

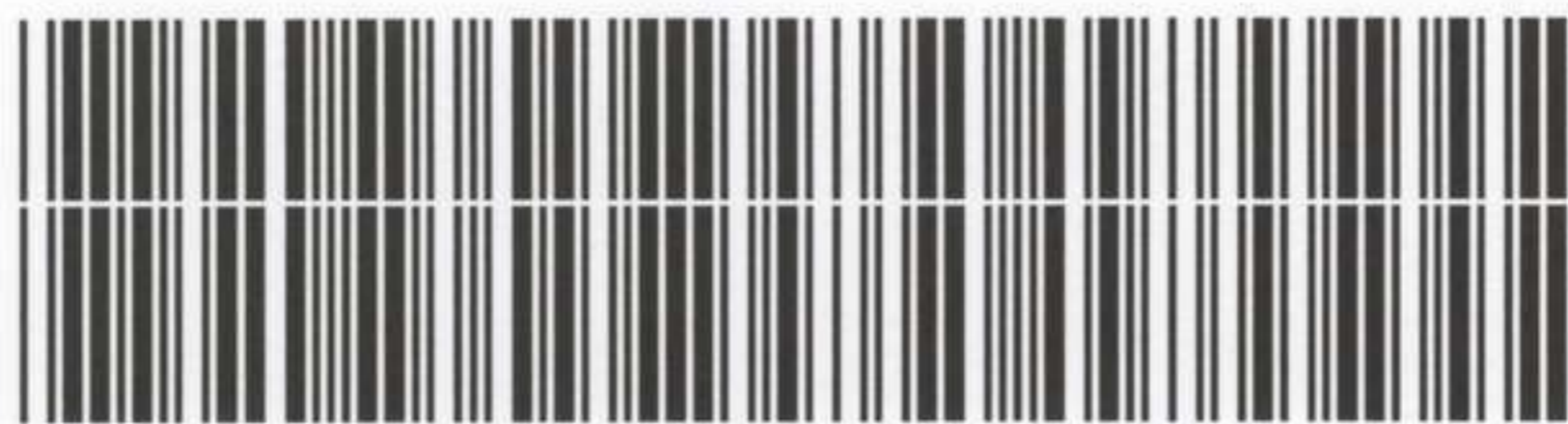

	1916 Sept 11 th		Weather bright. 29 th Division on our left discharged gas in conjunction with a bombardment about 1-30 A.M. Enemy retaliation light, one Bug-out of 'A' Coy. blown in. No casualties.	
	12 th		Weather bright. Usual amount of shelling. One shell pitched in Dig. Coy. killing one man and wounding three others. Three Gas Alarms through the night, no Gas on our front.	
	13 th		Fine Day. Slight increase in shelling, our casualties 1 Killed + 2 Wounded. Hostile Aeroplane activity.	
	14 th		Not cold miserable day. Good deal of shelling by our Guns. Enemy retaliation slight. Our casualties, 1 Killed + 2 Wounded.	
	15 th		Fine Day. Practically <u>No</u> Shelling.	
	16 th		Little rain in morning, but cleared up afterwards. 2 nd Lt. G. Gardner and Rowlands departed for 11 th Divisional Course. Brigadier visited trenches early hours of morning, accompanied by the C.O. Wounded. Prisoner brought in at CULVERT of the 362 nd REGT. Brought to Headquarters and passed on to Brigade at night. The Battalion was relieved by the 1 st RIFLE BRIGADE. Relief complete at 12-15 A.M. 'A' & 'H' Coys in Support of Infantry Barracks YPRES. 'B' & 'C' Coys at BUND. Headquarters at RAMPARTS.
