buckets, removal of faeces and incineration of same is being well attended to by Imperial Sanitary Section engaged on this work.



Even when the conditions are complied with, and the Germans are unable to re-commence fighting on a large scale, there may be numerous cases where our armies have to keep them quiet. Armies of occupation may also be needed to enforce the ultimate terms of peace. Consequently our work as soldiers is not complete, and training must for the present proceed as before. In Command Depots this is in any case desirable as well as necessary, for the training there is solely directed to making men physically fit again, which is a result as much needed for Civil as for Military life. In Training Depots, including the Overseas Training Brigade, Military Training will continue, because the men are more likely than not to proceed Overseas to their Units when their training is complete.

All training will therefore continue as heretofore till further orders. This Order is issued in order that all ranks be aware that there is a purpose in continuing training, and that it is not done merely to fill in time.







Should sausages be required by Units for Christmas Day, these may be obtained from Army Stocks on repayment, debit vouchers being issued by Supply Officers for the quantities of sausages so supplied at the price of 8gd per lb.

In the case of those Units which decide to draw the money allowance or wish to obtain sausages on repayment, at least nine days' notice will be given to the local A.S.C. Officer.

NOTES. A.I.F. Units deciding to draw Cash Allowance in lieu of Meat will be supplied by the A.A.S.C. Supply Officer in the district with the necessary certificates.

To admit of the 9 days notice, referred to above, being given to British Supply Depot, 10 days notice to A.A.S.C. Supply Officer will be necessary.
