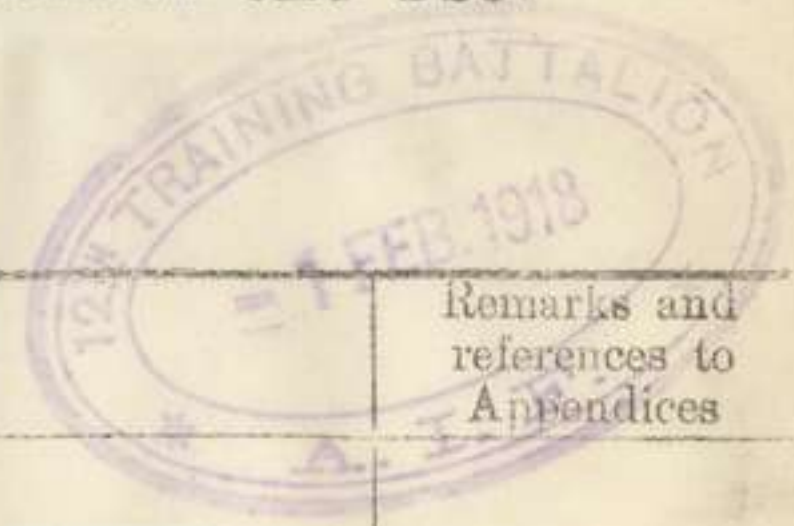

CIRCULAR MEMORANDUM.

12th TRAINING BATTALION, A.I.F., CODFORD;  
THURSDAY, January 17, 1918.

CHEVRONS FOR SERVICE OVERSEAS. The following Army Order, dated 20th December 1917, is published for information.

1. His Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to improve the award of Chevrons to denote service Overseas undertaken since 4th August, 1914.
2. The following will be eligible to participate in the award under the conditions hereinafter laid down:-
  - Officers and soldiers of the Regular Army, Special Reserve and Territorial Force, and Officers, Naval Ratings and Royal Marines of the Royal Naval Division;
  - Officers, soldiers and followers of the Indian Army and Indian Army Reserve;
  - Officers and soldiers of Overseas Forces;
  - Native troops in East and West Africa;
  - Members of Queen Alexandra's Imperial Nursing Service, retired members of the Army Nursing Service, members of Queen Alexandra's Military Nursing Service for Mysore India, and Overseas Nursing Services;
  - Members of the Women's Army Auxiliary Corps.
  - Civilians attached to British Forces in an official capacity.
  - Native Labour Corps.
  - Chinese Labour Corps.
  - Members of officially recognised Voluntary Aid Detachments;
  - Personnel working under the Joint War Committee of the British Red Cross Society and the Order of St. John of Jerusalem and under St. Andrew's Ambulance Association, if under direct authority and supervision of the War Officer;
  - Personnel of the Women's Legion employed under War Office authority.
3. The date of the award of the first chevron will be the date the individual left the United Kingdom in the case of those who proceeded from home; and the fifth of August, 1914 in the case of those serving abroad on that date. In the case of overseas troops the date of leaving their own country, or where employed on local operations, the date of crossing the frontier or that on which they commenced to take part in active operations. Additional chevrons will be awarded for each successive aggregate period of twelve months' service outside the United Kingdom; in the case of overseas troops, away from their own country or within a sphere of active operations.
4. The qualifying service for additional chevrons need not be continuous. It will include periods of leave up to one month where the individual returns overseas at the conclusion of such leave. Periods of absence without leave in prison or detention, in hospital from sickness due to unavoidable reasons, or in captivity as prisoners of war, will be excluded when calculating the 12 months required to qualify for an additional chevron.
5. Draft conducting Officers and Officers and others sent overseas on duty of a temporary nature but who are not appointed for duty on the establishment of a unit serving overseas and who return to this country on completion of this temporary duty, are not eligible for the award of these chevrons by virtue of their temporary service outside the United Kingdom.
6. Chevrons of two colours - RED AND BLUE - have been approved. The first chevron, if earned on or before 31st December, 1914, will be red; if earned on or after the 1st January, 1915, it will be blue; and all additional chevrons after the first will be blue.



