

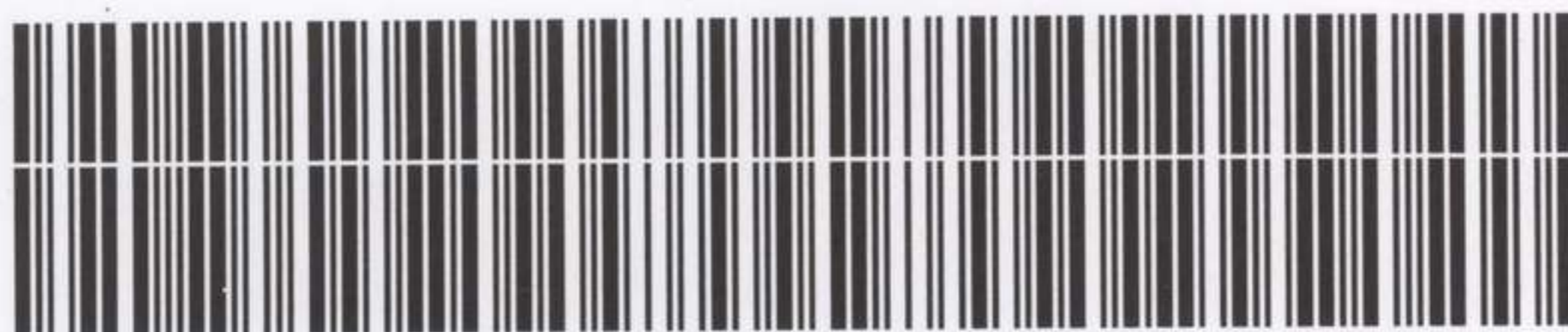

HAM-sur-HEURE. BELGIUM.	February 1st - 28th	1919.	<p>Headquarters Section. Throughout the month this Section has remained working at HAM-sur-HEURE. Normal daily routine has been carried out in Signal Office and billets throughout the month.</p> <p>Instructional classes in the new Signal Procedure have been held preparatory to its institution on March 1st. The telegraphists have found no difficulty in absorbing the principles of the new methods and we anticipate no ill effects to normal working.</p> <p>Demobilization has not affected the efficiency of the Section in any way as was anticipated, this being due to the fact that men due to return to Australia were understudied by men of later categories. This was found to be very successful as no man was then required to lose his place on quota.</p> <p>This Section supplied allotment to Quotas on 2nd and 5th February, the men being given a hearty send-off. Where necessary, the understudies took over duties and the working of the Signal Office and camp duties was carried on efficiently.</p> <p>Daily parades have been carried out: these being more in the form of Roll Calls and personal inspection. One parade a week was devoted to a complete inspection of all personal equipment, arms etc of the men. This tends to create a healthy individual rivalry which is noticeably reflected by the great improvement of personal appearance of men.</p> <p>The despatch riders have had a very strenuous time during the month. This has been due to adverse weather conditions; snow and ice on the roads making them dangerous, especially in view of the fact that heavy traffic has broken the surface up to such an extent as to render them almost impassable. These conditions necessitated the 4th and 5th Division runs being cut down to one per day.</p> <p>Generally the health and spirits of the men have been excellent - even though a slight epidemic of Influenza laid a few up for a short time.</p>	<p>of ix</p>

