

War Diary for February 1919.

The ordinary Squadron work was carried out until the 18th of the month when orders were received to cease flying and hand over all technical stores with the exception of motor transport. These orders caused much excitement, heralding as they did an early return to Australia. Machines and stores were successfully handed over, and on the 27th the Squadron left Bickendorf for Estree Blanche.

Brig.-General Hogg C.M.G. C.I.E. inspected the Squadron prior to their departure and complimented all ranks upon their

splendid work in the field.

During the month the usual programme of sport was carried out with every success. The Rugby team remained unbeaten and finished a successful season by soundly beating a combined Wing team by 11 points to nil.

The health of the Squadron was fairly good, and the


influenza epidemic had practically subsided.

On leaving Bickendorf on the morning of the 27th, the remaining Squadrons turned out and gave the Squadron a fine send-off.

Our stay in Germany had been a very pleasant one and was made more so by the splendid spirit that existed between all ranks of the 11th Wing.

WAR DIARY FOR MONTH OF FEBRUARY1919.

. Work

Technical/has been exceptionally heavy this Month, but of a different nature to last month.

All machines were gone over, and adjusted ready for handing over. On the 21st instant 15 machines were handed over by road to No.70 Squadron, R.A.F., serviceable, and on the same date 9 machines were handed over to No.80 Squadron at Stree by air, serviceable.

On the 25th instant all Squadron equipment was handed over with the exception of Transport and afticles required on the move from

Bickendorf (Cologne) to Le Havre.

Equipment was distributed to 2nd A.P. Duren, H.Q. 11th Wing, No.70 Squadron, and No.206 Squadron on the dame date, vouchers, duly

signed, being obtained for same.

On the 26th instant the Transport was parked, packed, and ready to move. On the 27th instant at 8-30 a.m. the Squadron moved, the first day's trip being via Duren, Aachen, Eupon, Vervieres, Ensival, where billets were secured for the night, at R.A.F. Reinforcement Camp. Distance 65 miles, good, and without mishap.

On the 28th instant at 9-00 a.m. the Squadron moved, the route taken being via Liege, and North bank of Meuse to Andennes and billetted for the night at R.A.F. Reinforcement Camp. Distance 50

miles. Good trip, transport going well.

TRAVELLING BY TRAMS. .

On and after Wednesday, February 5th, all Officers and men of British and Allied Troops, and Nursing Sisters, will be required to pay fares when travelling by trams, private railways, and light railways, in the British coupied Area.

When not on duty half the ordinary fare paid by civilians will be charged. The ordinary ticket will be issued at half the face value, except that the minimum fare will be do prennig, and any uneven figure will be reckoned as 5 Pfennig, e.g. the half of a 25 Pfennig fare will be 15 Pfennigs. There will be no restrictions as to numbers travelling, nor as to the class by which men travel. But the proper half fare of the class must be paid.

When on duty troops will travel free, but must be provided with passes provided by the tramway company, and issued by units. These passes to be given up to the conductor on completion of the journey. Anyone without a pass must pay the ordinary half fare. These passes must bear the unit's stamp.

Troops on duty will travel, Officers and Nursing Sisters 1st class, N.C.Os. 2nd class, other ranks 3rd class. If there are only two classes Officers Warrant Officers and Nursing Sisters will travel by the higher, other ranks by the lower class.

Not more than 10 persons will travel on duty in any one car. If more accommodation is required, special arrangements must be made with the tramway company.


All ranks are to obey the tramway regulations as to smoking and nonsmoking compartments, etc. Travelling on the steps or on the buffers or couplings of vehicles is strictly forbidden.

On the broad guage State railway, all ranks may travel free provided that they are in possession of a regimental pass, leave warrant, or movement order.

RATIMAYS - DAMAGE TO STOCK AND RIMOVAL OF FITTINGS.

The following is an extract from a report on the condition of a leave train on it's arrival at the Base:-

Dirty, many stoves missing, many stove pipes missing where stoves have been left, benches have been burnt in several trucks. First class French coach D.P.Y.14" has been entirely gutted: not only have the cushions reen taken but the general structure of the inside of the coach has been destroyed apparently with an axe. All windows broken, sashes, straps, cords, and curtains cut out or in other ways destroyed. The coach is in a disgraceful state and is certainly of no use on the train. The above is only one of many similar reports which have been received of damage being caused to railway stock of trains employed for the movement of personnel both for demobilisation and leave. The damage usually takes two forms, either damage done by carelessness, such as broken windows and doors of passenger stock, or damage due to deliberate abstraction of fittings, such as stoves, seat cushions, etc. This damage has lately reached such proportions that it is impossible to effect repairs, or to replace fittings sufficiently quickly to maintain the stock in condition, and considerable hardship is inevitably saused to troops who have subsequently to use the damaged trains, more particularly in cold weather. D. mage of this nature can be avoided. Deliberate damage is caused by a small minority who do not appreciate the hardships they inflict on their commades by their action. Damage caused by carelessness is only the

result of thoughtlessness. All ranks are therefore urged in the general interest to do everything in their power by loyal co-operation to

maintain trains in the best possible condition.
