

			<p>(2)</p> <p>The <del>XXXX</del> work of classifying all horses of the Brigade was completed and arrangements made for their sale or despatch to Base at HAVRE. Horses and mules sold by Auction to Belgian Inhabitants brought fairly good prices, considering the large number of animals offering. Horses not for sale were despatched to Base and by the end of the month the Brigade had disposed of half its establishment of Horses and Mules.</p> <p>The health of the troops still at a high standard, the epidemic of Influenza which visited different parts of Europe not being experienced by members of the Brigade. The troops still remain comfortably billeted with the Civilian population, and their behaviour is all that could be desired.</p> <p>Leave to United Kingdom, Places of interest in BELGIUM and FRANCE has been freely granted during the month. Visits to Industrial and Commercial Centres in the vicinity of CHARLEROI, and Conducted Tours to BRUSSELS and ANTWERP were arranged as for the previous month: The troops have benefited by the continued opportunities afforded them in this connection.</p> <p>DRAFT TO AUSTRALIA 2/2/19. 1. For purposes of administration the 7th A.I. Brigade will be organised into two Battalions by the amalgamation of the 27th and 28th Battalions and 7th T.I. Bty. into one Battalion under the Command of Lt. Col. F. R. CHAMBERS, DSO.
2. The 28th Battalion and 7th T.I. Bty. will march out of MARCINELLE at 1000 on the 4th February and join the 27th Battalion on that date at LONT-sur-MARCHIENNE.
3. Units amalgamated will retain their own cadres and will not lose their identity.
4. The regimental and canteen funds of the 7th T.I. Bty. and 28th Battalion will be audited and handed over to Brigade H.Q.
5. The mobilisation stores of the 7th T.I. Bty. and 28th Bn. will be checked and clearance receipts will be given to the C.Os. of 7th T.I. Bty. and 28th Bn. by Lieut. Colonel F. R. CHAMBERS DSO, 27th Battalion.
6. Transport of the 28th Battalion will move with the Bn. and be taken over by the 27th Bn. C.O. 28th Bn. will obtain a clearance receipt from Lt. Col. F. R. CHAMBERS, D.S.O.
7. The personnel <sup>n/</sup> and transport attached to the 7th T.I. Bty. will be returned to their units by 4th instant.
8. The Guards on Abandoned material at present supplied by the 28th Battalion will not be withdrawn until further orders. A complete list of Guards mounted by 28th Bn. giving location and strength will be forwarded in duplicate to reach this office by 4th instant.
9. 28th Battalion & 7th T.I. Bty. will send in certificates signed by Town Major, Marcinelle to reach this office by 6th instant stating all claims have been settled and that the area was left in a clean and sanitary condition.

FOOTBALL

Rugby Competitions between Units of the 7th A.I.Bde. were completed by 16/2/19. On the 21/2/19 the 7th Brigade played against the 5th Brigade in a Divisional fixture. Following the sequence of Brigade, Division & Corps, several players of the Brigade were selected to represent Division in Corps contests. Lieut. BROWN, Pte. STEELEY, Pte. SHAW, Pte. NIEGEHAGAN, Capt. BRAND, and Pte. OLSEN were Brigade representatives.

In addition to the fixtures the 7th A.I. Brigade played seven (7) matches otherwise arranged. The 26th Bn. and the 2nd Pioneer Bn. being the most successful.

Soccer The Semi-Final and the Final fixtures eventuated within the Division. The 7th Brigade met and defeated the Artillery Group in the Final which was played on the 26/2/19., thereby securing the Divisional Medal. This victory was noteworthy in as much the team which was defeated had already played 85 matches without suffering defeat.

14 Other matches eventuated during the month and the 2nd Pioneer Bn. and the 26th Bn. were the most successful.

Australian Rules.- The Div. Final eventuated on the 25/2/19 on the 7th Brigade Ground, Mont-Sur-Marchienne. This was against the 6th Brigade. The 7th A.I. Brigade also won this and secured the Divisional Medals.

The Unit and Brigade Teams otherwise played 14 matches. The 28th and 27th Bn. were the most successful.

It is worthy of special mention that out of three (3) Divisional Final Contests the 7th A.I. Brigade won two competitions.

Boxing.- Boxing Gymnasiums and training were established in the billets. Punching Balls etc. were provided, although no tournament was held.

Seven (7) men of the Brigade have secured after elementary bouts, their place as Divisional Representatives.

CROSS Country.- The 7th A.I. Brigade secured 6 Divisional representatives in the Corps Cross Country Run which eventuated at MARCINELLE.

HOCKEY.- Several matches took place during February against Unit teams. The 26th Bn. were the most successful.

Sports.- The 7th A.I. Brigade held a ver successful Athletic Sports Meeting on the 21st February 1919 at MONT-SUR-MARCHIENNE. For schedule of Events see attached sheet.
