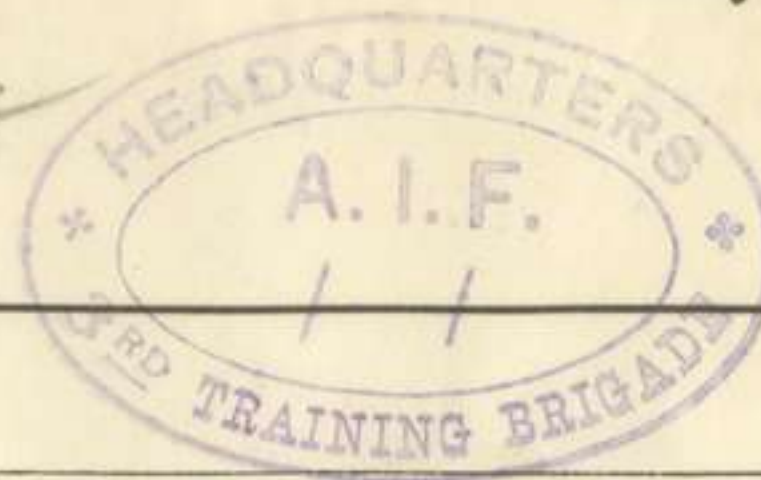

TRANSPORT. Lieut. H. J. Cutts will act as Transport Officer, and will take charge of Composite Battalion Transports now located at the 12th Training Battalion.

AMMUNITION. Lieut. W. W. P. Fish will act as Quartermaster and will arrange to draw 220 rounds S.A.A. per man in bulk.

LEWIS GUN. Lieut. MCCARTHY will act as O. C. Lewis Gun Section. He will arrange to draw today 6 guns from the 12th Training Battalion. He will also arrange to draw 4,000 rounds of S.A.A. Mark VII per gun. Lewis Guns will be carried as follow:-

2 Lewis Guns, 8,000 rounds S.A.A. in 1 G.S. Limbered Wagon.
4 " " 16,000 " " " " " Wagon.

Lewis Gun teams are included in the numbers of the Battalion and will be drawn from men most advanced in Lewis Gun work.

COOKING UTENSILS. The Quartermaster will arrange for seventy-five (75) camp kettles and one box of butchers' implements per 1,000 men and sufficient accessories such as ladles, etc., will be taken from stock on charge to units. He will provide 50 picks and 100 shovels to be made up from Training Units.

RIFLES. Companies will arrange to have all men of their ~~xxxxxxx~~ Composite Company equipped with only Service S.M.L.E. or 1914 Pattern Rifles and Bayonets. Oil bottles and pull-throughs to be carried.

COOKERS. The 12th Training Bn. Messing Officer will arrange to have the 4 "Wiles" Cookers now in possession of the 12th Training Bn. thoroughly equipped and packed ready to move at 10 a.m. on the 22nd instant.

DRESS. All ranks must wear full marching order, mess tin in pack. Field dressing from supplies on charge to Training Battalions will be issued to each Officer and Other Rank.

MOUNTED OFFICERS. ~~Will wear "Sam Brown" belts; all other Officers will be dressed and equipped the same as their men with web equipment and packs.~~
Will wear "Sam Brown" belts; all other Officers will be dressed and equipped the same as their men with web equipment and packs.

SIGNALLERS. In the Battalion Transport the fore portion of 1 tool limber is allotted for spare Signalling stores and stationery. This fore part of limber will report to Signalling School on order to mobilize.

RIFLES. Any rifles or steel helmets required to complete quota of 14th Training Bn. will be drawn from 12th Training Bn. Armoury immediately prior to Battalion parade.

OFFICERS' KIEP. Those of 12th Training Bn. will be placed in front of 12th Training Bn. Officers' Mess; those of 14th Training Bn. in front of 14th Training Bn. Orderly Room ready for removal by 9.30 a.m.

WATER BOTTLES. Company Commanders will be responsible that every man moves out with full water bottle.

TACTICAL EXERCISE - 3RD TRAINING BDE.

GENERAL IDEA.

A Westland Force is advancing down the WYLYE VALLEY.
An Eastland Force is delaying the advance of the
Westland Force.

SPECIAL IDEA - Eastland Force.

