

Full consideration was given to work we would be required to undertake, and alternative schemes considered in event of necessity arising.  At 2-20 p.m. "ZERO" hour was received. Parties on duty on roads, water supply, trams, etc., and living away from the work, were immediately ordered to remain there, the Officers to return to receive instructions in order to conform to orders, and be in their positions as near as possible to time laid down. Orders were immediately got out for the Battln. to move to Battle positions. 1 O.R. "Killed" and 7 O.R. "Wounded".	21.
NIGHT OF 6th/7th JUNE.	"A" & "B" COMPANIES paraded at the Chateau (NIEPPE) before marching off. "A" COMPANY left at 11-45 p.m., following the GREEN ROUTE, and "B" COMPANY at 11 p.m., following the RED ROUTE.
