WAR DIARY FOR MONTH OF JANUARYARDERENDIX / By Lieut. Ellison E.O.

Owing to the unsettled state of weather, cross winds, mists and Snow, very little flying has been done, the total flying time being 108hrs 15mins.

TECHNICAL. Technical work has been exceptionally heavy this month, owing to the building of workshops, Stores, Offices etc. besides the ordinary routine of Aircraft and M.T. repairs.

The Gear Boxes, Diagonal shafts and Engines, were dismantled from Super-Gotha and Siemens-Steffen Biplanes, and are now packed ready

for dispatch to General Brooks-Popham R.A.F.

One Machine crashed this month, Sopwith Snipe E8088 on the 10-1-19. It was written off charge and dispatched to No. 8 Salvage Section

We have now the full complement of Machines, 25 in number. This Squadron was allotted a German Rumpler Machine (2 seater)

which brings us up to a strength of 26 Machines.

This Machine is used by Major Ellis M.C. and other Pilots of

this Squadron for Intelligence duties.

Motor Transport is now complete and satisfactory.

NOTABLE DAYS. On 1-1-19 Prince Albert visited this Unit with A.D.C. and Brig.-General Hogg C.I.E.

His Royal Highness arrived as the Brigade photographer was taking a Photograph of H.Q. Flight, in which H.R.H. A.D.C. and General Hogg participated.

During the month of January the Squadron has been situated on Bickendorf aerodrome near Cologne.

All work carried out in this period has been for training only.

Lewis and Vickers guns have been kept in position ready to repel in case of attacks by ground or air and each day a certain number of N.C.Os. and

mechanics receive instruction in the use of both guns.

AERIAL FIRING. The Wing has allotted certain days for each Squadron to carry out aerial firing practices, namely one day a week per Squadron. Unfortunately each day that this Squadron's turn comes round the weather has generally been too dud to do any firing. The result is that only about six machines have fired during the month.

CAMERA GUN. One machine has been kept fitted with a Hythe Camera Gun. Only having one serviceable gun this has to be changed about from Flight to Flight as required. The weather has also been against the use of this gun. On dull days in the winter it is quite useless trying to take photos, as the

results are always under-exposed and prints cannot be obtained.

A good deal of revolver practice has been done by all ranks, and a team of 6 selected to represent the Squadron in a Brigade competition, which is to be held early in February. Webley ammunition has been very hard to procure and therefore a limited amount of practice could be done.

GEARS. Although very little firing has been done, the C.C. Gear requires constant attention, practically the same as when fighting was on. The mixture of paraffin gradually soaks into the washers and hardens them and so causes a leak. The more a C.C. Gear is used the easier it is to keep in order.

Before going on leave now all Filots have to pass a gunnery test and be examined by the Wing Machine Gun Officer. So far all Filots from this Squadron have passed their tests easily.

During the month stores have been rather hard to get, such as C.C. Gear washers, P924 Oil, which have been indented for now from for some time.

During the month the usual routine work has been carried out, and a full programme of sport gone through. Rugby, Soccer, Athletics, Boxing and Skating have been the favorite pastimes of Officers and men, all of whom have enthusiastically and energetically settled down to the important business of keeping fit. A very successful Sports Meeting was held on 17th January culminating in the presentation of prizes by Brigadier General Hogg. Early in the month all category men were sent to England for early repatriation to Australia, and a week later the early 1915 men followed. Their place was taken by reinforcements from Australia. An epidemic of influenza greatly hindered work and games having practically run through the whole Squadron. Many men have gone to hospital and it is very krakkanka regretable that two have succumbed to the malady. The Squadron has been inspected by H.R.H. Prince Albert and General Salmond, both of whom favorably commented on the work of the Squadron.
