



Training carried ent indoors. Our share of 2000 reinforcements commenced 28th to march in (See app commanx) Snow and very cold. Brigadier and Brigade Major left by car for LIEGE, but owing to motor 29th trouble, the trip had to be abandoned at ARDENNES. Lieut .- Col. ROSS (G.S.O.I) lectured to 6th and 7th Battalions at COUILLET. Snow and very cold. Route marches. Brigadier visited 8th Battalion in morning. Lieut-Vol. 30th ROSS lectured to 8th Battalion at BOUFFIOULX. Route marches and indoor training! 3131 Freezing hand. The cold weather has now started and from now until the end of March we may expect snow and frost. The men are given a smart route march first thing, and then brought inside to Educational Classes, for indoor training. The men of this Brigade are very comfortable at COUILLET and BOUFFICULX; so much so, that they are not at all keen on being entertained as a body. For the same reason it is very hard to obtain nominations for schools or courses, which would take them back to more or less service conditions, and with the prospect of early repatriation, they are quite content in their present surroundings. SPEECH MADE BY BURGOMASTER OF COUILLET TO G.O. C. 2nd Aust Inf. Bde. to WELCOME TROOPS of 6th and 7th AUSTRALIAN BATTALIONS OF 2ND AUSTRALIAN BRIGADE.

Sir,

Accepting my invitation, you have done to the Commune of COUILLET a great honour.

The population appreciates the value of your help, and to prove

it, they are flying again all their flags.

They are sorry they cannot do any more, as they are essentially working people; but if our people cannot show their feelings like other wealthier classes do, they can show it by the cordiality of their reception.

Your soldiers can tell.

With the same cordiality, today we wish you welcome.

And why should it be otherwise while your army and population is for us the representation of virtues which give to life it's beauty and greatness.

Goodness, unselfishness, hereism; these are the manifestations of the AUSTRALIAN NATION towards us. Since the day we lost our

liberties, we have had sufferings.
