MOASCAR	May	1st	2/Lieut H.B.Hegarty commanding Unit.	
"	"	3rd	An Educational School begun, and continued to do good work during the month. Competition at week-end examinations was keen; and all members derived benefits.	
"	"	3rd	All Ranks were warned that there would not be a general amnesty for men serving in Base Prisons when preliminary Peace Terms were signed.	
"	"	15th	Leave Party left for Jerusalem: Duration of Leave one week; all members of Party expressed satisfaction.	
"	"	20th	Cessation of D.R.L.S. Personnel of Signal Office were made acquainted with instructions regarding the reduction in telegraphic traffic, as laid down in R.O.408, para 1860.	
"	"	23rd	Leave Party proceeded to Rest Camp Port Said for one weeks change of air.	
"	"	29th	Leave Party left for Jerusalem.	
"	"	31st	Information received from Headquarters Cairo, to the effect that 3% of personnel may be recommended for inclusion in the 10% United Kingdom Leave quota. Period:- Four weeks on full pay, with 3/- per day subsistence allowance for all ranks. Conditions:- (i) Length of Service. (ii) Clean Conduct Sheet. (iii) Relatives in United Kingdom. (iiii) Personnel who have been to United Kingdom or Australia, during the present war, are not eligible. Leave Party left for Rest Camp Port Said.
