

	RESUME to accompany 5th AUSTRALIAN MACHINE GUN BATTALION War Diary for the month of NOVEMBER, 19181. 1. In reviewing the period of November nothing of especial interest occurred. The Battalion spent the greater part of the period in Rest in billetts at RAMBURES, training intensly in the morning, afternoons being devoted to Recreational Training, much interesting sports being engaged in and many Football Matches played with neighbouring Units. The Sth Aust. Infantry Brigade held a sports meeting, and also the Division, the Battalion being well represented on each occasion and the units representatives acquitted themselves very well.	
	On the 25th of the month the Battalion commenced to stage through to BOHAIN-BUSIGNY area and at the end of the month the move was still in progress. Practically no sickness has been experienced during the month. The Units transport has been trained rather more intensely than usial, in view of the long and sustained marches it may be called upon to perform in staging through to the RHINE by road. The numerous marches they have been called upon to perform have disclosed certain weaknesses which have been remedied, which emphasises the necessity for the thorough training of Battalion Transport.	
	2. With regard to the Quartermaster's Branch, clothing and equipment are in a satisfactory condition. Rations have been somewhat short, the most noticeable deficiency being the vegetable ration, this however has been augmented by additional supplies purchased from Regimental Funds. It might be mentioned herein passing that the Battalion Officers held their first Dinner on the 16th of the month, and it was voted a huge success. It is hoped that during the months that will speed by between this and demobilization, it will be possible to hold similar Dinners.



5TH AUSTRALIAN MACHINE GUN BATTALION SECRET. 18-11-18. / NOTES ON THE COMMANDING OFFICER'S CONFERENCE, RAMBURES, 17-11-18. GENERAL SITUATION. The Commanding Officer after referring to the Armistice terms, which practically embody the Peace Terms, stated that we must be prepared to resume hostilities at any time during the period of the Armistice. The 18th German Army is entraining at LIEGE and others are in process of withdrawal. There is an Allied Commission at the German General Headquarters, SPA, endeavouring to regulate the evacuation of the Germans. The British Army will follow the German Army at one days distance and the army of occupation is timed to reach the Belgian Eastern Frontier on or before the 2nd December. This army of occupation has two main functions (a) To enforce strict compliance with the terms of the armistice. (b) To enforce the terms of peace. This will probably necessitate the maintainance of the army of occupation for some considerable time, but it is too early yet to

foreshadow how this will effect the Australian Corps.

THE ORGANISATION OF THE ARMY OF OCCUPATION.

The Army of Occupation will consist of elements of the Belgian, British, American and French Armies in that order from North to South, with a defensive frontier on the RHINE which they will hold and administer.

The British Armies of occupation will consist of two armies .-The Second and Fourth in that order from north to south. Their zone is approximately COLOGNE (inclusive) to MAINZ (probably exclusive). Each Army will consist of four Corps each of four Divisions. The Fourth Army will consist of the Fourth, Sixth and Ninth British Corps and the Australian Corps. The New Zealand Division will form part of one of the Corps of the Fourth Army. The Canadian Corps will be in the Second It has been decided that the Australian Corps for the purpose of the Army of Occupation will consist of four Divisions only, viz. 1st, 2nd, 4th and 5th Aust. Divisions. The inclusion of the 3rd Aust. Division is still under discussion, otherwise it will become attached to the 17th British Corps. It will be seen from the above that of 32 Divisions forming the Army of Occupation 9 are supplied by Dominion Troops, a very high proportion.

THE MARCH TO ENEMY TERRITORY. 3.

The march to enemy territory will be carried out in two echelon the Sixth and Ninth Corps leading in that order from North to South.

followed by the Fourth and Australian Corps in similar order.

The march will commence on the 17th November by 2nd Cavalry Division (allotted to the Fourth Army). The 2nd Cavalry Division is not restricted as to roads but as to rate of movement. The direction of the march is due east towards ST. VITH and the army frontage is from 16 to 18 miles. Each Corps will be allotted two roads. Nothing is known as to the condition of these roads but it is understood that for the few first miles they are badly knocked about. The Cavalry however have been ordered to reconnoitre the condition of these roads. The marches will take the form of a series of bounds to a definite line, then a halt of a day or two, then a further advance. The date by which the Army is to be deployed on the frontier is the 2nd December. Each Division will be organised into three Brigade Groups and 1 Artillery Group. It may however prove necessary to split up the Artillery Group owing to water difficulties.

