



The Unit was administered by and worked under V11th Corps

until the 6th, when the Australainx Corps Took over.

In anticipation of the enemy continuing his offensive, both Corps rapidly pushed ahead with defensive work. Early in the month the Company was concentrated on the improvement, extension and wiring of an old French defence line. known as the BAISIEUX - RIBEMONT LINE. (See Attached plan Appendix A No. (XXXII)

On the 4th inst the question of demolition of bridges in AMIENS in case the enemy occupied that city, was discussed. The O.C. conferred with the Controller of Mines, and Chief Engineer Third Army and a preliminary reconnaissance was made. Work was started, but stopped after a few hours owing to objections raised by the French Authorities. These were overcome and on the 7th work recommenced and continued until all bridges were prepared for demolition. On the 22nd the control of these bridges passed to 3rd Corps and the work of guarding them was

handed over to 172nd Tunnelling Coy. R.E.

On the 11th the responsibility for the guarding and demolition of bridges at LA NEUVILLE and DAOURS was taken over by the Unit. The number controlled was gradually increased until eventually the Company had charge of all bridges in the Corps Area, over the Somme and Ancre. These bridges are marked on plan Appendix A No. (XXX11) and catalogued in orders included in Appendix No. (XV11). As will be seen from these orders, the system of control adotped was to divide these bridges into four groups, each under a responsible officer with detailed orders as to their demolition in case of an enemy attack and advance. Subalterns were stationed in central positions close to their bridges. Sentries were Posted over each bridge.

On the 12th the Australian Corps issued a scheme for the construction of defence lines. Major. E.N. MULLIGAN. D.S.O. was placeddin charge of the BAISIEUX - ANCRE Line (See diary for the 13th). Officers and men not employed on demolition who were working on Baisiuex -Ribemont Line were then transferred to this

line.

Four Labour Companies were also employed. On the 22nd the officers and men who had been employed in No. 3 Group (AMIENS) became available for other work owing to 172nd Tunnelling Coy. R.E. taking over. These men were then employed in constructing tunnelled Machine Gun Dougouts at various sites selected by an officer of "G" Staff. Australian Corps. E Company of 6th United States Engineers arrived in the area on the 29th and was attached to the Unit to assist in this dugout work by orders of the C.E. Austrailian Corps. Three tunnel dugouts were also commenced on the 29th.

WAR DIARY. No 2

APRIL 1918.

SUMMARY. (Continued).

In addition to the above, a report was compiled on the dugout and cellar accommodation in the Units sector. (See Appendix A No.XXV.) Strength. Casualties were fairly heavy during the month and were chiefly due to gas shelling, preliminary to the enemy attack on VILLERS - BRETTONEAUX.

Transport. The Horse Transport was augmented by the attachment of 4 extra G.S. Waggons, teams and drivers from the 46th Reserve Park.

The work of the Motor Transport was normal.

Throughout the period Lieut R.J.ROBIN . remained con attached to

Vih Corps as Roads Officer.

Lieut. G.A.COOK was also attached to the Aust. Corps Heavy Art. in connection with the scheme for the withdrawal of engineer Units in the case of an enemy attack. (See Appendix A No. X11).

1/4/18.

Work continuing on BAISIEUX - RIBEMONT LINE.
Unit administered by O.C. Corps Troops, Vilth Corps.
Australian Official Photographer visited Unit and took photos of men going up on shift (See Photograph Appendix A No. (XXX).
Quarter masters Dept. 31% Fresh Meat Brawn, the balance beingm made up with Pres. Meat. Full ration of Fresh Vegetables drawn and issued. 31% Bread drawn and 60% Biscuits.
Rum was drawn as usual for men working in advanced positions.
Weather fine.

2/4/18. Working on Baisieux - Ribemont Line. A plan is attached showing trenches and wiring. See Appendix A No. (XXXI). Lieut D. BRIGSTOCKE and detachment which had been working. ROCQUIGNY SAW MILL reported back to Unit after delivering the machinery to R.E. Depot ABBEVILLE.

Mr F.M.CUTLACK. Assitant War Correspondent to A.I.F. visited Unit to obtain information regarding the recent operations. Quarter masters Dept. Fresh Meat decreased to 20%, balance made up with Pres. Meat. and M & B. On this day we drew two days rations owing to the £6ompany being transferred to the Australian Corps. Weather Fine.

3/4/18. Work proceeding on Defence Line.

Quarter Masters Dept. (See report 2nd inst).

Weather fine.

