



NSEREMME				Training for the month was as per Syllabus attached. Short  Poute Marches were held each morning to keep the men fit. The remainder of the mornings were devoted to Gun Prill, Rifle Exercises, etc., with the object of maintaining a high standard of efficiency.  Battalion Parades were held on Tuesdays and Thursdays when in addition to the usual Battalion Prill, a short lecture was delivered to the troops by the C.O.  At intervals, marches to places of interest within easy distance	
			AMUSEMENTS.	Company Pances were held twice weekly and were well patronised.  Members of the Company were charged 1 franc for admission and civilians were invited. All funds derived were used in providing supper for the dances.	
			PEMOBILISATION.	On the 9th, inst., the first quota of 1915 men marched out to U.K. and subsequent demobilisation in Australia. The second draft left on the 20th, and the third, on the 29th, inst. This Company contributed Officers and 26 Other Ranks to these drafts.	
				The weather during the month was dull and cold with comparatively little rain. There was a good fall of snow during the last week which provided some good sport all round, with snowballing.	
			HEALTH.	The health of the troops continues good there being no evacuations during the month.	
	-		DISCIPLINE.	The usual high standard of discipline has been maintained during the past month. No Orderly Room cases were reported.	
				Although this is under Battalion Control, the members of the Company take a very keen interest in the progress of the teams in all three Codes. Several members of the Company are in Battalion Teams.	
				The usual allotment of leave to U.K. and places in France and Belgium have been furnished, besides which there is a trip to CHARLEROI by motor lorry, the accommodation for which, is allotted amongst the various Companies.
