

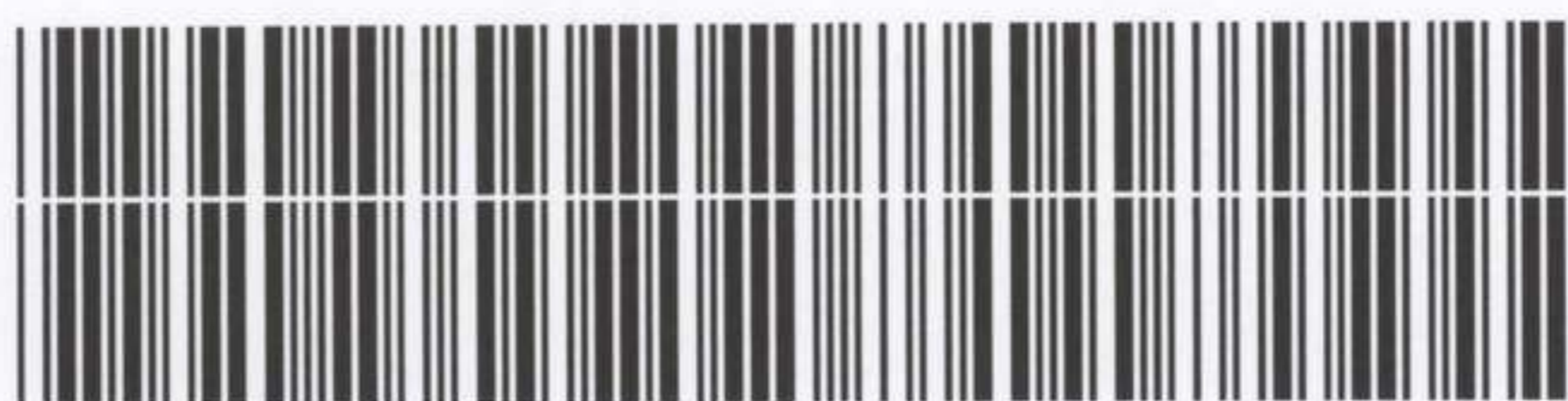

Mametz	7/19/18		Weather fine but cold. Wind very bad. Working parties busy clearing up camp. Constructing latrines, building roads. Special Battalion Hospital dealing with all cases of chill and sore feet. Hot coffee & Biscuits provided for all roads.
DERHAMCOURT.	4 1/2 12/16		Battalion entered at WILLOW SIDING at 8.45 on today and moved to MEAULT. Detoured at that station and marched to DERHAMCOURT and went into billets. There has been a great improvement since our last stay in this village. Beds have been built in most of the houses.
1	6 1/2 12/16		140 Reinforcements joined the Battalion they look a very fine lot. A large number of men suffering with colds. Work carried out Physical Drill. Running. Bayonet Fighting. Swab Rifle Exercise. Guard & Section.
u	7 1/2 12/16		Held an inspection of all Companies and sections today, found everyone with a few exceptions very well equipped.
	9 1/2 12/16		Inspection by Divisional G.O. officer. Weather very wet.
	10 1/2 12/16		3556 Pte Bishop W. died on his way to Field Ambulance. His body was returned to the Battalion and buried this morning in the local Cemetery with full military honors.
			General BIRDWOOD. Visited the area this afternoon.

	12/13/16		Ranks being instructed in use of Lewis Gun. 1 Officer and 15 men detailed to repair bunks in billets and to build new ones where none exist.	
"	14/12/16		Many men suffering with Colds, also 22 have been evacuated recently suffering from mumps. Mostly reinforcements.	
	16/12/16		The Brigade Commander inspected the Battalion this morning. Full marching order.	
	17/12/16		Transport moved at 11 am on the way to Les Oua Flesselles.	
	17/12/16		Entained at 10 pm for Flesselles arrived there 2.45 am. Marched into Billets.	
	21/12/16		Sanitation of last unit very bad. Have closed up our built latrines. Very few bunks in Billets, when bunks and wire is available will start building. If each unit tried to improve conditions things would soon be comfortable in the back area.

Fiesselles	23 14 16		Musketry started on range built by Battalion at NAUVAS. 30 th Grouping by Company's fairly good. Weather wet, and very windy. Lewis Gunners carried out practice. Scouts did trap shooting.	
	24		Route march to Villers. Bodge with transport.	
	25		Xmas Day Voluntary Church Parade. Gifts from Australia Comfort Fund distributed to men. Supplemented by puddings etc from Battalion. Joints, Supt Dinner. Officers Dinner Xmas night. Begonia and staff attended. Major General Cox inspected Battalion and saw the men at dinner. Special leave has been given to selected men since the Battalion has been at Fiesselles. to visit AMICHS. This has been much appreciated. No cases of absence without leave occurred. Men were medically treated on their return.	At ease at the A.D.
	26		Musketry continued, special training in attack practice.	
	27		Route march to HAVERNAS. 6 miles. marching order.	
	28		Battalion Parade presentation of Congratulatory Cards. from MATR Gen Cox. Route march to VIGNACOURT. marching good. no one fell out.
