
Location of gun positions for barrage fire.





MONTHLY APPRECIATION REPORT - 31-8-18.

To O.C.,

1st Australian Machine Gun Company.

Sir, .

Throughout the month the general state of efficiency of the the transport has been maintained. The general physique of men and horses has been particularly good. This is due no doubt to the warm dry weather, and during the latter end of the month the close proximity of transport lines to the Somme.

The horses have shown a marked improvement, the river banks, good grazing, abundance of running water are such favourable conditions for horses that the depreciation due to extra work and light rations

as issued are quite overcome.

All animals have kept free from disease. The blight which is so prevalent in the North has almost entirely left them, the Bot-Fly

being the only source of annoyance.

The following is a brief summary of work done during the month. On 1-8-18, being situated at V 23 C 3.4. (sheet 27) and in rest area, we were able to spend considerable time at grooming the horses and cleaning harness and limbers. On 3rd instant the Transport moved out with the Company to Blaringhem and on 5th instant was inspected by the Divisional Commander. Owing to wet weather, in consequence muddy roads and moment of arrival, the appearance of harness and vehicles

was not so good as for previous inspections.

On the evening of 5-8-18 the Transport was entrained at Arques. The usual shortage of rolling stock made the allocation of trucks difficult and considerable trouble was experienced in finding accommodation for animals. Finally, we were allotted one truck for every 8 horses which meant entraining two heavy draughts and two light horses each side, the result of which all the smaller horses were knocked about considerably. Horses were watered en route, also fed on the train. No trouble whatever was experienced at the detraining station, Hangest. Unfortunately, a long wait in the rain and a long march was incurred all of which had a bad effect on the horses.

on 7th instant, Transport moved to Rivery which had a further

degragatory effect on the horses.

on 9th instant we moved to Villers-Brettoneaux where we were situated for two days. Thence we moved to Reziers to rear Headquarters where we stayed during the period the Company was in the Line. The horses and vehicles were scattered about, no more than 10 animals on one line. All the limbers and living accommodation for men were covered with capturede camouflage and probably due to this our lines were not harrassed by shell fire.

On the 16th we moved to Vaux-Sur-Somme, and from then on, horses

and men began to show signs of improvement.

On 20th instant we moved to Morcourt for the Divisional operation. During this period about 200,000 rounds of S.A.A. was transported to the 16 gun positions which were sighted for barrage fire. For the second phase of the operation, sections moved forward with the infantry, and were accompanied in cases by limbers and pack transport which were able to move up close to the final objective. Two hours after this objective was gained, **XXXXXXX** 5,000 rounds of S.A.A.** was transported to the four section Headquarters, or packed to the gun positions. For this operation, 6 double limbers and 20 horses were employed. All drivers worked excellently and the only casualties sustained were two slightly wounded horses.

During the month, 3 reinforcement drivers (original Company drivers) were absorbed in the Transport section and one private returned

to section in Company.

The employment of limber men at the rate of 1 man per 3 limbers to maintain the general efficiency of vehicles as required has proved a decided success.



Division Mounted Military Policeman they moot, who will hand the escort a typed receipt. Escort will be instructed that in the unlikely event of missing members of the M.M.P. screen they will proceed to the Divisional P.O.W. Cago on the HORCOURT - PROYART Road.

(c) The A.P.M. will keep a reserve of M.M.P. at the Divisional Cage for filling gaps in the screen, and at the Headquarters of Brigades

in the line, for prisoners who may be mis-directed.

(d) Glose touch between the Divisional Cage and D.H.Q. will be maintained and any information of value gained by the Divisional Intelligence Officer will be immediately forwarded to those concerned. Attompts will be made to maintain direct touch between Headquarters of Brigades in the line and the Divisional Cage.

(o) A close check will be kept by the A.P.M. of the number of prisoner;



2. Counter Attack Aeroplanes.

From Zero hour counter-attack aeroplanes will be constantly in the air. The Signal to Infantry when enemy troops are preparing for a counter attack is a white parachute flare fired in the direction of the impending counter-attack.

3. Amminition carrying Aeroplanes.

(a) These machines have the under side of the lower planes painted Black for a distance of 2½ feet from the tips.
(b) Ammunition will be dropped for Vickers Guns.
0.C. 1st.M.G.Battalian will arrange for White 'V's to be displayed at points where ammunition is to be dropped.
The arms of the 'V' wilk be 3 feet long and 1 foot wide, the apex of the 'V' to point towards the enemy.

