



1)---- TRAINING OFFICER'S SUMMARY ----

As per Syllabus Training was carried out during the month, &

usual standard maintained. 350 Reinforcements under training at the 1st month; 71 men marched out Overseas to France and 80 to Australia in connection with the 1914 and 1915 Scheme re furlough; 78 o/ranks marched in from O.T.B. for Signal School, and 43 from 9th T.B. for training as reinforcements for the 15th Bn, leaving 411 in Training at end of month.

Training Staff has been very much depleted owing to so many of the N.C.O'S marching out to Australia, also on leave in U.K.

Reinforcements who marched in from Australia on being allotted to a Battalion, at once began to take an interest in that Battalion, and shewed a keen desire to make the best out of their training, under a capable staff of both Officers and N.C. 015.

Live Bombing Practices were carried out on the "Bombing

Area" and also on the Range.

Lewis Gun Courses were held and every man went through the usual 6 days course prior to being quoted for overseas. P.T. & B.F. has been one of the main items of the Training Syllabus for the month, and the men have benefited greatly by this out-door work. Fast walking and running has been introduced. into the tables set down in special P.T. Manuals, and the men are becoming very fit, and able to carry out the other training as set down in the Weekly Syllabus.

Discipline has been exceptionally good, with exception of a few cases that were dealt with at Orderly Room, through the signing of the Armistice; chiefly being minor cases of A.W.L., .

" SPORTS" ... Football and Cross Country Rins were carried out during the month , and bery keemly contested ; men woo do not take part in any form of sport are sent on ea Route March for necessary exercise; naturally numbers on route march are very low. Several Boxing contests took place, and some fine bouts were witnessed.

Schools of Instruction were cancelled as per special orders received from higher authority, hence new Instructors arriving from France for tour of duty on the Perm Cadre , have to carry on as best possible; refresher courses not being available for them.

Training generally is of a very high standard, as no time has been lost through indifferent weather; the facilitie -s for indoor training being excellent.

REPORT ON DISCIPLINE

The principal feature of the month under review has been of course the Cessation of Hostilities and the concomitant effect on the Training Battalion. Naturally such an event premises the cessations of the functions ordinary of a Training Battalion but in this case the other cataclysmic nature of the Armistice upset the plans if there were any of the powers with the result that when definite news of the signing came, there was attendant on it a cyclone of cancellations of sports training, drafts movements which owing to their precipitation were cancel led and reenacted within a few days, with the consequent and inevitable reaction and disruption. Happily the latter was only of an ephemral

character and matters soon resumed normality.

Had higher authority a proper conception of the mentality of the Australian soldier I venture to think that different steps would have been taken. To my mind the proper way would have been to declare a holiday and a certain amount of leave at once with restrictions, which if properly pointed out would most certainly have been observed. The average Australian is a human of a little more than average intelligence and acumen and much more than ordinary initiative and a keen sense of honor which is patent when a matter is explained to him. Nobody or no body of troops could be more diligent and conscientious in it's observance. In the case under review when an event of National destiny, one might say without parallel occurred such as signing of the Armistice, training was ordered to continue and all amusements cancelled with the natural result that an ebullition of spitit not confined alone to Australians broke out in all camps and of a nature which caused misgivings to the unappreciative and "I toldnyou so's" from the uneducated. Happily in this Camp, though we shared in any opprobium resultant, the behaviour was excellent and worthy of emulation amongst so called "more disciplined" troops. No disorder occurred and beyond a lack of interest in work and a number of cases of temporary AWL, nothing occurred. AWL cases amounted to v46 but in no case was it necessary to declare illegal absentees. Those who were on leave were granted extensions on application. After a week everything resumed the even tenor of its way with the exception that immediate demobilization of lower categories commenced with the resul that at the end of the month 80 were dispatched to Australia, leaving 411 in camp, training. All 1914 men and those who left Australia between 1-1-15 and 30-6-15 also departed, and all remaining "A" class were ordered for overseas, and at the end of the month found them still standing by.

Health of troops has naturally been effected by influenza epidemic, which was frustrated to a great extent by precautions adopted In all 24 cases of influenza occurred being .086% of strength and only 1 death occurred. Other complaints were very minor.

(Captain G. J. Saxby) did excellent work in this connexion.

Discipline generally with slight bexception as outlined in para 1 maintained it's standard and excluding those AWL on account of the Armistice only 22 cases were dealt with at Orderly Room. week the Guard room was empty, a good record amongst "undisciplined troops". A further evidence of this is found in the abolition of the mounted and special patrols which were deemed necessary by higher auth ority to re-establish confidence amongst villagers. Whoever was reponsible for that base libel deserves an epitah on his gravestone to the effect that he did more to dismember the ties of the Empire than any Bolshevik regime. It is typical of insular predujice and narrow minded ignorance and unfortunately is too common. Happily the Australian generally has ab intellect which dexerves discerns its pettiness and ignores by ostracism the covert sneer. frs.

of Messing Officer (Lieut I.A.Macindoe) and staff and every satisfat ion was shewn fo his results by a draft which marched out to 3rd Training Brigade returning en bloc for a decent meal. This despite the fact that they work under same menu as is current here. Commodities to supplement ordinary issue are scarce ordinarily but with Christmas and Peace celebrations in view and the removal of restrictions generally, the War profiteer and food hoarder and opportunist re emerges from his lair and prices soar and quantities diminish, but civility is nearly returning. Perhaps civility and return to civil life are allied in effect of not synonymous. Duringathe war they were aggresive antonyms.

Administration 1.e. Paper fighting has continued in unabated ferocity but has been successfully combated bu an able office staff who are now very glad to have a respite in view from vexations and to their mind redundant returns.
