

			RESUME to accompany 5TH AUSTRALIAN MACHINE GUN BATTALION War Diary for the month of JANUARY 1919.	
			The outstanding feature of interest during the month is the reconstructional work being carried out by the Education Service. Although numbers in the classes have diminished through the return to Australia of a number of students, the interest shown by the present students is most gratifying. The Staff is well organised and very capable, and above all, enthusiastic. Canon Masterman's lecture on Democracy was a most able, and interesting oration, and it is hoped that it will be possible shortly, to distribute copies throughout all the Unit. It is regretted that several lectures set down for the month, did not materialise. The Farmers' Club is the keenest and most interesting body of people in the Battalion and is always well attended. Puring the former half of the month the amount of sport carried on was considerable, but during the latter half, owing to the difficulty in arranging fixtures in some games, and the Rugby thirteen returning to Australia on draft, there was a great falling off in the number of games played. Machine Gun and Rifle Competitions were keenly contested, and the victory over the 6th Battalion Chasseurs Alpins is most gratifying. The Concert Party has proved itself an invaluable asset to the Unit, and on every occasion has shown to a crowded house. The civil population look forward to the shows and attend in large numbers. It is hoped to replace shortly the present hired costumes by gift costumes which are in London. Up to about the 19th of the month the weather was remarkably fine, but after that date there were several frosts, followed by heavy snow falls, and cold winds.
