

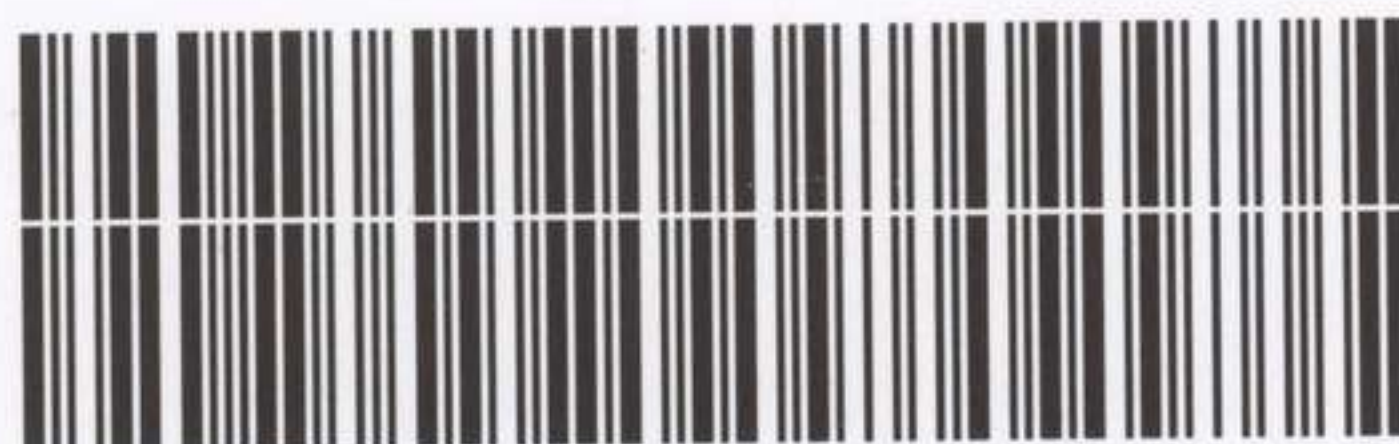

Moa scar	Feby	3rd.	Unit attended lecture by Maj. Davey C.M.G. R.A.M.C. on experiences as prisoner of war in Germany	
Moa scar	Feby	4th.	Applications were called from men desirous of acting as clerks with Finance Section A.I.F. Headquarters Cairo. Results of signalling competition held in this Unit were promulgated in Camp Routine Order 403. 10% reduction in number of rations drawn by Unit was altered to 5% reduction vide Canal Zone Order 22.	
Moa scar	Feby	5th.	In accordance with Camp Routine Order 405 para 1845, motor despatch riders employed on the personnel of Moa scar North Signal Station, were warned, on account, to exceed a speed limit of 15 miles an hour.	
Moa scar	Feby	8th.	Personnel of Moa scar North Signal Station were made thoroughly acquainted with instructions regarding reduction in telegraphic traffic as laid down in R.O. 408 para 1860.	
Moa scar	Feby	10th.	A draft of reinforcements <del>was</del> despatched to Anzac Mounted Division being made up as follows; To 1st Signal Troop, 6 O/Ranks; To 1st A.L.H., 5 O/Rank To 2nd A.L.H., 3 O/Ranks; To 3rd A.L.H., 30/Ranks.	
Moa scar	Feby	11th.	Demobilisation forms for men on strength of this Unit were completed, all parades for that day being cancelled. A draft of men for demobilisation was despatched to Anzac Mounted Division, being made up as follows, To 1st Signal Sqn, 20 O/Ranks; To 2nd Signal Troop 2 O/Ranks; To 5th A.L.H. 4 O/Ranks; To 6th A.L.H.; 10 O/Ranks; To 7th A.L.H. 6 O/Ranks.	
Moa scar	Feby	14th.	The Personnel of Moa scar North Signal Station was made thoroughly acquainted with R.O. 414 para 1889, reference the practice of carrying passengers on luggage carriers of motor cycles and were notified that this practice was irregular.

Moa scar	Feb	18th.	The Australian Machine Gun Sqn was attached to this Unit for rations.	
Moa scar	Feb	21st.	Personnel of this Unit was made acquainted with conditions of discharges elsewhere than in Australia.	
Moa scar	Feb	22nd.	All ranks assisted to remove aeroplanes to safety during fire at Moa scar Aerodrome.	
Moa scar	Feb	28th.	Applications for leave to United Kingdom were interrogated by C.O. and a selection of men up to 10% of Unit strength was made. During the month of February, Unit supplied Canteen Picquet for duty with Australian Provost Corps daily.
