

Group Headquarters moved to Halfway House. A Lamp Station was set up on Anzac Ridge working back to a Lamp Station on Westhock Ridge.  The Lamp Station on Westhock Ridge was discontinued and removed to Broodsiende Ridge, working back to the Lamp Station at Anzac Ridge. Lines were laid to the Batteries.  Batteries commenced moving forward to Anzac Ridge. A forward Exchange was established at Ideal House, and Ground Lines were laid from Ideal House to positions in readiness for Batteries which went forward as quickly as the nature of the ground would allow.  At this time considerable trouble was experienced with the Buried Route between HH and HO.  Three pairs that were allotted to the Group being blown out and later the sole remaining one met with the same fate. The situation was relieved by a pair on the BX route being obtained.  Although this pair showed a big earth at BX (owing to the Test Box being flooded) fair working was obtained, except for occasional trouble further on, on the Buried Route. An overland pa-ir