O.C. conferred with the Controller of Mines at ABBEVILLE 4/4/18. re the demolition of bridges leading into AMIENS from the North side, and comprising approximately 9 steel and 4 brick bridges. A scheme was also discussed for the innundation of the north side of Amiens, by the damming of the SOMME. O.C. also interviewed C.E. 3rd Army regarding the demolition of the bridges. After receiving instructions to prepare them for demolition O.C. pointed out that they were all guarded by French sentries, and that unless the permission of the French had been obtained, these sentries would stop the work. Capt. A.F. COHEN and Lieut C.H.BLUMER with 30 O.Rs , tools and explosives were sent into AMIENS and started preparing the bridges at 4 p.m. (See Appendix A No. (X1). I n some places the work was stopped by french sentries. At 8.30 p.m. all work was stopped by instructions from 3rd ARMY. About 30 shells fell in the town close to H.Qrs (.QUERRIEU) Quarter Masters Dept. 41% Fresh Meat drawn, balance in Pres. meat. 50% Bread drawn. A full ration of all other items drawn No Rum drawn. Rained practically all day.

5/5/18. Work proceeding on Defence Line.

Quarter Masters Dept. 38% Fresh Meat balance Pres. Meat.

75% Fresh vegetables drawn and issued plus 15% from stock.

75% Bread drawn. Butter drawn and issued. No rum drawn.

Weather dull.

6/4/18.

AUSTRALIAN CORPS took over sector from Viith Corps.

C.R.E. Aust. Corps Troops, Lieut-Col E.J.H.NICHOLSON. D.S.O.

Nvisited H.Qrs to find what work the Company was doing and discuss fiture work.

Orders (See Appendix A No. (X1) received from C.E. Viith Corps to hold in readiness 3 Officers and 100 O.Rs for bridge demolitions in AMIENS. See Diaryfor 4th inst when this work was cancelled.

Work as usual on Baisleux - Ribemont.Line.

Quarter masters Dept. 40% Fresh Meat drawn, balance received in Pres. Meat and M & B. Full issue of vegetables 50% Bread and 50% biscuits. No rum drawn.

Weather fine.

7/4/18. III Army releived by 1Wth Army.
O.C. visited the bridges and locks in AMIENS with
Controller of Mines 1Vth Army.
Chief Engineer, Aust Corps ordered 3 officers and 100 O.Rs
who were standing by to proceed to AMIENS to prepare
bridges for demolition. (See Appendix A No. (X1).
Capt. A.F.COHEN, Lieut C.H.BLUMER and Lieut L.L.WRATHALL
with 100 men were accordingly sent off at noon, and work
was commenced during the safternoon. Officers and men
were billetted near the work, Boulevard du Jardin des Plantes.
AMIENS heavily shelled during the day and bombed at night.
QuarterrMasters Dept. 50% Fresh Meat drawn balance in
Pres. Meat and M & B. 60% Bread. No rum drawn.
Weather fine.

- 8/4/18. Lieut-Colonel LOGAN. R.A.M.C. Director of Medical Services for Tunnelling Coys visited the Company.

 C.R.E. Aust. Corps inspected work on Baisieux Ribemont Line.

 Quarter Master Dept. 50% Fresh Meat drawn balance in Pres.

 Quarter Master Dept. 50% Fresh Meat drawn balance in Pres.

 Meat. 60% Bread. Butterndrawnnand issued. Rum drawn for men working in advanced positions.

 Weather fine.
- 9/4/18. Heavy shelling in vicinity of billets in Amiens. One of the billets was struck killing one man and wounding two. Quarter masters Dept. 60% Fresh Meat drawn, balance in Pres. Meat and M & B. 72% Bread. Tobacco and Cigarettes drawn and issued, but no matches. Rum drawn as on the 8th. Weather fine.
- Aust. Corps decided on a definite plan of withdrawal of Engineer Working parties, should the enemy succeed in making an advance. These orders were communicated to the O.C. by the Chief Engineer and transmitted by him to 180 Coy. R.E. by the Chief Engineer and transmitted by him to 180 Coy. R.E. This Company and 180 Coy. R.E. each supplied an officer to live at Corps Heavy Artillery Headquarters at MONTIGMY. In the event of a withdrawal becoming nemessary this officer would be notified and would then warn all engineer units by motorcycles. The two officers would follow different routes but warm the same units. These verbal orders were confirmed in attached message. (See Appendix A No. (X11).

10/4/18.