ACTION BY AUSTRALIAN CORPS.

The Ninth Corps is at present around LE CATEAU and will commence its move on the 16th and 17th instants. It is the present intention (if railway conditions permit) to rail up the 2nd, 3rd and 5th Aust. Divisions, commencing on the 19th instant to BUSIGNY-LE CATEAU Area. and there is a further prospect that the forward movement to the frontie may be performed by rail. This entirely depends on the repairs to the BUSIGNY CHARLEROI railway which is understood to be badly knocked about. The transportation people say that the railway will be available by the 20th November, if this is so the Australian Corps will train to the

· 2 · APPENDIX the Belgian frontier. The distance from LE CATEAU is roughly 150 miles. All four Divisions however must immediately prepare for marching by road as the decision for the latter may be hurriedly given and at little notice. The Australian Corps will follow the Ninth Corps. The 1st Aust. Division on the Northern road and the 4th Australian Division on the South road leading. The dispostion of the 2nd and 5th Divisions will stand over for the present as the probability of the two latter Divisions going by rail is greater than that of the 1st and 4th Divisions. DETAILS OF MOVEMENT AFFECTING ROADS AND RAILWAYS. 5. (a) No ammunition willgo forward other than the establishment in Horse drawn echelons. There will be nothing carried on motor transport The whole policy underlying the movement is to march light and the whole operation is designed with a view to obtain the utmost comfort for the troops. On the question of carrying sheel helmets and gas masks it is considered that the time has not yet arrived when they can be left behind As stated in the above remarks we must be prepared to resume hostilities at any moment. Higher authority may be in a position later to say that we need not carry these articles. Censorship. Censorship regulations may be relaxed forthwith in that names of places, units and persons may be mentioned. Leave. All arrangement for leave will go on without change. (c) Personnel. A thorough overhaul of personnel should be made in order to weed out those who it is undesirable to take on the march. These may be classified under two headings:-(1) Physically Unfit. A medical examination should decide straight away those who are physically fit for amarch. This examination should be strict as the march will be a severe test of the fitness of the men. (2) Morally Unfit. Now is the opportunity to rid ourselves of all men who are likely to prove a nuisance. Stricter discipline is now required. For the accommodation of these derelicts a Divisional Depot will be provided. This Depot will in addition take surplus baggage and animals. Details as to the location of this Depot will be issued later. (e) Animals. Only sound and fit animals to be taken and it is necessary that action should be taken quickly in this respect to get rid of unsound animals and get sound animals in their place. (f) Blankets. Two blankets for every man will be carried either on M.T. or Auxiliary H.T. Baggage. For reasons stated in the march forward much paraphernalia must be scrapped. Until we arrived in Germany the march will involve a certain amount of hardship owing to the distance that units will be from railheads and to the necessity for utilising all spare transport for supply purposes. The question of baggage must be gone into in no uncertain manner and all kit not required must be placed in the Baggage Depot. TRANSPORT GENERALLY. 6. The Commanding Officer emphasises the difficulty of supply. The railheads are few and indifferent. We will be 200 miles further from our bases and in addition we have to victual the civilian population. In order to facilitate the movement of supply transport it has been decided that all other transport is to remain clear of the main roads between 5 p.m. and 5 a.m. each day. Although we have overhauled our regimental transport another thorough inspection is necessary, especially with regard to spare parts, such as wheels, swingle-trees etc. to ascertain deficiencies and replace them. MOVEMENT OF TROOPS. We must realise that we are attempting something not before attempted and good Staff work is required. The F.S. Regulations and F.S. Pocket Book should be thoroughly studied. The fundimental requirements are punctuality, sufficient supply of maps and those receiving the maps being able to read them. Billeting - difference between our side of the Belgian frontier and the other side. The Commanding Officer emphasises the importance of showing every consideration to the inhabitants of Belgium during our march through their country. These people have for 4 years suffered great hardships and we do not wish to add to them. To suppliment billeting, shelters probably 25% will be provided. With regard to billeting in Germany special measures for the safety of the troops and also the preservation of the public peace will have to be adopted. RCDIG1007530 AUSTRALIAN WAR MEMORIAL

Marches into German towns should be carried out with all pomp and ceremony. The C.O. here drew attention to the march of the Germans through BRUSSELS carried out with a view to impress the citizens of that City with the might and power of the German army. The probable hour for commencement of marches will be 8 a.m. each day in order that troops may arrive in billets for the night soon after midday. Our experience should prove of great value in the conduct of the marches, but again the close study of the F.S. Regulations and F.S. Pocket Book is essential to refresh the memory. In passing through towns and large villages the strictest discipline must be maintained in order to show that our distipline and drill are as good as our fighting ability. All amusements entertainment and sports gear should be taken.

