



RENCHED eference 2D NE /20000 dqrs. 11.2. 60.80	lst. May 1918		The day was quiet with the exception of light enemy harassing fire on the usual places.— TREUX village and MARETTE WOOD.  Aerial activity was normal as the day was dull.  In continuation of reconnaisance made the previous night, we advanced our line by constructing seven posts at the following points — J.6.b.29.75, J.6.b.30.29, J.6.b.50.12, J.6.d.31.91,  J.6.d.40.80, J.6.d.32.48, J.6.d.40.21.  The digging parties were under Engineer supervision, special sappers being alloted to each party. The a/G.0. personally assisted in the siting of posts. Each party was protected by a strong covering party of selected scouts under supervision of scout Officer, Lieut.  W. S. PHILEP, M.C  Our artillery supported the operation by light harassing fire which conformed to the programme of previous evenings. This fire was to deaden the sound made by digging parties also to lead the enemy to believe that things were as usual. The parties were compelled to cease work by 3 a.m. in order to return under cover of darkness.  The posts were garrisoned by "B" and "C" Companies who placed 1 n.c.o. and 6 men in each post. Sketch of posts attached.  The whole operation was carried out without incident and no casualties were caused.  The reason that posts were advanced was to deny the enemy the dead ground as a forming up place prior to a raid or an attack, also to obtain touch with the enemy.	got !
	2nd. May 1018		Enemy appearently did not notice the posts dug the previous night.  The day passed without anything worthy of note.  We connected up our line by constructing a series of posts on the right, at following points J.6.d.45.00, J.12.b.70.90, J.12.b.45.70, J.12.b.45.50, J.12.b.45.49, J.12.b.45.40, J.12.b.45.00  As the previous night was dark and in order to avoid confusion, the posts were taped out with white tape by a party of two engineers officers at 7-30 p.m. (not dusk). This party was covered by a strong patrol under control of the scout Officer. The party succeeded in siting and taping the positions without being fired on by the enemy. Digging parties were protected by strong covering parties, the same as the previous night. The operation was not supported by artillery fire. The parties again withdrew at 3 a.m., the posts them being garrisoned by 1 n.c.o. and 6 men. The operation was conducted without incident or casualties. This now makes 13 forward posts dug and garrisoned by this Battalion. The posts were wired as far as naterials would allow.

RENCHES Reference 62D NE 1/20000 Hdqrs. J.11.a. 60.80	3rd. May 1918		The day was quiet and there was nothing worthy of note regarding enemy activity.  All available men were employed extending the posts laterally and wiring up to 12-50 p.m.  Work then ceased on the left, on account of minor operation mentioned below.  An urgent neme. was received from Brigade Headquarters at 4 p.m. to the effect that identification was urgently required.  The a/G.O., Hajor C. B. STORY, decided, in order to obtain identification, that small post at K.11a.35.22 would be raided. The party chosen consisted of Lieut. W. S. PHILIP, N.C., 2 n.c.os. and 15 other ranks with Lewis Gun. Zero hour was 1-30 a.m. The artillery at 1 a.m. fired a burst of three rounds per gun on the objective. From 1-30 a.m. to 1-50.a.m. 16/18 pounders fired two rounds per gun per minute on known machine gun posts, atc., and formed a box barrage around the post not actually firing on the post. 6" Howitzers engaged hostile batteries in K.3.b. and K.3.d. Our party ley up at K.1.a.15.25. Five minutes after, the opening of our artillery fire at 1-30 a.m., enemy commenced firing VERY LIGHTS and opened heavy Machine Gun fire from posts at K.1.a.45.70 and K.1.a.45.20. The patrol rushed the post in two parties. One of the enemy, north of the objective, fired steadily on at close range but our covering Lewis Gun beat him down. Two of the enemy in the post raided threw bombs and fired rifles at our patrol, two of our party being wounded. The two occupants were sufficed although they offered stubborn resistance. One of the prisoners was wounded by an enemy bomb which burst near him. Our party withdrew and came under machine gun fire from three guns located in the VILLE Cemetery. Our artillery fire/ throughout was reported to be very accurate.  Identification - 5th. Company, 357 I.R., 199th. Division. This Division was new, having arrived into the line and taken over about 10 p.m. the same night.	BA.
	4th. May 1918		Enemy shelling was today somewhat increased. The day was fine consequently aeroplane activity was above normal. This Battalion was relieved by "C" Battalion (39th. Battalion) in accordance with Relief Order No. 79 attached.  During the relief ememy retaliated heavily to our herassing fire but the relief was reported complete at 12-50 p.m. and without casualties. 37th. Battalion moved back and became "C" Battalion occupying system of trenches D.23. and 28, J.4 and 10 with Battalion Headquarters at the Chateau, MERICOURT.	At .