Lieut G.A. Cook sent on this duty. (contd) In view of above all heavy stores that were not required for the moment were sent to PIERREGOT which the Chief Engineer had appointed as a rendezvous. The Company was then made extremely mobile. A report (See Appendix A No (X1) sent to the C.E. 1Vth Army regarding bridges being Prepared for demolition. Quarter Masters Dept. 81% Fresh Meat drawn, balance Pres. Meat. Full issue of Bread drawn and issued, butter and Rum drawn. Weather fine.

Instructions received from C.E. Aust. Corps. to take over the responsibility of guarding and demolishing all bridges 11/4/18. at LA NEUVILLE and DAOURS from 178th Tunnelling Coy. R.E. Which was emoving out (See Appendix A No X111). Capt. L de J. GRUT took over and 35 men were sent out and posted as sentries on the bridges. Some of the bridges were already prepared, but the majority were incomplete. Technical instructions regarding work on Defence Line received from C.R.E. Copps Troops (See Appendix A No. (X1V). Quarter masters Dept. 75% Fresh Meat drawn. Balance as Part 8. yesterday. Bried Fruits in lieu of jam. 84% Bread. Matches drawn 1 box per man. Weather fine.

The system of organisation of the Corps line changed. The line was divided into sectors, each under the control 12/4/18. of a responcible officer, who was to have certain labour at his disposal. C.R.E. C.T. to supervise the whole. Major E.N.MULLIGAN. D.S.O. O.C. 2nd Australian Tunnelling Coy. was given control of the BAISIEUX - ANCRE Line with the following labour. 2nd Australian Tunnelling Coy and 53rd Labour Group less one Company (leaving 4 companies) (See Appendix A No. (XIV. Part 1.) The Baisieux - Ancre Line runs roughly parallel to the Ancre from Bonnay to Ribemont , then towards Baisieux. (See Appendix A No. (XXXI) and (XXXII). Great difficulty in getting explosives and stores for demolition work. Bridges in vicinity of DAOURS and LA NEUVILLE, being prepared (See Appendix Map A No. (XXXII). Quarter masters Bept. 60% Fresh Meat drawn balance in Pres. Meat and M & B. 37% Bread. Weather fine.

Work started on Baisieux - Ancre Line hear Bonnay in lieu of Baisiuex - Ribemont line which is now fairly 13/4/18. complete. A total of 921 men employed on this work, from 53rd Labour Group and 289 sappers of the Coy. Quarter masters Dept. 64% Fresh Meat. 80% Bread. Butter drawn. Weather wet.

14/4/18.

D.S.O., A.D.C. G. O. C. A.I.F. visited the Company at work on the BATSIEUX - ANCRE Line.

Quarter masters Dept. 60% Fresh Meat balance Pres. Meat. 76% Bread, Butter and Pickles drawn.

15/4/18.

Aust. Corps took over the responsibility for the demolition of all bridges in AMIENS. Letter from C.E. Aust. Corps.
(See Appendix A No. (XV). In accordance with these orders Aust. Corps were supplied with a copy of Demolition Instructions No. 1 by Major. E.N.MUILIGAN. D.S.O. (See Appendix A No. (XV1). These instructions covered all bridges in the Corps area, and divided them into four groups, each under the control of a responsible officer.

Sentries are posted on all these bridges, and those not already prepared for demolition are rapidly being comple-

Quarter masters Dept. Only 2 oz Bacon per man drawm. the other two ozs made up with M & B. Other issues the same as yesterday, with exception of butter and pickles. Weather fine.

16/4/18.

Orders received for bridge "K" at La Motte to be taken over from 6th United States Engineers and added to No. 4 Group. (Capt. G.L.SMITH) See Appendix. (X111). On going to take the bridge over Capt. Smith found it in charge of 172nd Tunnelling Coy. See Appendix (X111). Report on Bridges at DAOURS see Appendix A No. (XX1). Work continued on Baisieux - Ancre Line under Capt. F.G. PHIPPARD.

Quarter masters Dept. The same percentage of Fresh Meat and Bread were drawn as the 15th. 2 ozs Bacon drawn instead of 4 ozs. Balance made up with M & B.

There was a shortage of cheese, our proportion being only 16 lbs. instead of 66lbs. Pork and beans drawn for the first time for some weeks. The issue average 3 men per tin.

17/4/18. Bridge "K" La Motte taken over from 172nd Tunnelling Coy.

Q.C. discussed bridge demolition question with C.R.E. 3rd

CE stated that he was allotting 100 men of 63rd Labour

Work continued on Baisieux - Ancre Line under Capt. F.G.