7. The chevron will be of worsted embroidery,  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch in width, the arms  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches long. They will be worn inverted on the right forearm; in the case of Officers, the apex of the lowest chevron will be 1 inch above the upper point of the flap on the cuff; with Highland jackets, the point of the lowest chevron will be midway between the the seams of the sleeves and two inches above the upper row of lace; and with jackets with plain cuffs, immediately above the point of the cuff. In the case of Warrant Officers, non-commissioned Officers and men, the apex of lowest chevron will be mid-way between the seams and 4 inches above bottom edge of sleeve. The red chevron will be worn below the blue one. They will not be worn on great-coats.
8. Chevrons will be supplied to the Units by the Army Ordinance Dept. on indent from Commanding Officers.
9. Commanding Officers will be responsible for the issue of Chevrons to individuals. In Units serving in the Field rolls of Officers, Warrant Officers, non-commissioned Officers and men, showing the number and description of chevron claimed by each, will be prepared and submitted to Base Record Office for verification, reference being made to Record Offices at home if necessary. At home and at stations abroad similar rolls will be prepared and forwarded to Record Offices for scrutiny. After check, the rolls will be returned to Unit for retention and an entry made in each man's Pay-book, showing the chevrons to which he is entitled at the date the entry is made. Further entries will be made as the man becomes entitled for additional chevrons.
10. To prevent delay, consequent on the checking of the rolls, chevrons will be issued from Unit stores to squadrons and companies on the certificate of the squadron or Company Commander to the effect that to the best of his ability the men are entitled to the chevrons shown on the Company Indent. In preparing this indent, squadron and Company Commanders will obtain the required information, as far as possible from Paybooks, which shows whether the man was paid at home or Overseas. On the receipt of the check rolls referred to in para 9., any erroneous issue or irregular wearing of chevrons will be rectified. It should be noted that the wilful irregular wearing of chevrons is an offence punishable by Court Martial.
11. The responsibility for the correctness of the award in the case of individuals, under para 2 of this order are eligible for chevrons, but who are not directly in Military employ or pay from Army funds, will rest with the head of the Department or Organisations to the effect that the bearer, stating name and employment, is entitled to the chevrons, should always be in possession of the wearer.
12. The chevrons may be worn on plain clothes by retired Officers, Ex-Officers, pensioners, Ex-soldiers, and others who would, had they remained in the service or continued in any of the employment detailed in para 2, have been entitled to wear them on uniform clothing, should they wish to do so, but no issue will be made from Government Stores. It is an offence under the Defence of the Realm regulations for any unauthorised person to wear a chevron or chevrons, and it should be noted that under reg. 41 sub-para "C", it is an offence for anyone to supply, without lawful authority or excuse to supply one of these chevrons to an authorised person.
13. The chevrons are a distinction to be worn on uniforms to denote service overseas since the declaration of war, and are not to be regarded as being in the nature of a reward. They will therefore be no posthumous award to deceased soldiers or Officers.
14. Applications and correspondence from Serving Officers and soldiers in regard to chevrons are not to be addressed direct to the War Office. All applications will in the first instance be dealt with by Commanding Officers.
15. Indents for chevrons may be submitted and supply will be made when stocks are available.

GOOD CONDUCT LEAVE.

Rolls must be submitted in duplicate to B.O.R. by 10 a.m. on the Saturday of each week. In submitting the weekly lists of men for Leave, Company Commanders will show the weeks of Training the men are in. Any man in the 14th. week of Training will not be granted any Leave whatever, except under very exceptional circumstances. O/C, Signallers will state whether 1st. Class Signaller or otherwise. The addresses of men whilst on leave will also be shown on the rolls.

It must be made clear that extensions of Leave will not be granted. The sending of wires is a waste of time and money for they will not be replied to, and the sender crined for disobedience of orders on his return. When rolls have once been submitted, men must be informed that it is not possible to change their destinations as arrangements for Train accomidation have to be made with the R.T.O. Company Commanders should direct attention to the Instructions appearing on the back of the Passes issued. and attention is drawn to Headquarters Special Order No 1912 of 24.9.17, re Good Conduct Leave.

WEEK-END LEAVE.

