



(a) Advanced Guard work. These exercises are for vanguard training. Companies should leave battalion areas at half hour intervals and march out about 2 miles. Spare time to be used for rapid loading and firing.


- (b) Marching Order Parades. Men to specially practice removing and adjusting packs. Front and rear rank men to help each other.
- (c) Artillery Formations. Columns in single file to be discontinued. Larger bodies to be used and alignments to be irregular.
- (d) <u>Musketry Course</u>. Units will select as many recruits as can be conveniently instructed Ammunition must be indented for at once.
- (e) Trench Attack. This will be conducted as a battalion exercise and the grenade course will be made use of. A lecture for all Officers will be held in the M.G. Hut at 2000 on 21st inst.

#### 59th BATTALION ORDER NO. 16.



INTENTION

STAGING CAMP, 31st May 1918.

#### Reference Sketch attached.

- 1. The 5th Australian Division has been ordered to INFORMATION. assualt and occupy the enemy's first line trenches opposite the Staging Camp to-day. The 8th Bgde. will attack on the right, the 15th Bgde. in the centre, and the 14th Bgde on the left. Eash Bgde is allotted a frontage of about 600 yards. The attack will be preceeded by a bombardment. The 59th Batln will attack over a frontage of 300 yards.
- 2. The 59th Batln., supported by the 60th Batln. and assisted by the 1st Sect "F" Coy. Engineers and 1st Section 15th M.G.Coy. will attack on front "C" to "B" (see sketch). The frontage will be divided into DISTRIBUTION. 3. two sectors, each sector to be assualted by one Coy. with one Coy. in support. Right sector from "B" to "W" is allotted to "C" Coy. with "B" Coy. supporting them. Left sector from "W" to "C"is allotted to "D" with "A" Coy. supporting them. Lewis Machine Guns will be distributed one on each of the two successive assualting lines. Signallers will be where they can best carry out
- INSTRUCTIONS. 4. Engineer dumps containing tools, sand bags, barb wire, wire netting, also grenades and S.A.A. will be established at points marked "X".

instructions given later in this order.

Pioneers will represent Engineers attached.

Infantry First Line. Each man in the assualting column will carry a sand bag containing one sand bag and three hand grenades. When he reaches the fire trench in which he is intended to use his bayonet he will drop both sand bags and grenades, these being collected in the dumps by detailed parties. shovels per Company will be carried. Every fourth man will carry a plank either for laying across barb wire or for bridging enemy's first fire trench, planks for these purposes being arranged alternately and men must know for which purpose they are carrying their plank. 12 pairs wire cutters will be carried by each Coy. A party of 1 N.C.O. and 5 men will be told off from "C" Coy. under Sgt...... Engineers & the same from "D" Coy under Cpl ...... Engineers to dig communication trenches back to our lines, commencing immediately the fire trench is captured. Engineer Officer will be held responsible that his N.C.O'sknow where to start these trenches in order to tap our supports 14 and 14a. 1 N.C.O. and 2 men will be told off by the O.C. Engineers to go with each Coy. and immediately search enemy trenches for wires and cut them. Men carrying bridging planks will place same across enemy's first fire trench before jumping into it. These planks are intended to assist second assualting line to cross. After they have dealt with all enemy in dugouts etc., they must endeavour to assist in passing material to second line which nos becomes our front line defence, and if required assist them in placing their trench

in state of defence to resist counter attack. Every

minute must be used to the best advantage to strengthm

the line.

Second assualting Line. The second assualting line comprised of "A" & "B" Companies will be massed in trenches in rear of our fire trench. They will time their assualt two minutes after the first line starts. They will carry 75 shovels per Company. Every fourth man will carry a plank which will be used for the purpose of crossing our own fire trench. Each man will carry sand bags and grenades as per instructions to front line and will act similarly. This assualting line will pass over enemy's first fire trench using planks placed in position by first assualting line and proceed to second fire trench which they will enter and deal with.

A party of 2 men per platoon will have been detailed off to collect grenades and sand bags and dump them at suitable places near where grenade teams are working, viz., communication trenches. Parties will have been detailed off to guard each communication trench leading back from first fire trench until grenadiers have worked right through. "A" & "B" Companies will each detail 1 N.C.O. and 6 men with picks and shovels to report to Engineers at saps 14 and 14a respectively (these for the purpose

Grenadiers. 4 teams will accompany each Coy., 1
team will help to deal with dugouts in fire trench, the
other three will work back communication trench, the two
leading teams making good the traffic trench, the third
team pushing right on. Communication trenches in rear of
enemy's second line to be blocked.

Lewis Machine Guns. The guns will take up a position two on each flank of the Battalion in covered position in front of our fire trench and endeavour to assist our advance. As soon as enemy's first line is secured, I gun from each position will go forward and assist in protecting the clanks, the remaining 2 guns going forward with the second assualting line.

Signallers. Party will go forward with first line and establish telephonic communication with Battalion H.Q.

as soon as possible.

# 220 rounds of S.A.A. will be carried on the soldier.

An initial supply of 3000 round grenades will be carried by each assualting column. Brigade ammunition depots have been established at "0".

As soon as the objective has been gained supplies will be drawn from this depot and Battln depots estab-

lished in captured position.