1. TANKS. (a) In order to drown the noise of Tanks during their approach to the Tank start line and should the weather not permit of air work.

iii. Infantry will be informed that no special percentage of smoke will be put down to define the fall of the creeping barrage, the barrage halt of 15 mins., or the final protective barrage.

3. FORWARD ASSEMBLY OF TROOPS. i. The forming up on the taped line will be carried out under Brigade arrangements.

ii. Assaulting troops will be formed up on the taped line one hour before Zero.

iii. Troops of the 5th. Aust. Division will

remain in Front line positions until forming up is completed, but will all to West of the forming up line one half hour before Zero and will move back at once to the old trenches in R.13. 19. and 25, when they will revert to the Command of the G.O.C. 5th. Aust. Division.

- 4. ACTION OF RESERVE BRIGADE. The Reserve Brigade will move at Zero hour to positions in squares R.19.B.&.D. and R.25.B.

1st. PHASE.

During the night of 22nd/23rd the Company having dug in at the following positions opened harrassing fire as below.

"A" Section situated at R.14.B.54.50. opened firefrom zero to zero plus 5 on wood in R.16.C. From zero plus 5 to zero plus 20 on Cross Roads R.17.A.30.00.

"B" Section situated at R.8.C.69.84. opened fire from zero to zero plus 5 on wood at R.4.C.00.20. From zero plus 5 to zero plus60 on wood at R.4.A.6.0.

"C" Section situated at R.8.D.75.85. opened fire from zero to zero plus 60 on wood at L.34.D. and L.35.C. and L.34 Central.

"D" Section situated at R.2.C.35.25. carried out harrassing fire from zero to zero plus 90 on Squares L.33.D. and L.34.C.

The enemy's barrage was rather patchy and did affect any of the Sections


Having finished the harrassing fire progamme Sections were then detailed to the following Battalions in the 3rd A.I.Brigade

"A" Section to 10th Battalion
"B" Section to 12th Battalion
"C" Section to 9th Battalion
"D" Section to 10th Battalion

"A" Section.

At 2p.m. this Section moved up to Luc Wood in file at 50 yds lateral distance between gun crews. Upon arriving at the wood two guns went round the left (North) and two guns round the right (South). Upon reaching the front (East) of the wood two guns were mounted to cover the low ground in the direction of BRAY-sur-SOMME along the River flats that were unoccupied by our troops. The remaining two guns were placed on the high ground to the right front of the wood. When our Infantry advanced to the red line overhead covering fire was carried out by these two guns. The two left guns (having been releived by Lewis Guns) were brought up to the high ground at the right front of the wood, thus forming a four gun battery. This battery during the advance of our Infantry carried out overhead covering fire (Tangent Sight Method) against FOSSEY BEACON, road and trees at foot of FOSSEY BEACON and Chalk Dit. Enemy M.G's were engaged by battery fire and silenced in the Chalk Pit and on the road casualties were observed, and suspected hut was fired on with the result that a party quickly ran out some them becoming casualties.

All gun gear was manhandled up to the positions and as soon as FOSSEY BEACON was taken a limber which had been waiting back under cover brought up extra ammunition and water to the gun positions.



"B" Section

At 2 p.m. word was received from the 12th Battalion to move forward with them.

Gun crews moved in file at 50 yds lateral distance.

When passing through shelled areas, advance was made by bounds.

The opportunity did not occur of giving overhead covering fire,
owing to the rapid rate of the advance and nature of the country.

Gun gear and also a few belts per gun was carried up by the crews,
pack horses being used to bring up ammunition keeping 500 yds in rear
of Section. Positions at R.5.B. and L.35.C. were reached and guns
established.

Throughout the advance the Section was subjected to very heavy shelling but got through without any casualties.

"C" Section

This Section moved with the 9th Battalion to the jumping off line. Guns crews were moved up in file with a lateral distance of 70 yds between them. A heavy barrage was met with but Section went through it with the loss of 1 killed and 1 wounded.

At 2 p.m. (zero time) Infantry moved forward to the attack gun crews followed at a short distance keeping their former formation, carrying their guns and belts to the final objective.

Emplacements were dug along the top of FOSSEY BEACON for two guns, remaining two guns were placed for the protection of the left flank 500 Yds in rear. As soon as FOSSEY BEACON was taken ammunition and stores were sent up arriving at their destination in 15 minutes.

"D" Section

This Section took up positions at 11 a.m. to protect the left flank across the flat towards BRAY-sur-SOMME and did not move forward or engage any targets.

During the operations the Section Commanders could get very little information from the Units to which they were attached.

All rationing and ammunition supply was carried out by the Company.

The casualties during the month were extremely light. This was due in a large measure to the fore thought and experience of the Company Officers.


