

AUSTRALIAN

Company Headquarters and Camp located at YTRES (P20d9.9) Work distributed over the 5th. Corps Area.

Until the 23rd. the following was the order of Battle (North tonSouth).17th.Div.47fh.(London)Div. 19th.Div.and 2nd. Div. The Sections of the Coy. were distributed as follows; No.1 Sec with 2nd. Div. No.2 Sec. with Corps Heavy Artillery. No.3 Sec. with 47th.Div.with one relief attached for work in 17th.Div.am No.4 Sec.with 19th. Div.with one relief with 17th.Div. The 17th.Div. Party was commanded by Lieut.L.G.WILKINS.

After the 23dd. the order of Battle became; 17th.Div. 63rd. (R.N.) Div. and 2nd. Div. The 19th. And 47th. Divs formed the Corps Reserve. The distribution of Sections was then; No.1 Sec.-2nd. Div.No.2 Sec-tCorps Heavy Arty. No.3 Sec.- 53rd. Div.

No.4 Sec.-Ward.and 2nd. Divs.

In addition to the undermentioned work the officers carried out the task of locating, inspecting, and estimating the amount of timber in all dugouts in the Sector, for the purpose of

forming a Third Army Dugout Register.

An Officer (Lieutl D. BRIGSTOCKE) and 16 O.R. designed and is built, and now operate, a Mine Timber Depot and Sawmill at NOWNN ROCQUIGNY which contains four saws and large storage accommodation and is fed by both broad and narrow guage railways. This depot supplies Mining Timber for the Corps. A number of sets are cut dailt, and enemy sets robbed from captured dugouts redistributed.

Other dumps are located at NORBURY (METZ) Q 1967.3., RIBECOURT L25c8.9, HERMIES J3061.2. BW 101 Q4a5.5., and Q17c1.1. Material is sent out from the Depot by Light Railway to the required dump, and thence is conveyed to the work by G.S. Waggon A graph shwing the daily output of the depot will be found as

an Appendix.

During the whole period the Coy. was under the direct control of the Chief Engineer 5th. Corps. The administration of "A" and "Q" branches was carried out by the C.R.E. 5th. Corps Troops, who however exercised no control over the work of the Unit.

The work consisted chiefly of constausting dugoute to acce accommodate infantry and artilleryand various Headquarters. The skilled work was carried out by the sappers, whose chief o work however consisted in supervising the work of the unskill labour provided by the infantry and artillery. The majority of the work was in chalk. Plans of all work undertaken will b seen in the appendices where the weekly progress is also shown by means of coloured hatching. Firm outlines show complete work and dooted lines enclose proposed work. The weekly progress reports also give the number of sappers (R.E.) and attached infantry or artillery fatigues employed on each job. Each new piece of work undertaken is allotted a serial number for convenience of reference. In the appendices is a comparison of the footages obtained by the various Tunnelling Companies in the Third Army. The column" Equivalent Fatigues" represents the average number of men employed per day, in addition to A.E and includes resting men. In most cases in this sector the shifts are so arranged that each sapper has four days rest at Headquarters for each twelve days in the line. The total number of cubic feet excavated during the month was 202,018.

During the absence of Major E.N.MULLIGAN D.S.O. on leave

the company was commanded by Capt. A.F. COHEN.

An officer, Lieut. L.J. LAMBERT, is detached as instructor at the Third Army Mine School, where Artillery are being taught Tunnelling methods.

During the early part of the month Lieut. L.G. WILKINS was

in charge of the 5th. Comps R.E. Dump at YTRES.

Limit. J. A. REID is attached to 5th. Corps Headquarters as Forward Roads Officer, and is responsible for all roads forward

Lieutla A REID is attached to 5th. Corps Headquarters as Forward Hoads Officer and is responsible for all roads forward of the Battle zone

Casualties during the month were heavy, and chiefly consisted of cases of gassing. On the 26th and 27th the forward billets of No. Section were heavily shelled with gas shells causing 51 hosp cases. So far none have been fatal. The gas used was "Mustard Oil" and it is considered that the majority of the casee were caused the days following the shelling, by the sun vaporising the liquid in shell holes &c. The camp was abandoned.