Meat. 76% Bread drawn. Veal loaf issued in lieu of cheese.

2 ozs bacon issued balance in M & B.

Weather wet.

18/4/18. 100 men of the 63rd Labour Group reported, 50 men were sent into AMIENS and attached to No. 3 Group. The remainder detailed for work on the Baisiuex - Ancre Line. Reports on bridges received from Group Commanders (See Appendix A No. (XX1). O.C. issued Appendix A to demolition instructions (See Appendicies A Nos. (XV1, XV11, & XX111). This gave the locations of all Group Commanders and their Subalterns. Work on the Baisiuex - Ancre Line continued under Capt. F.G. PHIPPARD. 68% Fresh Meat drawn Pres. Meat drawn making up balance. 80% Bread drawn. Butter drawn and issued. Veal loaf drawn in lieu of cheese M & B drawn an lieu of bacon. Salt was sent to each cookhouse. Weather wet.

19/4/18. New bridges reported complete at N 6 d 7.5., 0 5 c 5.5.

0 5 c 5.8. In accordance with C.E. instructions arrange ments made for their demolition. (See Appendix A No. (XIII). Summary of Company's work sent to Controller of Mines, 17th Afmy (See Appendix A No. (XIII) Part 3.

In view of the fact that mining work is likely to be started early and allottment of 50% of sets received at QUERRIEU dump given by C.E.

Quarter masters Dept. 68% Fresh Meat drawn, Pres Meat drawn making up balance. 87% Bread drawn. Butter drawn and issued Yeal loaf drawn and issued in lieu of cheese. Full issue of bacoh drawn. Mustard sent to all cookhouses. Rum drawn as usual for men working in advanced positions.

Weather dry and bright.

20/4/18. C.E. Aust. Corps. ordered all bridges to be provided with a notice board carrying the serial No.

Bridges Nos 11, 12, 13 and 14 taken off list as they will remain in 3rd Corps area owing to a slight readjustment of the Corps boundary.

Arrangements made to hand over all bridges in No. 3 Group, AMIENS over to 172nd Tunnelling Coy. R.E. thus releasing one section for dugout work.

Supply of dynamo exploders for firing bridge charges received.

Working on the Baisieux - Ancre Line under Capt. F.G.PHIPPARD. Quarter masters Rept. 63% Fresh Meat drawn M & B and Pres.

Meat making up balance. Same per cent of bread as yesterday

WX 21/4/18.

The work of placing notice boards on the Baisieux - Ribemont line begun.

Working on the Baisieux - Ancre Line under Capt. PHIPPARD.

Allottment of mining timber altered by C.E.: 180th Tunnerling Coy. R.E. to have all sets and this unit all Beech slabs. (See Appendix A No. (X111) Part 2.

Company Headquarters moved from No. 3 Marconi Street to No. 3 Lombard Street, Querrieu -- a distance of about 100000 Quarter Masters Dept. 60% Fresh Meat drawn, Pres meat making up the balance. 76% Bread drawn. Butter drawn and issued. Full issue of cheese and bacon drawn.

Rum authority cancelled.

Weather fine.

22/4/18.

O. C. met O.C. 172nd Tunnelling Co. R.E. in AMIENS and handed over all bridges prepared for demolition. (See Appendix A Mo. (X1). Officers and other ranks who had been doing this work returned to Headquarters.

Since the Unit was at Ytres "A" Section 179th Tunnelling Coy under Capt. G.G.SALE. R.E. has been attached. Orders (See Appendix A No. (X1X) now received for them to move to SIBIVILLE for work under 3rd Army.

Capt. A.F.CHOEN visited sites for proposed Machine Gun Dugouts with Major. R.G.CASEY. DS.O.M.C.("G" staff. Aust Corps.)

Quarter masters Dept. 57% Fresh Meat drawn, balance in M & B. 72% Bread drawn. Other issues similar to yesterday. Weather fine.

23/4/18. "A" Section 179th Tunnelling Coy. R.E. moved off at 8 a.m. for SIBIVILLE.

Working on Baixiuex M Ancre Line under Capt. F.G. PHIPPARD.

Quarter masters Dept. All rations drawn same as yesterday.

Weather fine.

24/4/18. Enemy attacked and took VILLERS-BRETTONEAUX. Heavy shelling and gas shelling of BONNAY, CORBIE ETC., causing a number of Casualties in the Coy.

