

P.T.& B.F.--- Owing to the inclement weather work upon numerous occasions was carried on under cover. Preparation had been made for this beforehand so that the training did not deteriorate. A special indoor course for B.F. was largely used.

ANTI-GAS.--- Men in advanced weeks of training wore the B.R. 10 minutes daily under the supervision of the Gas Officer and Gas N.C.Os, whilst still carrying on the work upon which they were engaged, e.g. Wiring, Drill, Bayonet Fighting and Bombing. Two lectures were given at night.

Eleven Officers and 541 Other Ranks were passed through Gas, and 900 all ranks received instruction in Anti-Gas measures during the month. A Gas-proof Dugout was constructed for use by this Battalion.

WIRING.----- Drill No.4 S.S.177 was taught. In wet weather instruction was carried on under cover by means of Miniature pickets, made by one of the Instructors, and thin wire; also with boards and string.

BOMBING.----- Standard Tests were carried out. A range was built and used for live Bombing practices for both hand and rifle grenades.

LEWIS GUN.--- 147 men went through a course of Lewis Gun instruction, and fired short course in accordance with A.C.I. The standard of numbers trained in Lewis Gun required by H.Q. is 50% of the personnel composing drafts; the above number, therefore, is well in excess of requirements.

DRILL.----- Improvement was made in this section of training. It was impressed upon instructors that the correction of faults as they occurred was essential, and that the glossing over of slovenly movements must not occur. The correct marching of all Squads and small parties, upon whatever work they were engaged was insisted upon. Close supervision of the N.C.Os. has resulted in much better work throughout.

TACTICAL EXERCISES.--- Exercises illustrating the co-operation of all arms were carried out. During the month four platoons were practised over the Field Firing Course, first with blank and next with ball S.A.A. Full use of Reinforcement Officers was made in these exercises.

The following points were exercised:-

- (1) Reconnaissance by Platoon Commander.
- (2) Correct Artillery Formations.
- (3) Rapid Deployments.
- (4) Signals between Section Commanders.
- (5) Loud Fire Orders.
- (6) Scout for Lewis Gun.
- (7) Keeping Rifle Clean.
- (8) Re-organisation, consolidation & forward protection.

MUSKETRY.--- The following training was carried out:-

- (1) Miniature Range.
 - (a) Concentration and Distribution of fire on sand targets.
 - (b) Miniature range Competitions.
- (2) Advanced Training combining Fire Discipline and control.

- (3) General Musketry Course on Rifle Range.
(4) Field Firing Practices.

The Good shooting and the clean condition of the rifles after a F.F. exercise, even in muddy weather, testified to the excellence of the instruction given.

MARCH DISCIPLINE.---The standard of discipline has been maintained.

NIGHT OPERATIONS.---Lectures have taken the place of actual operations, with the exception of a trench relief carried out on 27th December at the Field Firing Course.

DRAFTS.----- During the month 249 Other Ranks marched out for Overseas. They were both physically, and from point of view of training, quite equal to recent reinforcements sent Overseas.