A statement regarding the general healt conditions, by the Reg.

Medical Officer, is included in the appendices.

The work of the Motor Transport was greatly curtailed owing to the bad condition of the roads. Lorries were not allowed on the roads without a pass from "Q"branch of Corps, which had to be applia for on the day previous. The condition of the Motor Transport was in general very good. The Box Car was sent to "O"Corps Supply Col, and completely done up. Other vehicles were sent for fortnightly inspectons. A graph showing the daily Ton-Mileage is attached.

As a result of the restrictions on the use of Motor Transport the work of the Horse Transport was greatly increased. As will be seen from the attached reports, two horses were evacuated during the month, and have not yet been replaced. A G.S. Waggon was also con-demned and tempority replaced by a loan arranged by bthe C.R.E. 5th Corps. Troops. A new Waggon has been indented for .

A conference of Divisional Commanders was held. The G.O.C. 47th. Div stated that a Headquarters was being constructed for the Rigth Battalion of the Right Brigade, by the 2nd. Australa Tunnelling Coy, and in addition the Tunnellers were supervisig the Aid Post in the Hindenburg Support Line where Perry Av. enters it, and two Machine Gun dugouts. All these to be finishe by about the 19th. Feb. It was stated that work would be probably delayed for about four days owing to difficulties with Working Parties. The work that the Tunnellers were next to take in hand was Brigade Headquarters for the Right Bde. The Divisional Commander explained that he wished work to be concentrated on the Western end of the Flesquires Cabacubs and exits so that the Catacombs can be used by troops of the Support Batt. Proper exits from the Catacombs should be made so that the troops can come out into their positions of assembly without being observed from above, and as much prote -tection as possible provided. The plan proposed to be taken. in hand by Tunnellers allows for exits about 250' apart. Work should commende with the Western exits, then the communa -ication with the Hindenburg Line. The G.O.C. emphasided the importance of reinforced concrete for these exits so that they would withstand shelling without blocking.

18/3/18 Permission obtained from D.A.G., A.I.F. to send a man to LONDN on short duti. A number of models have been constructed of types of timbering &c. used by this unit. These are to be taken to LONDON by the above manand reconstructed and placed on exhibition.

This company supplies an officer (Lieut.D. BRIGSTOCKE) and 160.R. whombuilt and now control and work a Mine Timber-Depot at ROCQUIGNY. This depot contains four saws and is capable of cutting about 100 sets daily and also a certain proportion of a smaller work. Old-German sets are also delivered there by Army and redistributed for work in the Corps. The C.R. Es of Division have hitherto aubmitted weekly estimates of timber requirements to the Stalf Officer R.E. 5th. Corps, who supplied tham as far as possible from the ROCQUIGNY depot and demanded from Army the remainder of the order. The Chief Engineer 5th. Corps has now arranged that the control of all timber for the Corps Area be in the hands of the O.C. 2nd. Australian Tunnelling Coy, and has ordered the CMR.Es. of Divs.to submit their weekly estimate direct.

Meat issue dropped to 20%. Cabbages issued at the rate of 13 men per cabbage. Supply of Oatmeal bought from cantegn profits issaed.

See correspondence in Appendix relating to sounds heard at RIBECOURT, and suspected to be due to enemy mining, by the Infantry. These sounds were investigated and found to be cause by Ambulances, limbers and other vehicles, and men moving and wo working in neighbouring dugouts.

The Controller of Mines Third Army gave the following ruling with regard to the timber supply from the ROCQUIGNY depot.

All demands from thoops of the 5th. Corps to be through the O.C. 2nd. Australian Tunnelling Coy. All other indents to be through Controller of Mines. He also stated that the officer a and men at the depot were under the Town Major ROCQUIGNY for discipline and not under O.C. of this unit. The O.C. did not agree with this ruling and pointed out that these personnell were still under his command.