1. At 7 p.m. on the 13th May, 1918, the Eastland advanced Troops are extended along the line of the track I 19 B 24 - I 19 D 01 - I 25 A 42 across the RIVER WYLYE to about N 36 C 90.
2. The Main Body of the Eastland Force is preparing a Defensive Position along the Line about I 13 D 86 - I 20 D 42 - crossing the RIVER WYLYE to the East of DEPTFORD and WYLYE villages.
3. The O.C.nth Battalion, to which are allotted 4 Stokes Mortars and 4 Vickers guns, receives orders at 6.30 p.m. on theday to reconnoitre and prepare for Defence with his Battalion, a position about the village of FISHERTON-DE-LA-MEESE, to cover the withdrawal of our advanced Troops on to the Main Line mentioned in Para. 2. This position is to be occupied by Mid-night, and he must be prepared to hold it for 24 hours. The Area for which he is responsible is bounded on the North by the Line I 25 B 05 - I 26 A 72, and on the South by the Main Stream of the RIVER WYLYE, inclusive.

PROBLEM 1. - FOR SYNDICATE REPRESENTING BATTALION COMMANDERS.

Show how you intend to dispose of your Battalion by

- (a) a short appreciation of the situation,
- (b) orders to the Battalion, 1
- (c) showing in pencil, on the 20000 map given you, your proposed trenches, building defences, and Signal Communications.

Your solution should include any help you would ask for in the way of Cross Fire from the Battalion on either Flank.

Time for reconnaissance and solution 1 hour.

PROBLEM 2. - FOR SYNDICATES REPRESENTING COMPANY COMMANDERS.

How do you intend to dispose of your Company in the time available? Your solution (verbal) should state in detail what ~~Defensive~~ work you propose carrying out, with a rough sketch of the trenches, defences to buildings, etc., that you intend to make.

Time for reconnaissance and Solution 2 hours

N.B. -- For the purposes of the Scheme it may be assumed that the head of the Battalion will reach Road Junction at I 27 C 81 at 8 p.m. It is unlikely that the enemy will be able to bring up anything bigger than Field Artillery.

Minutes of Adjutant's Conference held at Headquarters,
3rd. Training Brigade on Tuesday 28-5-1918.

1. The question of the waste of time in the change over and smoke-oh at each hour was discussed and it was decided that not more than 10 minutes must elapse between the finish of one subject and the continuation of the next in the Syllabus of Training.
2. That N.C.O's. holding Aldershot P.T. & B.F. Certificates were not to be taken for Guard except under exceptional circumstances.
3. Anti-gas Measures.
 - (a) That ~~two~~ evenings of the weeks after the 3rd. Week of Training be devoted to the wearing of Box Respirators continuously for one hour. The last hour of training in the afternoon will be cut out, steps being taken to ensure that this hour is not one devoted to Musketry.
 - (b) That on no account is the instructions in Anti-gas measures of employed men of Category "A" to be interfered with and a qualified Instructor is always to carry out their training in this subject.
4. That in future the Weekly Route March will take place on Saturday morning and not on Fridays as heretofore, V.D. Parade for those ranks for the Route March taking place not later than 7.45a.m.
5. That the one man Assault Course for the training of drafts be put in order forthwith and drafts put through in accordance with Assault Training.
6. The Demonstration Platoons of both Training Battalions will parade on the Range at 3.0p.m. on the 29th. and 30th. instants. Dress. Drill Order, hats will be worn. Dummy Rifle Grenades with Thunder Flashes and Ball Ammunition will be taken. Officers will carry out the instruction of those squads whose Instructors are away with the Platoon.

Minutes of Adjutant's Conference held at 3rd. Training
Brigade Headquarters, on Tuesday, 21-5-1918.

1. That new Reinforcements must be divided into classes according to their various weeks of training so that in P.T. & B.F., Musketry, &c. they are always under the instruction of the same Instructor, throughout their training.
2. All P.T. and B.F. Instructors to be employed with the Signallers of Divisional Schools in the first hour of parade daily owing to the large numbers at the Schools. Recruits in Battalions do P.T. & B.F. commencing the 2nd. hour of parade.
3. That steps must be taken to ensure the wearing of Box Respirators for an hour continuously at least twice during the 10 weeks training of recruits, either in the hour devoted to Anti-gas or at another time.
4. At the Commandant's inspection of Drafts on Saturday, men must parade in boots in which they will proceed overseas.
5. The forming of a Demonstration Platoon by the N.C.O's. of the Permanent Cadre of Battalions was discussed, to demonstrate to all Drafts proceeding overseas the correct method of the Platoon in the Attack.

Rehearsals to take place first and then the practice carried out with Ball on the Field Firing Range.