Quarter masters Dept. 60% Fresh Meat drawn, balance Pres Meat. 76% Bread drawn. Butter drawn and issued. Full issue of all other rations.

Weather fine.

25/4/18. C.R.E. Aust. Corps Troops visited work on Baisieux - Ancre Line.

Weekly report (See Appendix A No. (XLLL) Part 3. submitted to Controller of Mines 4th Army.

Arrangments made for Capt. A.F. COHEN to start work on Machine Gun Positions and Dugouts at sites already located.

Quarter Masters Dept. 57% Fresh Meat drawn, balance in Pres Meat. 70% Bread drawn. Bried Fruit drawn in lieu of Jam and issued. Jam was issued from stock also.

Weather fine and bright.

WAR 26/4/18 TUNNELLING GOY

Work started by No. 4 Section (Capt. A.F. COHEN). on Machine Gun Dugouts. in Corps line. (See Appendix A No. XXIV copies of correspondence. A forward camp stærted in Date connection with this work on the fringe of Boid d'Escardonneuse.

Quarter masters Dept. 63% Fresh Meat drawn M & B and Pres Meat making up balance. 73% Bread drawn. Pickles were drawn but not enough to issue. 2 oz Bacon drawn. M & B drawn in lieu of other 2 ozs. Weather fine.

27/4/18.

Controller of Mines 4th Army visited Headquarters. Arrangments made to draw supplies of mining timber from Poulainville R.E. Dump. 114th Labour Coy. detailed for work under this unit. arrived in Corps area and reported for orders and Accomodation. Camped in tents on fringe of Bois d'Escardonneuse. at I 15 a 3.6. Shifts detailed as fatigues to tunnellers making machine gun dugouts. Balance of Company detailed for work on Baisieux - Ancre Line under Capt. F.G. PHIPPARD. Quarter masters Dept. 60% Fresh Meat drawn Pres. Meat making up the balance. 76% Bread drawn. Butter drawn and issued. Half issue of bacon M & B in lieu of other half. Weather fine and bright.

28/4/18.

Lieut Wolaben of the United States Engineers reported with 2 N.C.Os from E Company, 6th United States Engineers. To be attached for instructions in tunnelling. Detailed to No. 4 Section. C.E. Aust. Corps. asked for proposals regarding dugouts (See Appendix A No. (XXII). Quarter masters Dept. 60% Fresh Meat drawn, balance Pres Meat and M & B. Bread same as testerday. Tobacco and matches drawn. Rice drawn but not sufficient to issue. Condiments sent to No. 4 section. Weather wet.

29/4/18.

"E" Coy 6th U.S. Engineers arrived and went into billets at FRANVILLERS. Attached to No. 4 Section. (Machine Gun Dagout work) See Appendix A No. (V). Plan. No. (XXVII). Tunnel dugouts for Observation Posts commenced at Following points under Lieut. C.H.BLUMER. :-J 30 e 2.2. J 24 d 3.3. J 20 a 5.6. See Appendix A No. (V). Plan. No. (XXV111). Owing to these positions being under direct enemy observation they could only be worked at night. Quarter Masters Dept. 56% Fresh Meat drawn, balance in Pres Meat. 74% Bread drawn. Butter drawn and issued. Weather wet.

30/4/18.

C.E. ordered a complete survey to be made of all existing dugouts, caves and tunnells (See appendix A No. (XXV). Capt. F.G. PHIPPARD and Lieut. E.M. TOOTH detailed to report on all known shelters of this nature in this area. Quarter masters dept. 58% Fresh Meat drawn, balance in Pres Meat and M & B. 74% Bread drawn. 181bs Candles drawn. 2 days rations were drawn for men on demolition work. Weather wet. Rum drawn and issued.

During the month 681 men attended Sick Parade with Influenza septic throats, reheumatism and diarrhea; a number greater than usual due no doubt to the contributed effect of fatigue.

Thirty one were sent back thro' the Field Ambulances, with Hernia, Appendicites, chronic Rheumatism and bronche-Pneumonia.

Ten lost their lives; 6 from shell fire and 4 from gas.

Six gassed men and 5 wounded were evacuated.




PHOTOGRAPH of Section going up on Wiring on DEFENCE LINE --ARR----



CIRCUMSTANCES OF CAPTURE.

(a) Date. July 10th. 1917.

(b) Place. Nieuport.

(c) What happened before capture.