HAM-sur-HEURE. BELGIUM.	February 1st - 28th, 1919.		<p>No.1 AUSTRALIAN MOTOR AIR-LINE SECTION.) No.2 AUSTRALIAN MOTOR AIR-LINE SECTION.) - These two Sections have been chiefly employed on line repair and maintenance work. The line from HAUMONT to MAUBEUGE has had to be repaired twice owing to damage done by civilians; this damage consisting mainly of cutting down and removing poles from a German route used for our present communications. A line was erected from HAM-sur-HEURE to THUILLEES, the material being bobbins and G.I. 60 lb. wire, advantage being taken of an existing German Route. From THUILLEES, a party line of D.8 was run to the Sugar Factory on the main BEAUMONT - CHARLEROI Road. A metallic circuit was also put through between LOBBES and THUIN.</p> <p>METTET was connected to HAM-sur-HEURE via ORET, ORET STATION and GERPINNES. In all cases of construction where possible work has been carried out with salvage material. The two Sections supplied men for Quotas leaving the Unit on 2nd and 5th inst.</p> <p>The men have received liberal leave and every opportunity is taken to encourage sport in the Sections.</p> <p>When the Sections were not on construction work, daily parades were held. On Thursdays, a full marching order Parade was held, special attention being paid to arms and equipment.</p> <p>The health of both Sections has been good throughout the month - the men taking a keen interest in sport of all kind.</p>

HAM-sur-HEURE. BELGIUM.	February 1st - 28th 1919.		<p>No.1 AUSTRALIAN CABLE SECTION - the men of section have been in very good health - none having been on Sick Parade during the last week. The horses also are in good condition, great attention being paid to exercise as the work is very light and scarce. Wagons have been stripped and cleaned ready for return to Stores for Demobilization. All harness and horse equipment has been checked, overhauled cleaned and where necessary greased and oiled. In addition, it has been packed for return to Ordnance. All men carry out normal routine and stable duties.</p> <p>The adverse weather has seriously affected the stable yard - heavy snow and rain and the passage of the M.A.L. Lorries making it very muddy and unpleasant for men working with the horses. However, the stables are dry and clean and good shelter is obtained for the horses.</p> <p>Rations and fodder have been very good latter being of very good quality. This in addition to grazing has made a great improvement in the condition of the horses. Great interest is still being taken in the Education Scheme - men concentrating generally on Languages and Book-keeping.</p> <p>Practically some all the Section have availed themselves of the opportunities offered of visiting BRUSSELS, NAMUR, and other places of interest in the district. As a whole, the men prefer BRUSSELS, and some have had the good fortune of being allowed to visit this City a second time.</p>

HAM-sur-HEURE. BELGIUM.	Feby. 1st - 28th	1919.	<p>No.2 AUSTRALIAN CABLE SECTION. Throughout the month the Section has remained in billets in the Sugar Factory near HAM-sur-HEURE Railway Station. The billets are clean, dry and warm; in addition excellent stabling is available and good cover provided for vehicles. The men have remained in very good health throughout the month though a few were slightly affected by the Influenza epidemic which occurred during the cold weather.</p> <p>All stores stores and Equipment have been thoroughly overhauled, cleaned and checked; where necessary repairs being effected. This has been done preparatory to Stores being returned to Ordnance. There has been no demand for Horse Transport during the month and consequently great attention has had to be paid to the horses. This lack of work has been overcome by giving the horses plenty of exercise and frequent grazing; the these means, the condition of the horses has not been affected, if anything, the rest has been very beneficial to those which were not up to standard.</p> <p>Several promotions have been made in the Section; these being necessary as most of the old N.COs returned to Australia on Quotas leaving the unit on 2nd and 5th of the month.</p>

