

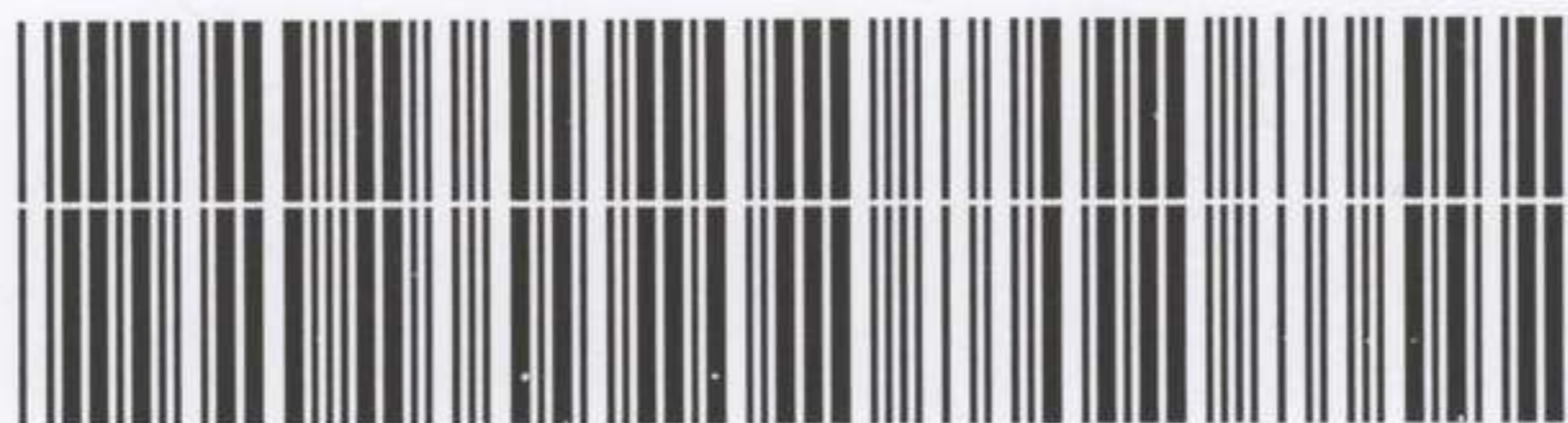

R E P O R T O N H E A L T H O F C A M P.

The general Sanitation of this Camp is now in a satisfactory condition; the drainage of the place is only fair, the grading having been badly carried out in the first place - this has lately been remedied to a large extent.

The general conditions in Huts, Cookhouses, Canteens, Latrines and in Isolation Areas are very good and much improved in the last five or six weeks

The health of the men is fair and the outlook for the Winter is so far a hopeful one.

The Number of contacts is once again becoming low.

It is satisfactory to note that no C.S.F. has occurred yet and if the necessary ventilation of huts is carried out day and night, we may hope to have little or none.

There has been one case of German Measles and one of English Measles, the latter probably acquired outside this camp.

During the last five or six weeks the percentage of Mumps patients has considerably decreased and conditions are at present on a satisfactory basis.

There have been a large number of Unfit boarded these last few weeks; so far for the present we may hope for a fair amount of Physical Efficiency in this Unit.

INTELLIGENCE SUMMARY FOR NOVEMBER 1917.A P P E N D I X " E "R E P O R T O N T R A I N I N G .

- P.T.& B.F. The Instruction given was good and marked improvement was apparent in the Bayonet Fighting. The Bayonet Fighting Course was improved and in the advanced weeks of training exercises embodying the use of Bullet and Bayonet were carried out.
- ANTI-GAS. Considerable attention was paid to this branch of training and various movements were carried out while the Box Respirators or P.H. Helmets were worn.
- BOMBING. This training embodied the Standard Tests and Trench storming. The men were keen and took intelligent interest in the Trench tactics.  
A useful Rifle Grenade Course was completed embodying disappearing targets at various ranges worked from a control post. By this means men were taught rapid observation and quickly acquired correct elevation for the different ranges.
- WIRING. Drill No. 4 S.S.177 was taught, but this work is somewhat hampered for want of Instructors and the inability to obtain same owing to lack of Schools.
- LEWIS GUN. The men take a very keen interest in this weapon and many of them spend much of their spare time in ~~mental~~ instruction. Upwards of 90% of the men in this Battalion over 10th week of training have gone through the Lewis Gun Course and fired short course in accordance with A.C.I.
- THE THIRD STAGES OF TRAINING have been taught Advanced work, Artillery and Attack formations. It is found that Reinforcement Officers cannot be posted to a Command. in this stage owing to their lack of knowledge although they have completed 6 weeks School.
- DRILL. Difficulty is experienced in Instructors in this subject in ~~the~~ the Training Battalion and the Battalion loses and does not ~~gain~~ gain benefit by sending Officers and N.C.O's to Candahar. The knowledge gained, from results, appears to be purely theoretical and Students upon returning to the Training Battalion cannot apply same on the training ground.
- TACTICAL SCHEMES. Simple tactical schemes were carried out, the primary object being to teach the co-ordination of all arms, the elasticity of the platoon and to impress upon every man that he is essentially a rifleman until such time as he can use his subsidiary weapons. Care has been taken to leave platoons intact when once organised and in this way training has proved of considerable value.
- MUSKETRY. It has been impressed upon all Instructors that talk must be eliminated as much as possible and demonstration substituted. Much trouble has been taken in teaching the correct method of assuming the prone position and rising from the ground; it is found that men are apt to forget these lessons when doing attack practices and the importance of watching their point and checking faults has been impressed upon Drill Instructors.
- FIELD FIRING PRACTICE by one platoon was carried out on 23rd November on the Codford Field Firing Course and was creditably performed. Covering Rifle fire was fairly good and the Lewis Gun and Rifle Grenade co-operation was excellent.
- DISCIPLINE. This has greatly improved. Uniformity of Dress, correct method of moving off and on to the roads, covering from front to rear and dressing of sections of fours is insisted on. It has been impressed upon the men

that to fall out on line of march is a disgrace and during the month there was not a single instance of a man falling out.

Disciplinary action is taken against any man who falls out on line of march.

NIGHT OPERATIONS.

Owing to the unsettled state of weather Lectures two nights per week have been given when work to be performed on succeeding days has been explained.

All Officers attended these lectures.

DRAFTS.

During the month 36 Other Ranks proceeded Overseas.

They were quite up to standard as regards physique and Training.

Camp Routine is strictly observed.