They are to be billetted and rationed by Bdes. and available for garrison w work if necessary. This Coy is to take over work on the R.Aid Post at R 8 b 2.1. from the 5th. Field Coy. Labour to be supplied by the R.A.M.C.

Following arrangements re Working Parties made with "G" Staff 2nd. Div. A party of 200 men of the 725thk Labour Coy, shortly to be available, will be attached to this coy for labour&fatigues in the rear areas. These will release the abovementioned 55 men per Bde. for work in the forward areas. In each Bde. certain wok will be begun, labour being provided as above. It is also propose to dig Machine Gun dugouts in the front line. The exact places will be notified later. The labour for these will be provided by Bdes.

Working parties attached from the 5th.and q99th Bdes.relieved by similar parties fom the 188th. and 189th. Bdes. The effect of this relief is that men of the 2nd. Div. are relieved by the 63m Div.

Work started at Position 93. Weather Fine.

23/2/18 The party of 80 men of the 47th. Div.working with this Coy. relieved by a similar party from the 63rd. Div. This party is intended for work on the new Ede. Hqrs.at Q 4 a 6.7

C.R.E. 2nd. Div. supplied following sites for M.G. dugouts to be constructed at some future date. Q 23a 9.5,Q 23 a 2.8,Q 24 c 2.5

Aust. Comforts Fund issued. Weather Fine.

Work started at 164 and 170.

By order of the B.G., G.S. 5th. Corps, arrangements made to state new Machine Gun positions at Q 4 a 10.05. and Q 4 c 70.85. The details of the work were discussed with the D.M.G.O. 63rd. Div.

A readjustment of the Corps front took place owing to the 19th Div. going out of the line. The 17th. Div. extended to the right to include the FLESQUIRES-GRAINCOURT Road and the village of HAVRINCOURT. 17th. Div. Hors. moved from YTRES to BERTINCOURT. This mchange resulted in the order of battle becoming 17th. Div. 63rd. Div. and 2nd. Div.

Controller of Manes Third Army visited the Camp. Weather dull Enemy heavily shelled No. 1 Sec. forward billets near METZ with gas shell during the night. Over 2000 shellsfell within the area of the camp. A full report is attached as appendix No.

Work started at Position 155.

Sweets sent by the Miners Comforts Fund issued to men in the line. 10z. Tobacco and two packets cigarettes with three boxes of matches issued to each man. Every second week the issue is two boxes of matches.

25/2/18 C.R.E. 2nd. Div. asked that work on the Bde. Hqrs. be forced, if necessary, at the expense of the Machine Gun positions, which are of secondary importance.

No.1 Sec. camp again heavily gas shelled, it being estimated that 3000 shells were fired into it. The camp is now shandoned. The total casualties resulting from the two bombardments amount to 2 officers (Lieut. M.TIERNAN and Lieut D.C. Mackenzie) and 31 o.r. The effects of the gassing were not, in the majority of cases, felt until some time afebwards. See report in appendics Major E.N. MULLIGAN D.S.O. returned from leave and reassumed

command.

RUSTRALIAN To Brigade Ma 140 Brigade report addressed to the A/Adjutant 1/4 R.W.F. and re conversation with the G.O.C. 140 Bde this afternoon, I have to report further as follows: -Listeners have been posted since I p.m. and have listened continuously. They report movement underneath both of men and of mining trollies. Sounds of hammers have also been heard. The trollies passed at 6.30 p.m. 6.35, 6.40, 7.3, 7.8, 7.20, 7.25, 7.50, 7.33, 7.40, 7.45, 8 p.m. From 8.15 to 8.50 p.m. I listened myself and heard the trolley apparently passing underneath three distinct times, together with footsteps and hammer blows from a more distant point. The sound appeared to be as of a small trolley running along on a set of metals. The downhill and uphill return journeys seemed to be quite distinct. All the miners who have hitherto been at the Listening Post seem to agree as to the nature of the sounds heard and as to the sounds coming from underneath rather from above. The further consideration that the sound of falling earth or rock has been detected seems to strengthen this surmise. The vibration caused by the moving trolley also seems to be felt rather from underneath than from above. 10.10 p.m. Further report: Same sounds as from moving trolley travelling underneath heard - 9.20, 9.30, 9.40, 9.55, 10.5. It is reported also that a change of shift took place at 10 p.m. Several men - about 6 going and 6 coming - were heard. One man declares that the trolley is drawn by a mule. I make the statements as they reached me and have no comments beyond by own personal observations during the time I listened myself. No Tunnellers with Listening Apparatus have yet reported. The enemny bombarded with Gas shells this area and the Wood opposite on the evenings of the 25/26th 26th/27th 28th /1st March. On the night 25th/25th the shelling commenced approximately at