Leave will not be granted to Officers or O/Ranks where Railway journeys on Saturdays, Sundays, or Mondays, is involved. Railway journeys entailing such travelling should not be recommended by Company Commanders.

All applications for Saturday or Sunday afternoon Leave will be handed in to Company Orderly Rooms, and then submitted to B.O.R. not later than Thursday, at noon, of each week. NOTES ON ADJUTANT AND ORDERLY OFFICERS INSPECTING & DISMOUNTING GUARDS.INSPECTION OF A GUARD.

After the R.S.M. hands over all duties, reporting Duties present and correct or otherwise, the Adjutant and Orderly Officer will instruct the R.S.M. to stand the Guard at ease.

The Adjutant or Orderly Officer will inspect the Band, after instructing the R.S.M. for the Band to form up. The R.S.M. then calls all duties to attention, "Guard, Slope Arms". The Guard is then inspected at the Slope Arms by the Adjutant or Orderly Officer, starting from the Sergeant of the Guard, and finishing up in rear of No 1 of the rear rank.

If the arms are to be inspected the Adjutant or Orderly Officer will give "Order Arms". Unfix Bayonets. "For inspection, Port Arms" Inspection will start from the Sergeant in the front rank and from the Corporal in the rear rank, finishing up with the left hand man in the rear rank.

The best dressed man of the Guard is selected and falls out on the right flank, and is dismissed by the Guard Instructor. The Adjutant or Orderly Officer calls the Guard to attention, "Close Order March" "Rear Rank Right Dress (after being dressed by the Guard Instructor, who will give "Eyes Front"), "Guard, Fix Bayonets". Number. Slope Arms. Advance in Column of Fours from the left or right. Form Fours. Left or Right. Right or Left Wheel, Quick March. The Orderly Officer accompanies the Guard and superintends the changing over of Guards, and taking over.

DISMISSING.

A Guard is dismissed on it's own Regimental Parade Ground (where it is mounted) by the Orderly Officer. The Guard is prepared for inspection by the Guard Instructor, the same as mounting, being inspected at the Slope. "Order Arms", "Unfix Bayonets", Arms Inspected "Close Order, March" "Rear Rank, Right Dress" (being dressed by the Guard Instructor). "Slope Arms" "Guard Dismiss".

The Orderly Officer before starting to inspect the Guard will ask the Sergeant of the Guard for his report and if anything to report.

The Guard report will be handed in to the Adjutant.

TURNING OUT THE GUARD.

The Captain or Subaltern of the Day will not turn out the Guard at the following times.

Within one hour of the Guard being turned out by either the Captain or Subaltern.

During the hour following the sounding of the dimm's bugle.

Within one hour of Retreat, Last Post, or Reveille.

When he turns out the Guard, the Captain or Subaltern of the day will carefully inspect the Guard, and Guard Room, as well as visiting the Sentries.

When the Guard turns out the Inspecting Officer will carefully note that ranks are dressed and the rear rank at it's proper distance.

When the Guard is ready for the Captain or Subaltern, of the day, the Sergeant of the Guard will take one pace forward, salute, and report the Guard being present or otherwise, then accompany the officer around the Guard, the Guard remaining at the Slope the whole time.

After the Guard has been inspected the Officer will instruct the Sergeant to turn in the Guard.

The Sergeant will then give the command "Close Order, March". "Rear Rank, Right Dress", giving the command, "Rear Rank, Eyes Front".

The Sergeant of the Guard will then give the Command "Guard, Dismiss" The Orderly Officer will visit all N.C.O's and men confined in the Guard Room, reporting to the Adjutant, any information concerning prisoners etc, or anything that may be unusual.

- (9). HIS DRESS ON GUARD MOUNTING WILL BE THE SAME AS THE ADJUTANT'S.
- (10). HE WILL SEE ALL LIGHTS OUT IN CAMP AND REPORT TO THE ADJUTANT WHEN THIS IS DONE.
- (11). HE WILL REPORT ANY UNUSUAL OCCURRENCE TO THE ADJUTANT IMMEDIATELY.
- (12). HE WILL ATTEND TATTOO ROLL-CALL AT B.O.R.
