



No electric light fittings are to be removed from billets, all these fittings have been sold to incoming Units.

BOUNDS

1. In view of possible demonstrations at CHARLEROI on 1st May 1919, Charleroi is placed "Out of Boundw" for all ranks from 1800 on 30th April 1919 to 0900 on 2nd May 1919. This has been done as a precautionary measure against possible collisions between Civilian Demonstrations and the troops of the Australian Corps.

2. Companies will hold a Muster Parade on 28th instant and warn all ranks:-

(a) that they must on no account take part in or interfere with these demonstrations in any way.

(b) that Charleroi is "out of Bounds".

(c) that in case of riots all troops will remain in the their billets.

REASONS TO BE GIVEN

3. On the 1st May 1919 the First Brigade Battalion will move out to Loveral at 1000.

The following onlywill be exempted.

Battalion Headquarters - Orderly Room - 2 other ranks.

Quartermaster's Store - 2 Other ranks.

Canteen - 2 Other ranks.

Companies - Cooks - 3 per company

Picquet Duty - 1 officer and 4 other ranks per company

Officers' mess. - 3 per company.

Sick and unfit.

The officer remaining on Picquet Duty will be provided with a Nominal Roll of all personnel remaining off parade.

The Picquet officers will be provided with special instructions.
