BRIEF RECOUNTAL OF PLANS. The Australian Corps was ordered to attack the enemy from the VILLERS BRETONNEUX - CHULNES railway to the River SOMME. The 2nd Canadian Division co-operated on the right and the 4th Australian Division on the left. Brigade Groups of 5th Aust. Division were detailed to advance in open warfare formation, passing through the first objective (Green Line) which the 2nd Aust. Division were ordered to capture. The 8th and 15th Infantry Brigades were ordered to exploit the 3. success of the 2nd Aust. Division and seize the old British Line of Defence, (Blue Line). 14th Infantry Brigade, Divisional Reserve. Machine Guns were allotted as under :-4. 15th M.G. Company to co-operate with 15th Aust. Inf. Brigade. 25th M.G. Company to co-operate with 8th Aust. Inf. Brigade. 14th M.G. Company plus one Section 8th M.G. Company with Mark "V" (Star) Tanks. 8th M.G. Company less one Section, Divisional Reserve. The Machine Guns (20 in all) allotted to Mark V (Stat) Tanks were to be carried forward with 32 Lewis Guns for the capture of the Blue Line, and to hold same until it could be consolidated by the Infantry. The remaining guns, after assisting the advance of the Infantry were to consolidate, in depth, between the Blue and the Red Line. RECOUNTAL OF EVENTS. The march to assembly positions was completed without incident and all troops were in position before Zero hour. The advance from position of assembly was commenced in order to cross the Green Line at Zero hour plus 4 hours. Machine Guns advanced with the Infantry, complete gun teams carrying 4,000 rounds of ammunition per gun team, in belts. Pack horses and limbers moved close up along the road maintaining touch with their respective Companies. Owing to the rapidity of the advance and absence of good targets, very little use was made of overhead indirect fire. Most use was made of guns pushed well forward to engage fleeting targets by direct shooting or hostile machine guns holding up the Infantry advance. Guns of the 15th M.G. Company engaged a group of enemy machine gunners who were inflicting casualties on the Infantry in the vicinity of HARBONNIERS and accounted for all the hostile guns' crews without casualties to ourselves. Machine guns operating with Mark V (Star) Tanks did not reach the Blue Line as rapidly as could have been desired. This was partly due to the rapidity of the Infantry Advance and a considerable amount of engine trouble with the Tanks. A proportion of these Tanks failed to reach the Blue Line owing to enemy artillery action causing breakdowns; the machine gun crews, however, continued the advance and reached the objective on foot. In one instance the Tank carrying two Vickers guns of one Section broke down at 0.29.c.7.4.; these guns were at once loaded onto the Tank carrying the other two guns of this Section, the crews walking with the Tanks RCDIG1007527 AUSTRALIAN WAR MEMORIAL

This Section, with it's Tank, reached the Blue line at 12.15 p.m. and immediately got into action and silenced enemy machine guns at R.32.a. and also inflicted heavy casualties on Infantry retreating along road running through R.31. and 32.

This Section was operating on the front of the 8th Aust. Inf.

Brigade.

Only one Tank carrying Vickers guns operating on the 15th Aust. Inf. Brigade Sector actually reached the Blue Line, arriving at W.12.d. These crews got into action immediately and accounted for 40 or 50 of the enemy who were retiring from a small trench in R.7.c.

Ammunition "V's" were put out as soon as guns were in position but none was dropped near the Blue Line until 3 p.m. on the 9th, and then only two boxes. Four boxes were dropped in vicinity of Red

Line about 12.30 p.m. on the 8th instant.

The Machine Gun Battalion was concentrated at DAOURS by 9 p.m. 6. on the 10th, having suffered the following casualties during the whole operation:-

2 O/Ranks Killed.

20 Other Ranks Wounded.

# DEDUCTIONS.

That training in Open Warfare Tactics for Machine Gun Companies is essential, if close co-operation is to be maintained with Infant-

ry, and the greatest use made of Company Transports.

2

It is important that all Machine Gun Officers should realize that in fast-moving operations, such as these that the Division has just taken part in, Machine guns may be called upon to suport the Infantry in place of Artillery until the guns can be moved forward.

The fact the Infantry Brigadier may call on M.G. Company Commanders for quick support at certain points must always be kept

in mind.

That the issue of expendable belts will, to a great extent, simplify the difficulty at present felt regarding belt filling and

ammunition supply in general.

The dropping of ammunition by aeroplaned during recent operations cannot be said to be entirely satisfactory, as although 26 "V's" were laid out on a Divisional Front only six boxes are known to have been dropped.

It would appear that better results could be expected if "V's"

were made larger.

It was found impossible to remain inside the Mark V (Star) Tank during the greater part of the advance owing to the heat and gas fumes.

M.G. Crews were outside the Tanks during the greater portion of the advance and obtained protection from hostile M.G. and Rifle fire by moving close to the oposite side of the Tank from which the

fire was coming. This would probably not be possible if great opposition were encountered, and it is considered that with 16 men in one Tank the men would soon become exhausted if compelled to remain inside.

There seemed to be g good deal of difficulty in maintaining direction with the Tanks, and there is no doubt that had they all reached the Blue Line the Vickers guns would have been rather close

together in places.

Owing to the Infantry being able to move forward so quickly from the Red to the Blue Line, it is hard to form an opinion as to the value of the carriage of Machine guns by Tanks, other than affordind an ideal means of transporting of guns and gear from one place to another.

The operation proved that machine gunners carrying their gear can move forward as fast as Infantry and not be too exhausted to fight when required, even in a fast advance such as the Division has just taken part in.