HAM-sur-HEURE. BELGIUM.	February 1st-28th 1919.		<p><u>COMPANY SUMMARY.</u></p> <p>Normal daily routine has been carried out by all Sections-daily parades being held at 0930 hours. Once weekly a full marching Order Parade was held by each Section with the object of keeping men's arms and personal equipment in good condition and complete.</p> <p>The health of the men of Company has remained good throughout the month, though a few were slightly affected by the Influenza epidemic. This continued good health is due probably to the fact that all the men take a keen interest in out door Recreation and also excellent billets they occupy and good rations issued throughout the month.</p> <p>The weather has been rather severe, several heavy falls of snow occurring - this gave another opportunity to the men for Sport and for several days skating and tobogganing formed an important part of the day's routine.</p> <p>The cold weather has seriously affected the Despatch Rider Letter Services - the roads being in such a bad condition as to render it almost impossible for the men to use their motor bicycles. This was arranged for by cutting down 4th and 5th Division runs to one per day and also when roads were very bad, by using a box car for the run.</p> <p>Demobilization of Unit has commenced - two allotments to a quota leaving on 2nd and 5th of month. These consisted of a total of 2 officers and 73 other ranks. In addition a number of officers and men have gone on Early Repatriation, Non-Military Employment (Educational and Industrial) and also for duty and A.I.F. Headquarters with Department of Repatriation and Demobilization.</p> <p>Arrangements are being made for disposal of Stores and horses on charge to this Unit. Former being returned to Ordnance and Signal Park, latter to be sold locally or returned to Base according to classification.</p>

HAM-sur-HEURE. Feby BELGIUM.	1st-28th 1919.		<p>Arrangements have also been made to bring the 3rd, 6th and 12th Army Brigade AFA Signal Sub-Sections on to Company Strength for demobilization. In connection with this the 6th Sub-Section reported to Company on 15th month, the 3rd coming in on the 24th of month.</p> <p>The 12th Army Brigade Signal Sub-Section is expected early next month.</p> <p>During the month the 4th Division Concert Party "The Smart Set" were at HAM-sur-HEURE and a series of concerts given. These were attended by many of the men and the players given a hearty reception. On the 23rd the prizes won at the Unit's Sports were distributed by Major General SINCLAIR McLAGAN, G.O.C., 4th Australian Division who was then acting G.O.C. Australian Corps.</p> <p>Leave has been granted to the men to visit BRUSSELS, CHARLEROI, NAMUR, and other towns of interest in Belgium. This opportunity has been taken by a great number of the men.</p> <p>Communications have been greatly facilitated on account of many existing German routes. These are being made use of and much material and labour is thereby saved.</p> <p>The feeling between civilians and men of this Unit billeted locally has been of a most friendly character. This mutual liking has been increased by allowing civilians to attend concerts etc arranged for the amusement of the troops.</p>

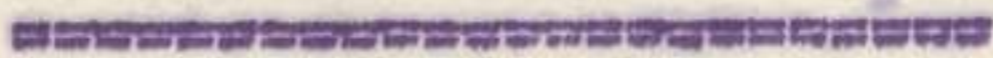

MARRIAGES BETWEEN BRITISH SOLDIERS AND FRENCH OR BELGIAN WOMEN.

1. With reference to G.R.Os. 5724 and 5571, it should be noted that all children born in France or Belgium of marriages between British Soldiers and French or Belgian Women are British subjects.

2. Unless, however, steps are taken to have such births properly registered, inconvenience and possible hardship may result in after life to the children concerned.

3. Consequently every officer or soldier who becomes the father of a child born in France or Belgium of marriage with a French or Belgian woman should forthwith communicate with the British Consular Officer nearest to the place at which the birth occurs. The British Consular Officer will be able to furnish all information as to what is necessary in order that the desired registration may be effected. Particulars of such registrations are forwarded in January of each year by British Consular Officers to the Registrar-General in London, and the effect is therefore exactly the same as if the birth of the child had been registered at Home by a District Registrar.

4. Officers Commanding Units will upon receipt of this order take steps to ascertain whether any Officer or man now serving under their Command is the father of a child born of such a marriage, and if so will ensure that this order is brought to the notice of such officer or man. They will also ensure that this order is similarly brought to notice in any future cases which may come to their knowledge.

5. British Consular Officers will be found at AMIENS, BOULOGNE, CALAIS, CHERBOURG, CROIX, DISPERE, DUNKIRK, HAVRE, LILLE, PARIS, ROUEN, CAEN, FECAMP, HONFLEUR, TRIFPORT and EU. With regard to BELGIUM, communications should be addressed to the British Consul General at ANTWERP.
