

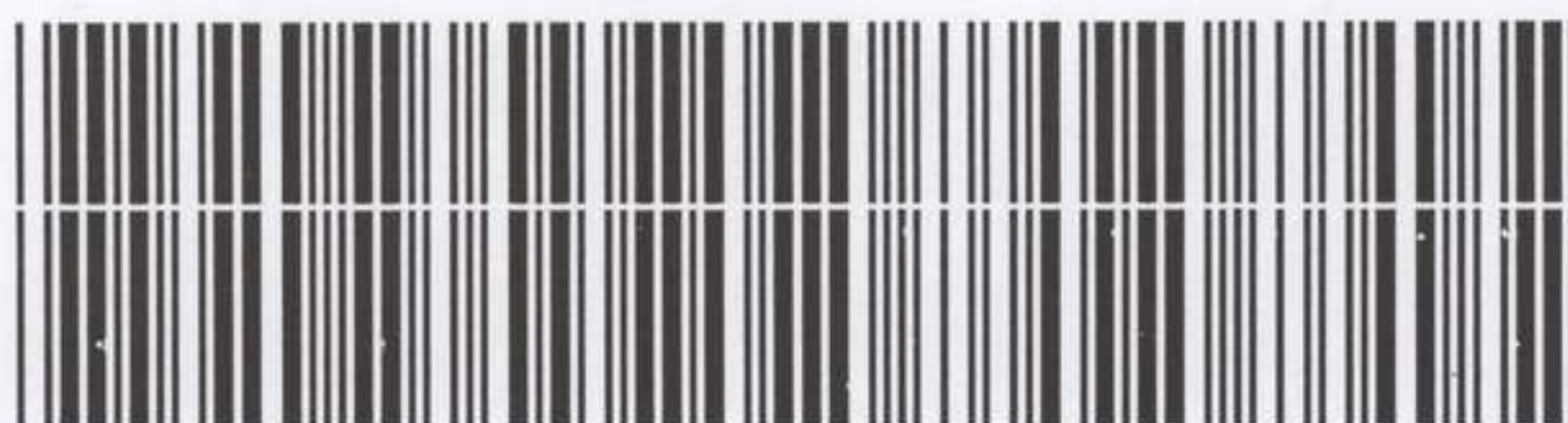



Appendix G.

JANUARY 1918.

P. T. & B. F. The Training in this Branch has continued as heretofore, and it appears to be quite up to the standard. Every man on parade has two hours daily in these subjects.

ANTI-GAS. Is carried out as per syllabus and a thorough instruction in these measures is imparted.

WIRING. This branch of Training is very thoroughly taught in this Battalion, a particularly efficient staff being available as instructors.

BOMBING. Standard tests were carried out, and live bombs both thrown and fired.

L.M. GUN. 218 men went through a course of L.M.Gun, instructors being borrowed from 15th T.Battn., in order that larger classes might be handled. Owing to these arrangements it was possible to impart a thorough instruction to the large number of men quoted above.

DRILL. Much improvement is noted in this training, and the discipline of the Battalion is quite up to the standard.

TACTICAL EXERCISES. Exercises illustrating the co-operation of all arms were carried out, both in S.S.143 and impromptu stunts, first with blank and then with ball, Reinforcement Officers being used for Section Commanders.

MUSKETRY. The following training was carried out:-

(1) Miniature Range.

Concentration and distribution of fire on sand targets.

Miniature Range Competitions.

(2) Advanced training combining fire discipline and Control.

(3) Firing from hip with blank.

(4) 30 Yards range.

(5) Field Firing Practice.

Great attention is paid to care of Arms, and the standard of training in this respect is quite good.

MARCH DISCIPLINE. Is quite up to the standard of Field Battalions in France.

NIGHT OPERATIONS. When weather permits the actual training is carried out as per programme. In the event of inclement weather a lecture on the subject chosen is given, all ranks attending.

DRAFT. During the month 5 Officers and 295 Other Ranks proceeded Overseas. They were from a physical and trained-soldiers point of view quite equal to recent Reinforcements sent Overseas.

APPENDIX "F."

REPORT ON DISCIPLINE OF CAMP.

The discipline of the camp internally is good, the chief cause of Crime being from A.W.L. . . Approximately 90% of all Crime in the Battalion is due to A.W.L., resulting ~~xxxx~~ in most cases from overstaying Disembarkation and Good Conduct Leave. Of the figures shown on the states as A.W.L. 50 per cent. are illegal absentees. Absence ranges from 15 days to 18 months.

Steps have been taken to remedy this, and Disciplinary Action has been taken with cases already heard.

From a sanitary point of view the Discipline is good and very satisfactory results are being obtained.

Camp Routine is strictly observed.