DISCIPLINE.

In connection with this matter it is desired that no irritating restrictions be placed on the men. If men are informed by their Officers of the reasons for imposing certain restrictions as for example, the hour at which they are to be in billets, it is certain there will be no trouble.

9 COMMUNICATION.

These present one of the biggest difficulties in connection with the move. The more important messages will be sent by motor despatch rider and throughout the Division the principal to be adopted is that junior formations are responsible that they notify the next higher formation of their location for the night in sufficient time to ensure that orders issued in connection with the next days march may reach them promptly, and steps should be taken in all companies to ensure that orders are promulgated.

10 GENERAL REMARKS.

The restriction with regard to cameras has been removed. Clipping of horses has been decided against by the Army but a definite ruling on this subject is coming later on.

11 ON THE RHINE.

During the occupation of German territory each Army, Corps, and Division will be allotted a definite area, which it will organise and administer. The bridgeheads will have a radius of 30 kilometers with 10 kilometers of No-Man's-Land west of the Rhine. The importance of guard and sentry duties being correctly performed was emphasised. Training will consist of Ceremonial, Drills, Reviews and Inspections and Setting Up Drill. Elaborate arrangements should be made for the entertainment of the men and inter-Unit hospitality is to be encouraged.

As the Rhine land provides many places of historic interest it is possible during our occupation to have organised tours for Officers and men to enable them to visit these places. It is hoped to have the Educ-

ation scheme in full swing at the same time.

12 DEMOBILISATION.

Concurrent with the occupation the demobilisation of the Australian Corps will take place. Staffs are at present in London busy with preliminary arrangements in connection with this. In order to assist them matters are to be organised in every command to ensure that the demands of the demobilisation staff may be met quickly and adequately.

ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTIONS

TO THE RHINE.

SURPLUS STORES.

All Companies will arrange at once to go through stores and put aside everything that will not be required including men's souvenirs etcl.

These stores will be left in a Divisional Dump in this Area.

All Technical gear etc., distinct from the preceding paragraph should be returned to the Battalion Quartermaster forthwith. most essential that a thorough overhaul of all baggage, equipment, stores etc., should be made with a view to eliminating any article not absolutely essential. Owing to the distance that Companies will be from Railheads and to the necessity for utilising all spare transport for supply purposes, Companies must travel as light as possible.

AMMUNITION.

Companies will move with Echelons full. The necessary ammunition required to complete may be drawn from Battalion Quartermaster forthwith. Rifle men will only carry 100 rounds per man.

EQUIPMENT.

Tin hats and gas masks will be carried. Arrangements will be made to carry two blankets for every man either on motor transport or auxiliary horse transport. Special attention must be paid to ensure that all boots, clothing, equipment etc., are in good order.

CENSORSHIP.

Censorship may be relaxed. Names of places and Units may be mentioned. Cameras may be taken.

TRANSPORT. 5.

Companies will arrange for all transport to be thoroughly overhauled to see that all spare parts, etc., are complete. Extra wheels and swingle trees will be carried. When on the march all transport must be clear of roads between the hours of 1700h and 0500h.

ORDNANCE MATERIAL.

Reserve of Box Respirators need not be carried. Proper reserves of boots and clothing must go forward with Companies. Companies will arrange to carry one extra set of fitted spare shoes per animal in order that cold shoeing may be carried out if necessary.

PATLLASSES.

Companies will arrange for all paillasses to be stacked at Battalion Quartermaster's Store early on the morning of the day that Companies move from present area. They must be carefully checked and arrangements made with D.A.D.O.S. for their collection. A receipt must be obtained from D.A.D.O.S. for all paillasses returned.
