

46th Battalion.

The trench entered by our raiding party at N.12.d.3<sup>1</sup>/2.1. to N.12.d.5.1. was about 5 feet deep and about 3 feet wide, and was without traverses. It twisted in and out a great deal as shown on attached sketch.

The sides of the trench up to a height of 4 feet were revetted with interwoven bought. There were two rows of unevenly placed spindbags on the parapet and parados.

At intervals of every 20 yards or so, there were "funk holes" dug in for a foot or eighteen inches under the parapet, and high enough to enable a man to sit in with his feet in the trench. This made the roof (of sandbags and earth) about 2 feet thick, affording cover from shrapnel. Across the tench above most of these "funk holes" there were three or four boards placed side by side.

Other than these there were no dugouts in the trench we explored.

A blind sap, the last five yards of which had overhead cover (boards about 2" thick), ran into crater shown on sketch.

The flooring of the trench consisted of flat boards loosely thrown down. At the place marked X on sketch, there appeared to be a small culvert for purpose of draining water into "No Man's Land". This could not be verified as this trench was badly blown in in this part. At the other corner it is probable that he drained the water into his listening post.