We Australian Tunnellers arrived in the Nieuport Sector for from the Ypres Sector about June 2pth 1917. We were put to making saps in the front line and building dugouts behind. There were three shifts of us employed - about 30 men to a shift. With others I was captured during the course of a German counter-attack on July 10. It was about 7 o'clock in the evening when the Germans actually came over. There was a canal behind us crossed by pontoon-bridges. It was that part of the canal just near its entrance to the sea. Before they came overb to us the Germans had already shelled and destroyed these pontoon-bridges. The Germans who took us prisoners came across from in front of us, though I afterwards learned that there were Germans behind us when we were taken. We were all armed, each carry in rifle and bayonet and 80 rounds of ammunition. There had been a heavy enemy barrage in front of us. It lifted, and when we came out of the sap to see what was doing we found ourselves confronted by a body of German soldiers. They immediately opened on us with handgrenades; I was not hurt, nor do I know any of our chaps that were hurt by these first bombs. I opened fire on the enemy with my rifle; we had no bombs. The Germans replied with hand-grenades. One bomb burst on my thigh, severely shattering it. I was badly wounded in ix abdomen, my left ankle stopped a machine gun bullet, I was struck in the left arm by a revolver bullet, though the latter was not a wound of any consequence. Anyhow my "issue" was a pretty substantial poultice". They had bropped me pretty heavy and I was completely out of action. The land was an area of sandyn hillocks and I crawled into one of the hollows. I lay there till after-dark- about three hours, when some Germans came along and I was a prisoner.

What happened immediately after Capture.

The Germans placed me on a ground sheet and carried me back into the sap. They fixed up my wounds as hext well as they could with the "first field dressing" that I carried on me. The Germans who had captured me appeared to be a machine gun section of Marines. I think all our chaps that were across the canal must have been captured our Red Cross advanced position across the canal at any rate fell into German hands. I was carried to a place not far behind the enemy lines called Middlekirke.

From Middlekirke I was conveyed by Motor-transport to Ostend.

I remained there only one night, going on next day by ambulance.

Was kept in Bruges for three months atthe was kept in Bruges for three months atthe "No. 1 Marine Hospital". At ant rate that was the marking on the blank X -ets, etc.,

The medical treatment at this hospital I can describe as "fair". The German Sisters treated us all right and the German doctors, too "gave us a fair spin". For six weeks I had a heavy weight hung on my wounded leg; at the end of that time the limb was put in plaster of Paris, They kept the strain on my leg until the plaster was taken off.

The food, however, at Bruges, was very poor. For the most part we were fed upon brown bread and a poor sort of "soup". Now and again we had a little jam.

From Bruges I was taken to a lazarette at Hamburg. There were never at any time while I was there more than four Australians in that lazarette. Among those whose names I can remember were Privates that lazarette. Among those whose names I can remember were Privates Hammell and Collett. These were both 4th Division men and from time to time they used to come and see me. I was a bed patient.

I remained at Hamburg till January 4th 1918. Then I was removed to a big prisoners camp at Gustrow. I only remained at that camp for three days. Apparently I had been taken there to be examined with a view to being exchanged. I passed the doctors there and was taken back to Hamburg. Thence I came to the frontier town of Aachen where I remained for three days and underwent another examination by German doctors.

From Aachen, with other returning Australian Prisoners of War, I crossed Holland to the port of Rotterdam. The Dutch people extended a spendid welcome, the Dutch sisters and nurses in particular, endeavouring to assist us in every way. At Rotterdam I embarked for England reaching Boston on January 20.

At Gustrow Camp there is an unwounded Australian sergeant working in the Post Office. I received no Red Cross parcels while I was a prisoner. You see Im spent so great a part of my time in Bruges in Belgium and from Bruges, prisoners are not permitted to write letters carrying any address. In any case an Australian Prisoner of War is very lucky if he receives his first Australian Red Cross parcel inside three months.

In Bruges the hospital appears to have been at one time a convent. In this institution the scrubbing of the corridors was done by Belgian women, but I cannot say whether they were paid for their work or not. At Hamburg the medical attention was very poor; there was only one old civilian doctor. The bandages used were of paper. These bandages were alright unless applied to a running wound, in which case they soon become soppy.

At Bruges I saw Walter Young of my Company. He left Bruges seven weeks before me to go to Gustrow, but I found out there afterwards that he had been sent back to Belgium to work.

At first the Germans seemed greatly surprised to learn that I was an Australian. They cannot understand Australians taking part in the War. They do not understand our having volunteered and have not much time for us on that account. They can understand and they prefer- conscripts.
