



A Company reserve of 56,000 S.S.A. and 1,100 grenades issued during the day were carried foward and formed in to dumps on arrival. A Bn. reserve of 44,000.S.A.A., myi 768 grenades 150 Very Lights was sent forward to Bn. Headquarters at 8.45.p.m. and established at U.21.c.44.48. Road and surrounding country a scene of great activity with our artillery and infantry moving in and the FRENCH moving out. Though clougy the night was not exceedingly dark, and notwithstanding the intermittant shelling and bombing by the enemy, the relief progressed very favourably, no hitches occuring. There were no casualties. The FRENCH left one Officer and one N.C.O with each Coy. and one officer with Bn.Headquarters until the evening of the second. An interpreter was attached to Bn. Report received from Headquarters that the enemy was supposed to be evacuating his front line. Instructions were issued to patrol vigorously to ascertain his intention. Patrol reported no sign of evacuation.
