GENERAL SUMMARY.

During the month the Company has remained in billets at HAM-sur-HEURE. Only normal camp routine and office duties were carried out - the men being given opportunities for games etc. The general health of men and horses has been good with the exception of a slight epidemic of influenza affecting the former. During the month the Company Sports were held but a heavy fall of snow necessitated the meeting being postponed a few days. The second meeting was a decided success and all the events were keenly contested. In all cases the competitors showed careful and strenuous training had been carried out - with the result that several close finishes took place. Leave to CHARLEROI and BRUSSELS has been granted with a view to enable the men to see all the local places of interest. The opportunity thus offered has been taken by the majority of the personnel of the Company.

D.R. SECTION WAR DIARY - JANUARY 1919.

The weather during the month has been fair and on the whole fairly good results have been obtained from the machines. The rain during the early part left the roads in a very bad state and several machines have broken around the head necessitating the evacuation of the machine.

There is a considerable delay in replacement of machines which have had to be evacuated, at present we are 8 machines under establishment.

During the period of wet weather, after cleaning each machine, a thin coat of oil was put over each machine, thereby preventing rust and keeping up the general appearance of the machines.

The petrol is still of a very inferior quality and the issue of oil for lubrication has been of a very heavy quality, thereby causing bad lubrication and making it impossible to get the best running results out of the machines.

Wear on wheels is still very heavy and it is becoming very difficult to obtain the parts for the replacement of unserviceable bearings.

We have been unable to get any casing for Bowden wire, which is causing a considerable amount of inconvenience.

The average mileage per D.R. for the month is 400 miles.

The average petrol consumption 60 miles per gallon.

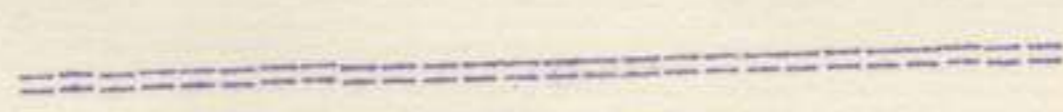