As many men as possible were bathed, 50 men from "B" Company who are unable to leave their trenches in the daytime were bathed at night, each man receiving a clean change of under-clothing.  Lieut. W. S. PHILIP, M.C., reported to Brigade Headquarters to take over duties of Brigade Intelligence Officer.	JAS.
	May 6th. 1918		"C" Battalion. Enemy artillery increased during the day, much gas being used by the enemy. Major W. F. H. ROBERTSON, was wounded. The enemy evidently thought that we kun were going to attack as all possible concentration areas were subjected to intermittent fire of H.E. and gas. Two officers and sixty other ranks were detailed to assist "A" Battalion in moving their three right posts forward in order to conform to the movements of the right brigade vide, Operation Order No. 80 attached. The night was extremely dark and steady rain fell consequently the operation was not proceeded with, our men returned to the trenches at 12 midnight. 	lay 7th 1918		The Commanding Officer and several officers of the 23rd. Battalion (2nd. Division) fisited Battalion Headquarters prior to taking over from us. Two officers and sixty other ranks were again supplied to "A" Battalion to assist in the advancement of their posts in accordance with operations Order No. 31 attached. These men dug and wired several posts and subsequently garrisoned same. Them artillers was very active but caused only two casualties to our men during the operation. The remainder of the men in the Battalion were bathed.  The C.O. was called to Brigade Headquarters at 4 p.m. to attend a conference.  The advanced parties of the 23rd. Battalion arrived into the trenches at 10 p.m.	Joseph
	May 9th. 1918		The day was fine. As a result, aerial activity was above normal.  57th. Battalion were relieved by 23rd. Battalion (2nd. Division) as per Relief Order No. 82 attached. The relief was completed by 11-30 p.m. The battalion marched by Companies to ALLONVILLE (62D 1/40000) stopping at FRANVILLERS en route where hot coffee etc. was provided for the men. The last Company arrived at ALLONVILLE at 5 a.m. 10/5/1918. The billets provided were good and the men were given breakfast and went to bed as they were tired after their fourteen mile march. 	lay 11th.		The day was a nice warm day. MUSTER PARADE was held by companies during which the men's shortages were ascertained and steps taken to complete shortages as far as possible. Shortage of Clothing had previously been a great trouble but to-day 300 new complete sets were obtained by the Quartermaster and men were immediately issued with them. 

2 D .34.d. 4.3.	May 25th. 1918.		The day was nice and fine.  LEWIS GUN TRAINING was carried out but men who were on working parties were allowed to rest. SPORTS as for yesterday were again indulged in.  The COMMANDING OFFICERE and ADJUTANT acceompanied by the MEDICAL OFFICER visited the forward areas and RECONNOITRED VILLERS BRETONNEUX and all approach routes and interviewed the headquarters of all line battalions.  WORKING PARTY consisting of same strength as yesterday was supplied. The party left at 4 p.m. and returned at 10 p.m.  The usual sport was again indulged during the afternoon.  Nine men rejoined the Battalion from Hospital.  Enemy heavily GASSED the forward areas during the night but no casualties were caused to our working party.

The party left at 4 p.m., and returned at 10 p.m.  At 10-45 p.m. word was received from Brigade Headquarters to the effect that an ENEMY ATTACK  was expected early in the morning on high ground north east of VILLERS BRETONNEUX also that  the battalion would "STAND TO", and await orders to move to Pioneer Switch 0.16 and 17 and  pass under control of the Ninth Australian Infantry Brigade for purpose of counter-attacking.  An officer was immediately sent to Ninth Brigade Headquarters to arrange for guides and  further details.  The companies were warned.  The order to MOVE was received at 11-50 p.m. The battalion moved by platoons at 300 yards  intervals commencing at 12-7 a.m. GUIDES were picked up at Ninth Brigade Headquarters. Hostile aircraft were also very active, bombing the back areas. Notwithstanding this the  Battalion reached the position and reported all correct in Pioneer Switch with Battalion  Headquarters at 0.22.a.75.75 at 2-50 a.m. without casualties.
