

	1/11th		G.O.C., with French Army for ten days attachment to study training and methods in force there. Lieut. Colonel F. DAWSON, 25th Bn. in temporary command from 1/2/18 to 7/2/18. Lieut. Colonel H.B. COLLETT, D.S.O., V.D., returned from English leave and took over temporary command of Brigade until 12/2/18.	
	12th		G.O.C., returned from French Army and resumed command.	
	23rd		G.O. C., left on English leave. Lieut. Colonel H.B. COLLETT, D.S.O., V.D. 28thBn. took over temporary command.	
			During the period under review the Brigade Units carried out a programme of training including setting up drill, platoon drill, Battalion tactical exercises and musketry, special attention being paid to the last named. A.R.A. Platoon competitions were organised by Division on the Army Range, the winning Platoon from each Brigade competing for the Divisional Championship. The 28th Bn. won the Brigade and the 6th Bde. the Divisional Competition. 5th Bde. were second and 7th Bde. third.	
			All Units were inspected by the G.O.C., who was much impressed by the appearance of the troops on parade. Their health and morale were excellent, each man being obviously keen on presenting as smart and soldierly an appearance as possible.	
			Every effort was made by responsible persons to make the stay in this area as pleasant and restful as possible. Five motor lorries were permanently at the disposal of Units to convey troops daily to BOULOGNE on leave and the behavior in the town was remarkably good.	
			Owing probably to the establishment of prophylactic depots by the Ambulances, cases of venereal disease was negligible.	



To lower stretcher and remove patient to ground, and then "Stand to Stretchers" with "prepared stretchers". Nature of casualty will be advised by Judges on day of Competition. Points to be given for handling of patient, adjustment of splint, dressing etc. and time taken.26. Singallers' Competition.

- (a) Entries - one team consisting of two telegraphists, two telephonists, and 2 linesmen per unit.
- (b) Material - each team will provide its own material.
- (c) A task will be set on day of Competition as follows :-

31. Best turned-out Water Cart. One entry per unit.
32. Best turned-out Officer's Ride. (Officers up) Entries unlimited. Points to be awarded for correct fitting and cleanliness of bridle and saddle, and for condition, manners, and paces of horse.
33. Best Shosmith. One entry per unit. Forefeet only to be shod. Smiths to provide their own material and tools. (Front sets shoe size 5, 6 & 7 only need be carried) Horse to be shod will be selected by Judges on the ground.
34. Officers' Jumping Contest. Height 3'8". Entries unlimited. 10 points allowed for each jump. 1 refusal = 3, 2 refusals = 0, 3 refusals retire from the ring. Knocking fence down in such a way that the horse would have fallen if it was rigid = 10. Hitting with forelegs = 6, hitting with hindlegs = 4, tipping or brushing with forefoot = 2, tipping or brushing with hind foot = 1. A total of 10 points for style and pace. Points deducted for rushing running away, unsafe jumping; Pace to be steady hunting pace, i.e. no trotting or walking between jumps.
35. Mule Steeplechase (Barback) Three entries per unit.
36. Rapid turn-out of Limbers. One entry per unit. Points to be awarded for time taken and correctness of harnessing of horses. Brakemen may assist.
37. Rapid Assembling of Harnesses. One entry per unit. Each competitor will provide himself with one set of limber harness and horse. Harnesses will be stripped. On a given signal, harnesses will be assembled and horse harnessed. Points will be awarded for correctness of assembly and fitting of harnesses, and time taken.
38. Driving of Limbers. One entry per unit. Pairs to be evenly matched in paces. Pace to be an even trot. Aids to be used.

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CONDITIONS OF HORSE EVENTS.

Transports to be complete. All vehicles will be unloaded. No partition boards will be carried. Covers will be neatly folded and carried in bodies of vehicles.

Dress :- marching Order without steel helmets, packs or blankets. Drivers not possessing leggings will wear putties inverted.

Brakemen will be turned out with all vehicles.

Feed to be carried on all horses and mules, excepting in events nos. 32, 33, 34, 35.

No points will be awarded for make or shape of horses.

GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR ALL EVENTS.

Prizes will be awarded for all events.

Three, two and one points will be awarded for 1st 2nd and 3rd places respectively.

Competitions will be decided by heats at the discretion of the Committee. As far as possible one representative from each unit will be drawn in each heat. Three first places in each heat will compete in finale.

Competitors not on starting point at time allotted for each event will be disqualified.

Excepting where otherwise stated, competitors will wear approved athletic shorts and jerseys bearing unit colours.

Substitutes may be accepted for any event at the discretion of the Committee. Such substitutes must however be qualified competitors.

Any points in dispute and not provided for in these conditions will be decided by the Committee.

Protests, if any, to be in the hands of the Committee within ten minutes of completion of event.
