

Good work was carried out by the Brigade Signal Sections in extending their Telephone communications to keep up with Battalion Head warters as they moved forward. Right Brigade relieved by Left Brigade of the Right Division. Left Brigade relieved by the Reserve Brigade of the Left Division. Divisional forward Lines handed over to both Flant Divisions on withdrawal from the Line. A Cable Detachment was detached for duty with the 1st Divisional Artillery who remained in the Line.	
	11th 12th 13th 14th 15th		Whilst the Division remained in the Reserve Area a scheme of training was carried out for Artillery Signallers, Infantry Signallers and for men of the Signal Company. It was intended that the instruction for the Artillery and Infantry Signallers should be elementary, and all Classes proved very successful.