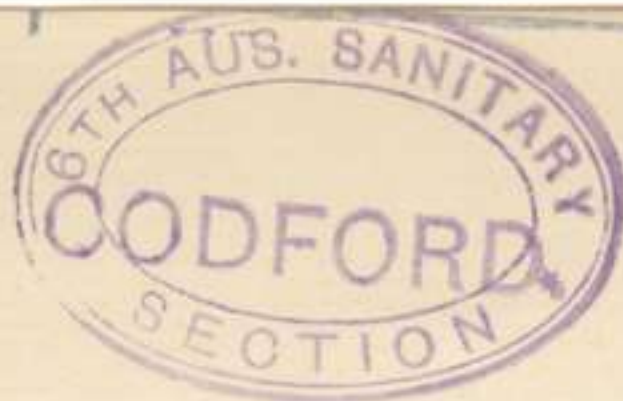

Minutes of Adjutant's Conference held at Brigade Headquarters,
 7th. May 1918.

1. So long as the orders hold good that Reinforcements are to be drafted overseas in the 10th. Week of Training -
 - (a) Musketry will start in the 8th. Week of Training.
 - (b) 50% of the Draft will do half a day in Lewis Gun instruction for every day of the 9th. Week of Training.
2. A Roll is to be kept by Company Commanders showing men of Reinforcements in their batches. Should a man for any reason be absent for more than 4 days - the week in which absent will be shown on this Roll and he will return to that week of training.
 These Rolls will be inspected every Saturday by Adjutants.
3. Lectures to be delivered by Specialist Officers to their respective Instructors, as a form of refresher, at least once a week.
4. Musketry Parties are to be detailed into two parties when firing the G.M.C, as follows -
 - (a) The first party to cease fire at 1. Op.m. and return for their dinner.
 - (b) The second party to have dinner before going on the Range ~~and~~ reporting in time to carry on without loss of time from the 1st. party.
 - (c) Each party will do at least two hours training per diem on Battalion Parade Grounds.
 - (d) Details on the Range while waiting their turn to fire will be practiced in rapid loading and anti-gas measures primarily.
5. Last Reinforcements to proceed on Disembarkation Leave on Thursday, May 16th., without fail.
6. Coy. Sergeants-Major to attend parades and generally assist in supervising training.
7. Attention to be drawn to the selecting and forwarding of candidates name for Courses.







DISPOSAL OF STEEL HELMET WHEN ADJUSTING BOX RESPIRATOR.

1747. The following amendment is authorised and will be made in Section 3, S.S. 620 (also embodied in S.S. 534, Appendix 1, Section 3):-

Delete "On the word ONE. If the rifle is not slung, place it between the knees.....
"at the same time knock off the steel
"helmet from behind with the left hand."

"On the word ONE. If the rifle is not slung, place it between the knees. Place the closed fist of the left hand on the bridge of the nose and knock the steel helmet forward with the right hand so that it falls and is caught on the left arm by the chin strap."



FROZEN RABBITS.

1793. It has been brought to notice that Frozen Rabbits issued to the troops, which have been slightly affected by white mildew, have been condemned as unfit for human consumption.

Rabbits presenting this appearance have been carefully examined at the Royal Army Medical College and the result has shown that the mould found on the surface, and producing the white spots, is quite harmless. The white specks found in the organs (liver, kidney, etc.) appear mainly to consist of collections of fat which have become crystallised during freezing. These nodules do not in any way impair the quality of the meat.

FROZEN RABBITS (Contd.)

In these circumstances rabbits presenting the appearance described should not be condemned, as they are perfectly sound and fit for human food.

ECONOMY IN THE USE OF GAS AND ELECTRICITY.

1813. 1. The Board of Trade have drawn attention to an order which they have recently made under the Defence of the Realm Regulations for the purpose of maintaining and regulating the supply of Coal Gas and Electricity and other articles of commerce required for lighting, heating, and power purposes. The order has been rendered necessary by reason of the fact that the normal supply of coal to gas and electricity undertakings has had to be considerably curtailed, and it is accordingly imperative that strict economy in the consumption of gas and electricity should be effected in order that the undertakings may be in a position to carry on during the winter months.

2. The attention of all concerned is therefore drawn to the necessity for the exercise of the most stringent supervision over the use of gas and electric current in barracks, hatted camps, and other military buildings, with a view to reducing consumption to the lowest possible limits during the present emergency.

3. It is considered that generally in camps, &c., the number and power of lamps might be reduced in many cases, particularly in cantens and other special buildings and establishments, and steps should be taken locally to effect these reductions wherever possible.




