

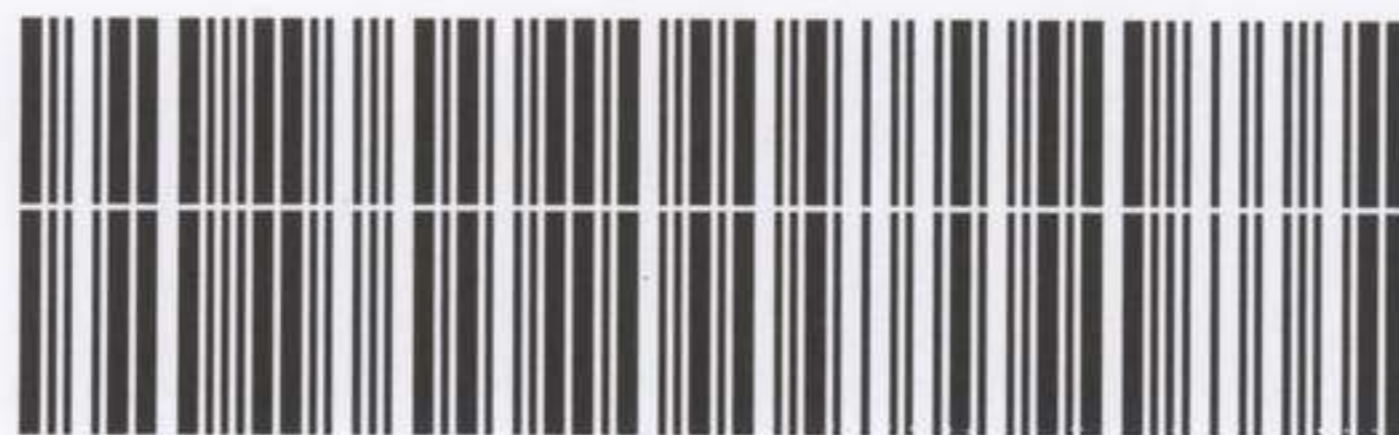

	No. 8 left DAWALIB (T.C. 124 C58) 5 a.m. for TUZ KHURMATLI (T.C. 124 C1) to relieve No. 12; reached ABU HAJAH (T.C. 124 C50-51) 6.30 a.m. and camped for the day.	
	1 Officer and 19 other ranks left G. H. Q. to relieve N. Z. personnel of No. 9 at KERMANSHAH and to reinforce No. 6, 38 and 39.	
	No. 8 left ABU HAJAH (T.C. 124 C50-51) 4 a.m. and arrived NAHRIN KUPRI (T.C. 124 C42) 9 a.m. and bivouaced.

June 5th, 1918	No. 8 left NAHRIN KUPRI (T.C. 124 C50-51) 4 a.m. Arrived CHAMAN KUPRI (T.C. 124 C27) 8.30 a.m., halted for 3 hours then marched to KIFRI (T.C. 124 C11), reaching there 2.30 p.m. Party from G. H. Q. with 10 horses reached No. 11 at 2 a.m.	
" 6th, "	1 N. C. O., 4 men, 3 Indians with 10 horses, 3 mules and wireless gear of No. 11 left MIRJANA (T.C. 124 C51) at daybreak to join DEWING'S COLUMN at KHANIKIN (T.C. 124 C36) reaching there 2 p.m. On arrival they reported to Political Officer, who instructed them to follow DEWING'S COLUMN. No. 6 (Pack) moved from KERIND to HUREA.	
" 7th, "	No. 8 left KIFRI (T.C. 124 C11) 1.30 p.m., and arrived TUZ 9.15 p.m. No. 11 left KHANIKIN (T.C. 124 C36) with Arab guide, marched approximately 30 miles, bivouaced at SANGAR (T.C. 230 C22) on Left Bank of DIALA RIVER, and established communication with No. 2 at BAQUBAH (T.C. 124 A99).

June 8th, 1918	No. 11 moved at daybreak, only bridle track over hills and barely negotiable by pack horses, reached destination (MAIDAN T.C. 230 AA96) 4 p.m., bivouaced and established communication with No. 2 at BAQUBAH (T.C. 124 A99). No. 12 (Pack) left TUZ KHURMATLI (T.C. 124 C1) at 4 a.m., reached KIFRI (T.C. 124 C11) noon, bivouaced at QARAH JAPPAH (T.C. 124 C 35) on 9th, and reached DELI ABBAS on 10th.	
" 9th, "	No. 9 (Wagon) handed over to No. 38 and dismantled.	
" 8th "	Lieut. Moore completed installation of new station at KERMANSHAH, and returned to BAGHDAD.	
" 11th, "	No. 11 engine failed.	
" 12th, "	2 motor Despatch Riders left G. H. Q. 5 a.m. with spares for No. 11 (MAIDAN - T.C. 230 AA96).	
" 13th, "	No. 12 (pack) was taken over by Australian personnel. The New Zealand personnel with exception of 4 men returned to BAGHDAD.

" 15th, "	New parts for Engine reached NO. 11 at 3 p.m., repairs were effected and signals exchanged with No. 1 at 6 p.m.	
" 16th, "	Engine of No. 11 failed again at 12.20 a.m. - Cam wheel slipped. New engine installed at No. 3.	
" 17th, "	1 Officer and 13 men mounted left G. H. Q. to relieve No. 6 at KERIND, picking up transport and transport personnel at RUZ (T.C. 124 059 approx.).	
" 18th, "	1 Officer and 19 men to relieve No. 9 reached KERMANSHAH 6 p.m.	
" 19th, "	New Zealand personnel of No. 9 left KERMANSHAH at 2 p.m. for BAGHDAD, reaching there 22nd.	
" 20th, "	No. 11 engine repaired and communication again established, but not satisfactorily. Telegraphed for new engine.
