

The men were much elated to learn that the next two quotas would in all probability take practically the whole of the Battalion out of France and Belgium. The march was a short one and although the men carried marching order and one blanket apiece they felt no fatigue on the completion of the journey. The cookers had been sent ahead and a hot meal was ready waiting at BEUGNIES which was reached at 12.15 h. On account of the numerous estaminets in BEUGNIES, it was deemed advisable to detail a town picquet. The men were all housed fairly comfortably, but the horses of necessity spent the night in the open. Since the signing of the armistice, this is the first occasion upon which it has been impossible to provide cover for our horses. The night is mild however and all the horses are old campaigners and will not, it is expected, be any the worse for their experience. Brigadier General STEWART, G.O.C. 14th A.I. Brigade, visited the Battalion in SIVRY and explained that the troops were billeted so far out of SIVRY because of the prevalence of influenza in the town itself. Billeting Area on Outskirts of SIVRY



1. Attached is the final nominal roll of personnel proceeding with Embarkation quota No 14.
2. Personnel will parade at 58th Battalion Orderly Room at 0800 h tomorrow, 6th instant. DRESS: Marching Order, one blanket rolled horseshoe fashion around the pack. 


