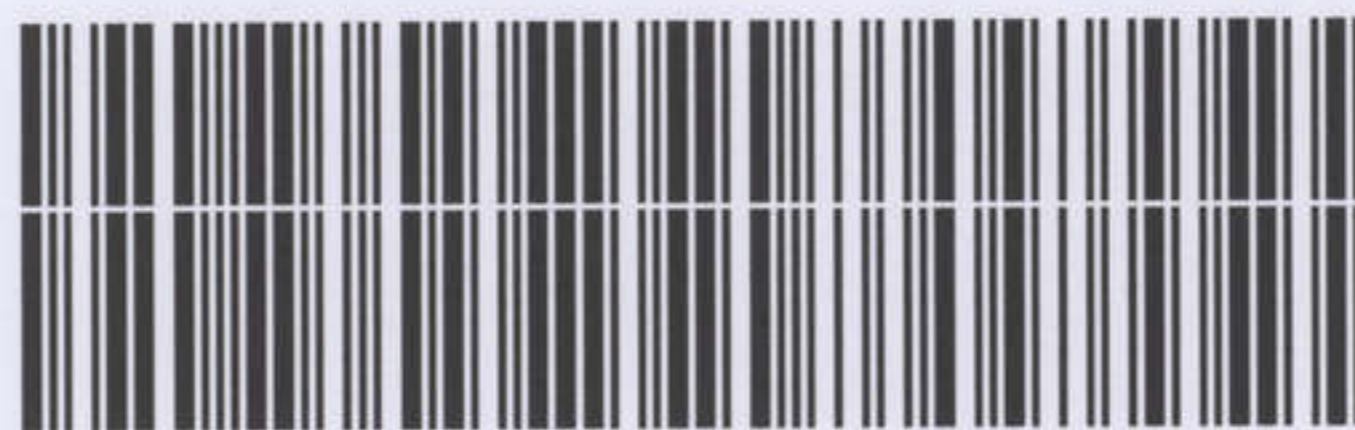

Harve. France.	1st.		Unit left Harve for England by S.S. St George at 4.30.p.m. The weather was fairly rough and most of the men on board were sick. We arrived at Southampton at 11.30.p.m. and remained on board until the following morning.	
England.	2nd.		Disembarking at 8.a.m. we entrained for Godford arriving there about 11.a.m. After arriving a march of about 2 miles we were allotted to tents as no hutting accomadation was available.	
	3rd.		Medical Parade and inoculation for all members of the unit.	
	4th.		A game of football was played between quotas 40 and 42, which resulted in a win for us.	
	5th		Unit paraded to Group Q. M. Store for changes of clothing.	
	6th.		No duties or parades were held on this day.	
	7th.		Pay parade was held for the members of this unit who were allowed to draw all credits in their pay books up to £28.0.0. for the purpose of proceeding on 14 days leave. After the pay parade all pay books were collected and sent to London for audit.	
	8th.		Tickets were purchased for every member of the unit to the destination which they desired and issued with warrants and passes.	
	9th.		The unit leaving camp at 6.30.a.m. entrained at Godford at 7.30.a.m. for London commencing their 14 days leave from today.	
	23rd.		All members of the unit were due back from leave today. On their return to camp the unit was disbanded on being absorbed into 42 quotas which comprised of four companies namely:- "A" Company New South Wales. "B" " Victorians and Tasmanians. "C" " Queenslanders and Suth Australians. "D" " West Australians.
