WARRE OF PETROL TINS. 22.

The following extract from Army Routine Orders dated 4.5.18. is published for information .: -

2 gallong "The enormous waste of, Petrel Tins calls for severe disciplinary action. From the date of this order, Officers commanding formations and units will be held responsible that 2 Gallon Petrol Tins are not retained, with the exception of those which are in legitimate use or authorised for the carriage of water. S.O.26. para (t) must be enforced. Petrol Tins now scattered about the area will be collected into dumps by the nearest unit, which will either return them to the nearest supply railhead or notify the army or Corps Salvage Officer of the location of the dumps made. Unauthorised Petrol Tins now in possession of formations or units will be returned to Railhead forthwith.

Para 261. sub par a(t) 4th. Army Standing Orders is published herewith,:-

"All 2 Gallon petrol tins will be signed for by the Drivers when taken away from the stores. A charge of 2s 4dd per tin will be made against all men who fail to return their tins, complete with stoppers, to the store. Should any man object to paying his fine, He will be made a prisoner and charged with losing by neglect, &z., And, if nocessary, He will be tried by Court-Martial. Tins are not to be retained for the carriage of water or for other purposes without permission from Army Headquarters.

REPORT BY O.C. LINES

AWSTRALIAN CORPS SIGNAL COMPANY

For Month of May 1918

CONSTRUCTION. Period 1st. May to 5th. May.

During the period 1st. to 5th. May, while the Corps H.Q. was situated at VILLERS BOCAGE it was decided to prepare a system of communication in the back area for use in the event of a retirement.

Accordingly both Nos. 1 & 2 M.A.L. Sections were employed in building the following routes.

Period 6th. May to 31st. May BERTANGLES&

Owing to the fact that there was only one main forward permanent kimm route through the Corps Area, and that not of sufficient capacity to accommodate the amount of traffic and number of units in the Corps it was found necessary to build another main forward route.

This was commenced on 7/5/18. In order to avoid flying grounds, three 7 pair lead sheath cables were buried from BERTANGLES to POULAINVILLE, and trom POULAINVILLE to LES ALLENCONS and a twentyfour wire permanent pole route was erected.

From LES ALLENCONS FORWARD TO THE RIGHT Division and the centre Division two 7 pair cables were buried, thus providing another main forward route and direct routes to the centre and right Divisions.

Various small spurs have been erected to connect local units and to lead in from main routes to test points and Divisional Offices. This has had the effect of clearing up the area and systemisind to some extent the routes.

MAINTENANCE.

Owing to night bombing and shelling a good deal of trouble has been experienced in keeping the routes up and in working order especially in the neighbourhood of villages. It was found necessary to keep one breakdown gang in each scetion standing by in case of emergencies.

OUT STATIONS

In order to cope with faults and to get tests on long lines, the number of manned test stations have been increased.

These are now situated as follows :-

AUSTRALIAN CORPS SIGNAL COMPANY.

The Section Sergeant and Artificer took over the Workshop complete on 15th. March, but the Despatch Riders were changed over in stages between 15th. & 30th. March. 1918.

The "K" Corps D.R's. were relieved in groups of four (4) or five (5) by AUSTRALIAN Riders who took over the machines complete and immediately went out on Duty.

The workshop was poorly equipped both as regards number and quality of tools, but replacements have been made and deficiencies supplied by Ordanance.

The stock of spares for Engines and also the stock of spare Tyres was totally inadequate but the requisite spares are now on hand.

The AUSTRALIAN CORPS M.T.COYS. Workshop has given taluable aid by keeping up a generous supply of new parts.

Our demand for new parks was very heavy for the first month after after taking over on account of the neglected state of many of the machines taken over.

Several of these machines have since been evacuated and have been replaced in each instance by a new machine.

Allemachines are now in good order and the only difficulty experienced is in obtaining rubber substitutes (mostly Sections of lorry tyres) for Buffer Springs which are unobtainable.

The work involved by the upkeep of the number of machines on charge to the Company, was found to be too much for one man, so that one (1) D.R. has been taken off the road to assist in the shop at all times.

One the SOMME the Despatch Rider Letter Service has been greatly taxed on account of the large area to be covered and the number of Units attached to the Corps.

The Service to each Division and to Heavy Artillery has been four (4) runs per day, and Circular Runs clearing the whole Corps Area are made twice a day.


The average milage per day for each Despatch Rider is estimated at 40 Miles.


Petrol Consumption is fabrly heavy on account of the inferior quality of the Petrol issued, Also frequent stops and gear work in traffic.




The Lubricating oil supplied is of very poor quality, not having sufficient body. This has been the cause of much excessive wear in Engine Parts.

REPORT

By O.C. AUSTRALIAN CORPS SIGNAL COMPANY for Month Ending May 31st.

Owing to the renewal of the offensive and the advance of the Germans on the Somme which resulted in the Australian Corps being moved from Fletre Area to the Somme, the work of forming the Australian Corps Signal Company and the subsequent take over from "K" Corps Signal Company was made much more difficult and arduous

The following Sections of Australian Corps Signal Company had been formed at Fletre and were beginning to train prior to the move of the Corps :-

No. 1 Aust. Cable Section under Lieut. H.F.J. Hiscock.
No.2 Aust. Cable Section under Lieut. A.F. Day.
No. 1 Aust. Motor Airline Section under Lieut. E.B. Stanbury.
No. 2 Aust. Motor Airline Section under Lieut. H.W. Watson.
Part of Aust. Corps Sig. Company H.Q. under Lieut. J.E.S.
Stevens and Lieut. G.J. Willats.

The two Cable Sections took over horses, wagons and equipment from two Imperial Cables Sections viz., "WW" and "F". The Imperial personnel as replaced being sent to Signal Depot Abbeville.

These two sections had about two weeks training before moving south to the Somme.

The two Motor Airline Sections were hampered by delay in arrival of their equipment as at that time there was only one Imperial Motor Airline Section (W 18) attached to "K" Corps Signal Company.

Six lorries were loaned from 2nd. Army to help out with the training and with the scanty gear available as much training as possible was done.

It was not till within a few days of the move that the Sections were equipped fully with their gear and four of W 18 Motor Airline Section lorries and one box car handed over. The remaining two lorries required to complete were supplied out of the six lorries on loan from 2nd. Army.

No. 2 Aust. M.A.L. Section is still short on Box Car, a 30 cwt. lorry being issued till one becomes available.

The H.Q. Section had been replaced to the extent of about 50% when the move took place and all further replacements of Imperial Personnel was stopped by B.G.G.S. for time being.

The O.C. Australian Corps Signal Company took over from O.C. "K" Corps Signal Company at noon 2/3/18, the day before Aust. Corps was relieved in the line by IXth. Corps.

Great inconvenience was caused by the large number of men requiring transport as there were, counting "K" Corps personnel and supernumary A.I.F. personnel about 150 O.R. in excess of establishment, and the lorry transport supplied from S.M.T.O. for all gear, men, etc. including Wireless and A.D.Signals store of cable was 9 lorries.
