RABOT	15/12/17		<p style="text-align: center;"><u>VOLUME XI</u></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Covering period of December 1<sup>st</sup> to 31<sup>st</sup> 1917</u></p> <p>Salvage operations were continued in the Ploegsteert Sector up to the 15<sup>th</sup> instant, &amp; from returns it will be seen that much valuable salvage was recovered during our stay in this area.</p>	
LOCKRE	16/12/17		<p>On the 16<sup>th</sup> December we moved from Rabot &amp; went to LOCKRE to go into rest. We had comfortably established ourselves, but had not been there 48 hours before we received sudden orders to go into line immediately at Armentières. Company headquarters &amp; main dump were established at Erquinghem, &amp; this being a special sector from a point of view of salvage work, dumps were absolutely fixed at the following places:-</p>	
ERQUINGHEM ARMENTIÈRES	19/12/17		<p>Right sector - Square Farm, Chapelle d'Armentières. Left Sector - Houplines. Town sector, Rue Gaidherbe, Armentières.</p> <p>The town of Armentières we found much different to when we were last there. Many of the fine buildings had been absolutely destroyed, &amp; what was once a terrace of houses is now open space. The whole town as a sorry spectacle: we left it only a few months previous full of life, both military &amp; civilian, &amp; our feelings can be well imagined on finding the place practically a heap of ruins. The old familiar haunts were visited, only to find another witness to the horrors of war, &amp; our thoughts turned to the many good friends we had made during our previous stay there, &amp; we wondered if they had been able to evacuate their homes in safety, or if they, too, had fallen victims to heinous ruthless destruction. Our previous main Dump at I.L.A. 2.9, Rue Culbert, had been completely burned down, &amp; there was nothing left of it but the outside walls. Not one single street had escaped destruction, &amp; the beautiful avenues of trees in the principal thoroughfares which had once been a feature of the town were now shorn of their beauty, as though some wanton hand had been through to despoil &amp; destroy.</p> <p>From the point of view of salvage work, however, the place was not too bad to work</p>

Birmingham Armentieres	19 31/12/17		<p>in, &amp; it will be seen from Returns that much useful Salvage was recovered, &amp; with the assistance of the D. A. Co. we were able to solve a large quantity of Ammunition. An abandoned gun position was discovered &amp; some 600 serviceable 6 inch shells were <del>found</del> immediately reissued.</p> <p>Occasionally the town was shelled, it was during one of these occasions that the dump at Chapelle d'Armentieres received a direct hit, which fortunately, so far as the men themselves were concerned, resulted only in the loss of Equipment &amp; Kit. 