2 a.m. and lasted until 4.15 am. With the exception of one sapper no one complained of the effects of of gas until some considerable time afterwards. Thesanax sapper was wax in his dugout when same was knocked down by a direct hit from a gas shell, this occuring during the first salvo or two into the Quarry. Shortly after the bombardment no trace of gas -in the vicinity-of the dugouts could be noticed, but at isolated points on the ridge East and North of the Quarry there was evidence of gas 24 hours later .

Box respirators were inspected as men left each day to go on shift,

and in every instance found to be O.K.

Gas helmet drill was last carried out on the 22/2/18.

The same precautions were taken on the evenings of 26th/27th,

28th/1st March.

The Camp was abandoned on the 28th owing to the danger of further

shelling and the gas hanging round this area.

Judging by the times that the men were effected by gas it would appear that with the exception of one sapper that the actual gassing took place some 18 to 24 hours after the bombardment either in the vicinity of the camp or whilst proceeding over the gas shelled xxxxx ridge East of the Quarry to their work.

During the moth of February 388 men attended sick parade, an average of about 14 men per day, suffering for the most part from the following complaints.

Layngitis. Bronchitis. Pyrexia. associated with the above. Skin Sores due to infection by the soil.

The reason for the prvalence of these affections is obvious.

Of these 388, 37 were sebt to the Field Ambulance, of whom about a dozen were unfit for further service, owing to accumulanted heart and lung conditions, due to long service underground. An attempt is being made however to minimise the number the number of men sent away by treating them in out commo Camp Hospital.

During February thirty one were so dealt with.

Infectious.disceases numbered fourteen, mostly scabies, and four or five of the Ubiquitous Veneral diseases accquired during leave.

In conclusion we desire to express our gratitude to the Australian Red Cross to whom we are indebted for dainties, and other invalid food.







The following is a list of rations and quantities per man received here daily with the exception of slight fluctuations which occasionally occur.

3 oz. per man with unsweetened milk. 22 oz. per man with sweetened milk.

5/8th oz. per man. Tead Bacon. 4 oz.

Milk. (sweetened). 15 men to a tin. Milk. (unsweetened). 12 men to a tin.

Jam. 3 oz. per man. Cheese. 20z. per man.

Fresh meat. (fluctuates almost daily) generally receive about 50% and the balance is made up with Preserved Meat.

Meat and Vegetable rations and Pork and Beans.

Fresh Vegetables. (fluctuates frequently) The full issue is alb per man. When a full issue is not available, receive

Dried Vegetables or Dried Fruit in lieu.

The Bread issue varies from time to time. The full issue is alb per man, but frequently only receive only 50% or 60%, and the balance is made up with Biscuits at the rate of 10 oz per man. Rice is issued almost daily at the rate of 2 oz per man.

Butter. 2 oz per man thrice weekly.

Pickles are received irregularly. The full issue is 1 oz per man thrice weekly.

Rum is drawn daily for each man at the rate of 1/64th gallon per man in advanced position.

Tobacco. 1 oz Per man weekly.

Cigarettes. 1 oz Per man weekly. Matches. 3bxs. per man fortnightly. 1 box one week and two the

next. Candles. drawn daily. Consumption about 130 lbs.

The undermentioned are items received when they are available.

Oatmeal and Flour. Also Condiments.

Extra Rations. Received daily. Trench Rations. 11b Tea. 61bs Sugar. Night Rations. 25 lbs Bread. 251bs Meat.
