

Location for month -----FRIVILLE-ESCARBOTIN.

#### SUMMARY.

ESCARBOTIN. On the 1st word was received from the C.R.E., Corps Troops Australian Corps that a recreation but was to be sent and erected for the benifet of this Company and the 1st Army Troops Coy. A.E. who were billeted in ESCARBOTIN. Arrangements were made for the Army Troops Coy. to erect the but.

Sports of all kinds were indulged in, the Football Competition being that of most general interest. This Competition was completed just before the Company left the rest area and resulted in a win for No.2 Section, No.3 Section being runners-ip.

Arrangements were made for the men of the Company to visit EU by motor lorries to attand concerts given by the Anzac Coves there. These were greatly enjoyed by the men.

On the 11th, the news of the signing of the Armistice was received

and caused great rejoicing among the troops and the civilians.

on the 20th instructions regarding a "Move to the Rhine" were received from 5th Australian Division to which the Unit was attached for this move. After the preliminary general instructions, the times of trains and stations of Entraining and Detraining were communicated. These showed the Company to be leaving PONT REMY on No.22 Train at 0.55 hours on 29/11/1918.

Owing to delays, this train did not leave until 14.30 hours on

30/11/1918.

The Company marched out from FRIVILLE\_ESCARBOTIN at 09.00 hrs on 28/11/18 and marched to ST MAXENT where Headquarters, Nos.1,2, and 3 Sections occupied Billets for the night, No.4 Section occupied Billets at WACHEVILLE close to ST MAXENT. On the morning of the 29th the Company marched out from ST MAXENT and WACHEVILLE and arrived at ERONDELLE and occupied billets there until such time as the train on which the Company were to travel arrived. At 4.30hours the Company vacated the Billets at ERONDELLE and marched to PONT REMY and eventually entrained at 14.30 hours, for BERTRY.
